2020 National Convention Cancelled

For the first time in 40 years our national convention must be cancelled. Your board of directors (BOD) contemplated postponing the convention instead of cancelling it, but with the many uncertainties swirling around the COVID-19 situation, the decision was unanimous to cancel.

Many, many thanks to Region III Representative Jennifer Baun for all the work she and her convention committee put into planning what would have been a superior event.

The MWAN BOD will convene a special meeting (in person or via other communication means depending on the COVID-19 situation) to conduct necessary MWAN business. The meeting will likely be in July or August. Details will follow.

While the convention will not happen this year, there are two matters of business which must be addressed by MWAN membership. The first is election of MWAN National Officers.



In accordance with current MWAN Bylaws, the election ballot will be provided in the June 2020 issue of Military Women's Bulletin. Ballots will be mailed to an outside firm which will be responsible for counting the ballots.

Since there will not be a convention, the election results will be forwarded to Nominating Committee Chair Barb Turner at her home. Barb will then submit the results for announcement no later than September 1st on the MWAN website (milwomen.org) and Facebook page. The results will also be published in the October 2020 Military Women's Bulletin.

The second matter of business for MWAN membership is the proposed new MWAN Bylaws. At the 2018 National Convention, membership authorized the MWAN BOD to execute a complete rewrite of the organization's 40-yearold bylaws.

The proposed 2020 MWAN Bylaws will be printed <u>IN THEIR ENTIRETY</u> in the June 2020 issue of Military Women's Bulletin. The National Officer Election Ballot (which will ALSO be in the June issue) will include a space for membership to "Approve" or "Disapprove" the proposed bylaws IN THEIR ENTIRETY.

If the proposed bylaws rewrite is approved, the 2020 MWAN Bylaws will become effective September 1, 2020. If the rewrite is disapproved, the Current MWAN Bylaws will remain in place until the 2022 National Convention when membership will decide to amend or rewrite as desired.

The Current MWAN Bylaws are available on the MWAN Website, "milwomen.org". If you do not know how to download a document from the website, please contact MWAN Bylaws Chair Vicki Orem at "vborem2@gmail.com" and ask her to email a copy to you. If you do not use a computer, please call Vicki at (910) 363-5019 or (703)231-4440 and ask her to mail a printed copy to you.

Happy 100th Birthday Cody!

Cody Splitt arrived at her 100th birthday party on August 13th in style, rolling up to the Appleton Yacht Club in a limousine and greeted by sister veterans with a salute.

Esther "Cody" Splitt was born in 1919; the year congress passed the 19th Amendment granting women the right to vote. She grew up in Wausau, Wisconsin, raised by a single mother during the Great Depression and was one of the first women to serve during World War II in the U.S. Navy WAVES (Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service).

Cody was trained in the first WAVES boot-school class at lowa State Teachers College in Cedar Falls, Iowa. The day she joined the Navy was the turning point in her life. She was in the Navy from the day the WAVES formed in 1942 until Thanksgiving night in 1945, so she was in almost throughout the entire war.

She was assigned to Naval Intelligence in Washington, DC, where she worked on Japanese Code. She was later reassigned to personnel and managed some 600 women spread across three barracks. She was tasked with taking the women to any and every event happening in the capitol city. When President Franklin Delano Roosevelt was sworn in for his fourth and final term in office, Cody was directly below him, standing on the grass (See below article).

She was one of the first veterans to take advantage of educational benefits provided by the GI Bill, signed into law in 1944. Without the funds provided by the benefit, Cody said she never could have afforded tuition, much less room and board. Since her youth, she had always wanted to be a lawyer. She was one of five women in her University of Wisconsin Law School class and recalled working hard to finish up her bachelor's and law degrees, which normally take five years total, in just three short years.

Cody then moved to Appleton, Wisconsin, where she opened the second woman-owned law firm in the county. Her first prospective client immediately walked out of her office after he realized "Cody Splitt" was a woman. Due to a lack of clients, she was forced to take down her shingle after only one year.

However, Cody was no quitter. She later reopened her firm and her practice began to thrive. In fact, at age 66 when many lawyers were thinking about retirement, she was still hitting her stride.

She was the first woman president of the county bar association; a former county board Woman of the Year, and she also retained a seat on the county board until she tendered her resignation at age 82. At 96 years young, she was honored with a Lifetime Achievement Award by the Wisconsin Law Journal. She also established three scholarships for students in the Fox Valley.

As a founding member and past president of Fox Cities Unit 153, Cody has always been very active in not only civic programs but in the veteran community, as well. She proudly says, "I'm a woman veteran" and it's all about veterans helping veterans.

At her birthday party, Cody summed up her thoughts nicely: "To tell you the truth, I've just done anything I wanted to do, from the day I started 'til today. It's been a wonderful life." She added that her secret to a long, successful life is friendship. And if you are lucky enough to be her friend, you are a friend for life.





FDR's Fourth Presidential Inauguration

The fourth inauguration of President Roosevelt (pictured at left) was held Saturday, January 20th 1945. Due to austerity measures during World War II, the inauguration was held on the White House South, rather than at the Capitol. The parade and other festivities were canceled as well.

It was the only time a president has been inaugurated for a fourth term. The 22nd Amendment to the U.S. Constitution (1951) limits to two the number of times a person can be elected president). Roosevelt died 82 days into his term.

A toymaker who responded last year to a stern letter of complaint from a young Arkansas girl has released imagery of all-new, female variations of the classic plastic green Army figurines that have occupied toy stores since the 1930s.

Jeff Imel of BMC Toys published an update on the toy company's website, corresponding with the start of Women's History Month, which included in-process sculptures of a military working dog and handler, a nurse, and Rosie the Riveter perched atop a "We Can Do It!" pedestal.



The new toys, the product of 6year-old Vivian Lord's request for green Army women, come in sets of 36 and are expected to be released this October. Eighty-six-piece bucket sets are also available for pre-order.

Vivian's campaign for green

equality was first spurred after she noticed the only figurines targeting a girl audience were pink-colored male figurines.

"Why do you not make girl army men?" she wrote. "Some girls don't like pink, so please can you make army girls that look like women?"

BMC Toys of Scranton, Pennsylvania was one of three companies to receive letters from the flummoxed child but the only to respond.

Imel notified the disgruntled customer that he had been kicking around the idea of manufacturing green women figurines for years. With Vivian's nudge, he subsequently launched a fundraiser in the hope of acquiring a sum equivalent to "the cost of a modest new car," he told WNEP News Channel 16 in Moosic, Pennsylvania, last September.

It didn't take long for Imel to exceed his funding goal. "We're currently at an insane \$54,289," Imel said during a December 2019 Facebook live stream. The toy-maker added that support has come even from senior citizen women who mentioned wanting similar toys during their childhoods.

"It has meant a lot to military women who have told me they just want a little bit of recognition," Imel said during the live stream.

Besides the prototypes pictured above and right, BMC Toys' Plastic Army Women set will include figurines in classic poses such as standing, running and kneeling riflemen, prone sniper, grenadier, bazooka operator, radio operator, low crawling soldier, light machine gunner, wounded soldier, combat medic, and more.

"[Women have] served a long time in a lot of roles, and sometimes they feel invisible," Imel said. "So, hopefully we can [add to]

education about women in the military and how important they are. They've been, really, the main supporter base for the project. We wouldn't have gotten the project done without the military women who have supported us."
