A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ROBERT.....

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Spring is officially here and as the world around us begins to undergo its own resurrection it is only proper that we will soon be focusing all our attention on Christ's resurrection in the Church. Beginning April 14th we will be celebrating Holy Week, a time when we focus in on the trial, death, and resurrection of our Lord and savior Jesus Christ. We begin with Palm Sunday (April 14th) as we focus in on Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and reading the passion narrative. After that we will focus on the last meal that Jesus shares with his disciples prior to being arrested (Maundy Thursday April 18th). This then leads into what we like to call Good Friday (April 19th) where we look at the arrest, trial and death of Jesus. Before you ask, I already know what your first question is, why do we call it Good Friday? Well we call the day he celebrated his last meal with the disciples Maundy Thursday and that's just as random, so just know that there are deep confusing reasons for this and just nod your head and say, "yes pastor" and let's move on. The guestion I would like us to focus on is how we go from people celebrating in the streets proclaiming the savior has come to those same people calling for his execution? Did they not see that this is the Christ? The Messiah whose coming had been foretold throughout Scripture? He was, but unfortunately the people did not want to hear what he had to say, nor do what they wanted him to do. Instead they only wanted a messiah that mirrored their belief systems instead of a messiah that proclaimed what they needed to hear and see.

The people wanted a new King, someone who would inspire the people to rise up in violent rebellion to over-throw their Roman oppressors. This is backed up by scripture, during the Passion narrative when Jesus is put on trial before the crowds. Pontius Pilate, the Roman Governor, offers the people a choice between letting Jesus go or this other man named Barabbas who had incited violence. The crowds call for the release of Barabbas rather than Jesus, demonstrating their desire

for a more straight forward revolution rather than the spiritual revolution that Jesus proclaimed. This desire leads them to blindly ignore that which they truly need in order to be free, which is a change in their hearts and minds. As Jesus says to Pilate, his kingdom is not of this world, for his rule concerns changing how we engage the world around us. True reform could not be achieved through hatred and cruelty or else the cycle would continue, if the Jewish people wanted to change their world then it had to begin in their hearts and minds.

When we look at the cross we see many things. First and foremost we see a graphic depiction of a man beaten and broken then left to die as a warning against all those who wish to challenge the established authority. This is what those in power wanted the people to see, but as Christians we see so much more. We see someone who took our sins upon him and through his death and resurrection brought forgiveness and reconciliation. This image of a truly innocent man who stood up against the vile hatred and fear that this world is capable of dolling out and offering in its place forgiveness is revolutionary, which is why it has stood the test of time. It is a powerful image for us to wrap our heads around for as our sins are laid bare upon the body of Christ we are in return shown love, not hate, not anger, but love. Then in that one final act of rebellion which we celebrate on Easter morning (April 21st) Jesus lets us know that death is not the final answer but that there is a way out of this cycle of death and pain. The primary way out is through living a resurrected life, a life where we refuse to accept that death is the final answer. A life where we try and learn to understand and internalize Christ's life and teachings, thus opening our minds to a better way centered on ending this cycle of violence that our world seems stuck upon.



RECIPE CORNER: CHILI COOKOFF WINNER (LINDA H.)

- 1 15-oz. can black beans
- 1 15.25-oz. can corn. undrained
- 1 10-oz. can Rotel tomatoes, undrained
- 1 package ranch dressing mix
- 1 tsp. cumin
- 1 Tbsp. chili powder
- 1 tsp. onion powder
- 1 8-oz package light cream cheese
- 2 chicken breasts



Drain and rinse the black beans. Place chicken at the bottom of the crock pot, then pour out the whole can of corn (undrained), Rotel tomatoes, and black beans on top of chicken.

Top with seasonings and ranch dressing mix. Stir together.

Place cream cheese block on top. Cover with lid and cook on low for 6-8 hours.

After the cooking time is over, take chicken breasts from crock pot and shred and add back to the chili. Stir together and enjoy!


