A Parent's Playbook

1. Who is responsible for what?

These are the counselor's responsibilities:

- Transcript: Transcript Request Form, available on guidance webpage and in the guidance office (requires parent signature)
- School Profile
- Secondary School Report Form (if required)
- Counselor Recommendation (if required/requested)
- Teacher Recommendations (if required/requested)
- Submit mid-year grades
- Submit final transcript

These are the student/parent responsibilities:

- Application requirements:
 - Deadlines
 - Testing
 - Recommendation letters
 - Essay(s)
- Testing registration and deadlines
- Naviance
 - Pre-application packet (student and parent)
 - Update "Colleges I'm applying to"
 - Complete FERPA (Common Application)
 - "Match" Common App & Naviance
 - Teacher recommendation request
- Transcript Request form(s)
 - TWO WEEK ADVANCE NOTICE
 - Parent signature required
- College visits/choosing colleges
- Scholarship applications
- AP scores/college credits (if applicable)



2. College Applications

- College applications are available online at individual school websites. Each school will have information regarding their application requirements.
 - Georgia Application: www.gafutures.org for all four- and two-year GA schools and some GA community colleges
 - Common Application: www.commonapp.org. Over 400 schools accept this application.
 - Universal College Application: www.universalcollegeapp.com. Over 40 schools accept this application
 - Common Black Application www.commonblackcollegeapp.com Over 52 HBCU-Historical Black Colleges.
- Students need to be aware that there may be supplemental forms, essays, or specific documents requested to be sent with the application.
- College applications are the responsibility of the student.
Parents may want to proofread applications, but the student should be the one completing the application.
- A copy of the completed application, essays, or other documentation should be made prior to submitting/ mailing the application to the school.

3. Transcript Request Form

- Students must fill out one form per school that they apply to
- They should hand the form in TWO WEEKS before their application deadline
- The form must have a parent signature
- Pick one up in the Guidance Office (It may look like the sample below)

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4. Official High School Transcript

- Sent to colleges directly from guidance office along with school profile
- It is a record of all the courses that have been taken during high school, including failed courses and summer school courses
- Students' three-year class rank and three-year gpa. are listed
- Students' Regents scores and final exam grades are included
- Shows senior year courses in progress
- Shows absences and tardiness
- Standardized test scores ARE NOT included

5. Standardized Test Scores

Scores must be sent directly from the testing agency.

- SAT and AP scores from College Board: www.collegeboard.com
- ACT scores from ACT: www.actstudent.org

6. Teacher and Counselor Recommendations

- Your student should choose teachers with whom they have developed a positive relationship and whom they have shown a strong work ethic
- Requests for letters should come from students in person, not by telephone or email
- Students should provide counselors and teachers with a resume or activity list; this provides a larger picture for the writer to work with. Activities are not limited to school-based clubs. Community service, church involvement, boy/girl scouts and work should all be included.
- Students should give teachers a month or more to complete letters



7. Essays

- Students should author their own essays. Parents are welcome to proofread (if your student agrees), but the final product should be the student's
- Encourage your student to start early and to follow the directions, topic choices and deadlines
- If your student does not seek your opinion, encourage him/her to seek the opinion of someone they respect for feedback
- Students should focus on being genuine in their essays
- Some essays require that part A and part B be completed; help your student check the packet before the final documents are submitted

8. Admission Interviews

- Not all schools require interviews, but one can be requested if your student has weaknesses or inconsistencies to address. Your student should call the school to inquire about and arrange for an interview if one is desired, but not a normal part of the application process
- The more your student knows about a college, the better questions they will be able to ask their interviewer, showing interest and awareness
- If you are driving your student to an interview, make sure you plan plenty of time to arrive promptly. If your student is driving, help them with directions and getting out the door on time
- Help make sure your student has appropriate clothing to wear to an interview

9. Naviance

Many High Schools uses Naviance to manage the college application process.

Students are expected to:

- Update prospective and active applications
- Complete surveys
- Request letters of recommendation
- Check email daily and respond. Is your email address appropriate?

10. FERPA waiver

- FERPA stands for: Federal Education Rights Privacy Act
- In order for your counselor to send your school documents electronically, this form must be completed
- Create a Common Application account: www.commonapp.org
- After adding a college in “My Colleges” in the Common App, click on “Recommenders and FERPA” and complete the FERPA release authorization

12. Completed Application

- Application submitted online by student
- SAT or ACT scores requested, by student, to be sent from testing agency
- Transcript Request submitted and school package sent from Guidance Office. This includes:
 - Transcript
 - Counselor Recommendation (if required)
 - Teacher Recommendation letter(s) (if required)
 - Teacher Recommendation form(s) (if required)
 - School Report Form (if required)
 - School Profile

13. NCAA eligibility

- In order to play sports at a Division I or Division II school, there are grade, curriculum and SAT/ACT criteria that a student must meet to qualify to play
- Students register with the NCAA and request that a transcript be sent to the NCAA Clearing House. Registration can be completed online at: <http://www.ncaa.org/student-athletes/future/eligibility-center>
- Final clearance does not take place until after graduation
- More information is available at the above website, including a list of NCAA-approved core courses offered

14. Financial AID

Every student in their senior year should apply to financial aid beginning October the 1st. Sign up through [www. fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov)

- Step 1: Apply for an FSA ID. ...
- Step 2: Submit the FAFSA. ...
- Step 3: Submit the CSS/PROFILE and other financial aid forms, if applicable. ...
- Step 4: Apply for scholarships. ...
- Step 5: Review your Student Aid Report.
- Step 6: Compare your award letters.
- Step 7: Apply for loans, if necessary
