- Reduces travel time for passing traffic
- Tourist reach the resorts of Mablethorpe and Skegness more easily in the summer
- No heavy lorries through the town, cuts down travel times for transporting goods
- Promotes industrial development in and around the town, and creates jobs for locals

- Less trade in the town as through traffic is cut
