# All projects require a sewing machine and basic sewing supplies

#### **Composition Notebook Cover**

#### Supplies:

- Minimum 2 fat quarters coordinating fabric (Or any selection of scraps to be sewn into outer side of cover )
- 1 fat quarter for flaps
- Batting 17" x 12"
- Gross grain ribbon 1/4" 1/2" width approximately 40" long
- General sewing supplies, coordinating thread for decorative stitching (optional)

#### **Cat Mug Mat**

For the bacic Supplies:

- For face and ears 7" x 7" square
- Backkground 1 10" square
- For the binding A total of 38" x 2 1/2"
- For the backing 7.5" x 7.5" square
- (We will supply batting squares.)
- Coordinating thread for whiskers

#### Doorknob or Hook Hanging Bag

#### Supplies

2 coordinating 16 1/2" x 16 1/2" squares

We will supply pollen interfacing

Coordinating thread for topstitching and buttonhole

Your sewing machine needs to have zigzag statich

If you plan to use this on a doorknob rather than a hook, measure your doorknob's diameter.

Ribbons will be given in three categories:

- 1). Quilt of any size
- 2). Quilt that measures 30" x 30"
- 3). Other. ("Other" may be but is not limited to clothing, fabric sculpture, home decor item.).

The guilt or other item must be made between November 12, 2017 and April 8, 2018.

You will be given a paper label to fill out when you bring your challenge. You will be asked the following:

Did you design the piece yourself? If not, who was the designer? Did you quilt the piece yourself? If not, who quilted it?

If your quilt has a label, cover it with a piece of cloth.

Bring your quilt in a pillowcase or other in a closed bag or covered.

# Courthouse Quilters Darcy Lodge 39 Everittstown Road Route 513, Frenchtown, New Jersey

#### Directions from Flemington:

Route 12 West to flashing red light at The National Hotel in Frenchtown. Turn right onto Route 513 and drive up steep hill. The Darcy Lodge will be 3/4 mile on the left.

#### Directions from Clinton:

Route I-78 to Exit 15 to Route 513 South. Turn right just past Pittstown Inn at red light and follow Route 513 for 8 miles. Darcy Lodge on right hand side.
