He is also one of the few entertainers who is good enough to not have to lean on pre-recorded music to play along with, if it's coming off of Kenny's stage, it's LIVE!




IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON MEETING OF THE MINDS





Time to book your room for the Parrot Head Palooza and Captain Hiram's in Sebastian, FL.



MEXICAN STYLE HOT DOGS

These are great for your Cinco de Mayo celebration or Memorial Day cook out!

INGREDIENTS:

1/2 medium ripe avocado, peeled

1 T. lime juice

1/4 t. salt

1/8 t. pepper

6 hot dogs

6 hot dog buns

Mexican cheese shreds

1 small tomato, chopped

3 T. finely chopped red onion

3 bacon strips, cooked and crumbled

INSTRUCTIONS:

In a small bowl, mash avocado with a fork, stirring in lime juice, salt and pepper. Grill hot dogs, covered, over medium heat until heated through, 7-9 minutes, turning occasionally.

Serve in buns. Top with cheese, avocado mixture, tomato, onion and bacon. Enjoy!
