Mon-e-Bak and Brown Road Sanitary Sewer Project

We reached out to County Sanitary Sewer Engineer Stephen Renner for updates on these two important projects. Below is the information that he wishes to have shared with our residents;

Franklin County is committed to providing safe and sanitary sewer systems to the families, residents and businesses we serve.

We take pride in the quality of work we deliver to our customers and strive to ensure that our projects are completed accurately and with precision to ensure that we are providing customers with infrastructure that is reliable and safe. When we encounter a situation that doesn't meet our standards, we take corrective action.

We understand the frustration that some residents in the Mon E Bak and Brown Road East neighborhoods may feel. We are committed to completing the installation of the new sanitary sewer lines and have hired ms consultants, inc. to reevaluate the project area. Initial tasks include field surveys and existing infrastructure testing.

- A report and recommendations to correct deficiencies and complete the installation will be presented at the end of the year.
- The recommendations will likely involve more construction for which bids will be solicited.
- Construction would occur in 2016.
- Until the County is further into the project; a connection phase cannot be planned.
- Customers are unable to connect to the system until it is completed, tested and accepted.
- Further updates about the project will be presented after the system evaluation is completed.

Do not put boxes of expensive items to the curb; this is an invitation to thieves to break into your home. Instead break down the boxes and place them in a black trash bag.



The Police Dept. will be monitoring these areas during the Snow events and if your vehicle is parked in the "No Parking" areas they will be towed at the owner's expense.


Fire Department News - Chief James Welch

27 applicants are now in the process of interviewing for positions within the fire department thanks to the SAFER Grant. New firefighters will be hired and begin working mid-October, the SAFER Grant provides funding for only 2 years.

On August 22nd, Local 1441 President Ron Delozier ran the Leadville Trail 100 in Leadville, CO. This is a 100 mile race with elevations topping out at 12,600 feet. Ron crossed Finish at 29:10:57; 17:31 min/mile. 100 miles, 18,000 feet of total climb and still came in 20 minutes faster than the planned pace. What an amazing job.

On August 23rd, Franklin County Firefighters, Jason Brockmeyer, Greg Parks, and Nick Thornton ran the Emerald City Half Marathon in full turnout gear including SCBA! They finished in 2:39.
