

#### January 5, 2020 The Epiphany of the Lord Mt 2:1-12

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Happy Epiphany! It takes twelve days to fully celebrate Christmas. What a marvelous God we have who wishes to live among us so much, that He voluntarily humbles Himself to be born a child just like us. He enters with us into this human world of drama. Beside us here on earth, God will walk in the same dust of the earth that we share, to lead and show us the way to glory beyond our imagining. His way, as a devout son of God, is the selfless way of glorifying the Father, all the while serving His fellow brothers and sisters all walking similar paths. The night of Jesus' birth, we heard the angels' prophetic announcement to the shepherds that this Savior's life would fulfill, "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to all people of good will" (Luke 2:14). Jesus will manifest such a life of devotion to God above and the divine image here on earth below in His created sons and daughters. As we will read on, progressing along in Matthew's gospel this coming year, we will hear Jesus flash-back to this revealing light of Christmas. In Matthew 5:16, Jesus will say, "Your light must shine before others, that they may 1) see your good deeds and 2) glorify your heavenly Father." That's Christmas! Our faithful imitation of Jesus' life will do both: glorifying God and bringing peace to others. We pray for the same every time we recite the Lord's Prayer, 'Hallowed by Your Name..... Your kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven'. Who ever thought that with every offering of an 'Our Father', we were praying for Christ's birth among us? But Jesus was clear about His mission to glorify the Father. In John 8:49-50, He says, "I honor my Father......I do not seek my own glory", and in John 6:38, He said, "I have come down from heaven...to do the will of the Father." And what glorifies the Father but the good works the Son performs. In John 10:38-39, Jesus draws attention to the works, inviting people to believe in God's goodness based even at least on the good work done for others. He says, "even if you do not believe me, believe the works". Divine life is manifest in the work of corporal care of our human sisters and brothers. According to Jesus, such humanitarian service to neighbors is both Glory to God and 'Peace' to People on earth. This is why Jesus became human. St Paul in 2 Corinthians 4:6 describes Christmas as 'God making His light shine in our hearts...{giving us} knowledge of God's glory'. May we work under this light, and increase this light of God's love revealed in the good care and service of others for God's glory!

This brings us to the seeking and searching that is going on in today's gospel with Herod, the Wise Men and all of Jerusalem. Yet in the story, who is genuinely searching for God's glory and the world's peace? The Wise Men prove their sincerity by the sacrifice of long travels and their generous gifts for the child and family. They are serious about welcoming God's kingdom and seeking image of Christ on earth. But, what about Herod? Is He serious? He makes disingenuous comments about wishing to give homage to the newborn Christ-child. But notice that he doesn't even know his own scriptures, having to ask his court teachers to learn about messianic prophecy. As a past greedy and selfish politician, is Herod now honestly converting and seeking to rule more justly, humanely concerned for his citizens? Herod holds court with the Wise Men (Star watchers) and directs them to bring him return word of the location of the young Christ, so he can also go pay honors with a visit. So, he says? Of course, Herod greedily is only interested in himself and his power. Herod wishes Jesus dead after feeling his throne is threatened, since the wise men from outside have recognized Jesus as the promised child ruler to come. Herod's fear of losing power & privileges lead him to order the slaughter of all children under two years old (Matt 2:16). Herod is only an opportunistic self-seeker. But the gospel reveals true seekers of the absolute, such as philosophers seeking truth, artists seeking beauty, judges/ethicists seeking the good, and believers seeking the living God (Being). The wise men and Herod's bible scholars in today's reading are two groups of good seekers. Later in another gospel Jesus himself will commend another seeker named Nathaniel, who searches for the living God and finds Jesus. In fact, it is God who first finds Nathaniel (Jesus says as much about seeing Nathaniel earlier under a tree in John 1:48 & Nathaniel means "God has given"). Jesus praises Nathaniel with the words, "Here is a true Israelite. There is no duplicity in him" (John 1:47). Duplicity implies a 'divided heart', also seen in 'shifty' words and 'slippery' acts. Nathaniel seeks God and God alone. No competing motives like power, wealth or security. Nathaniel does not have a double or divided heart. Herod clearly does which is also seen in his 'forked tongue' that says one thing. but means another. God will judge Herod and bring justice to Bethlehem and the world soon enough. Yet for true seekers like Nathaniel, Jesus offers this encouragement, "you will see the sky opened and angels ascending and descending" (John 1:51). That sounds like Christmas and what led the wise men to Jesus. By His birth, God is to be found here, now. As God tells the prophet Jeremiah "Search for me, and you will find me when you seek me with all your heart"(Jer 29:13).
