These and many other quotes from our Founders, Congress, Supreme Court Justices, and many others were in a full page "ad" on the back page of Section 1 of the Daily Sentinel on Independence Day which was paid for by Hobby Lobby, Hemispheres, and Mardel Stores, located in Oklahoma City, OK.

What is your reaction when reading these quotes? How often do you hear anything like this quoted



by anyone in a position of authority? Reading these quotes reminded me of the book titled "*The Five Thou*sand Year Leap" by Skousen. When this nation was founded those who were involved in the writing of our constitution had a firm belief that "*all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights,.....*" The Declaration of Independence.

What has happened to our Nation? Why do many find it intolerable to acknowledge God and the beliefs of Christians? Why is there an attempt to re-write our history as a great nation and to eliminate any mention of our Creator and His place in the establishment of these United States of America?

Walker envisions a more fiscally responsible and effective state government. His priorities as Colorado's Treasurer are to safely and prudently invest Colorado's tax dollars, reform Colorado's PERA, and bring a higher level of accountability and transparency to government.

In 2014 Treasurer Stapleton was named one of America's top 24 rising political stars by the Aspen Institute. He received the Aspen Institute's prestigious Rodel Fellowship, a program designed to bring together elected officials who have demonstrated an outstanding ability to work responsibly across partian divisions and bring greater civility to public discourse.

Walker, his wife Jenna, son Craig, and daughters Colette and Olivia live in Arapahoe county. Treasurer Stapleton's community efforts include serving on the Board of Directors of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Metro Denver and the Denver Metro Council of the El Pomar Foundation. Walker graduated from Williams College in Massachusetts, and he holds a graduate degree in business economics from the London School of Economics and an MBA from Harvard Business School.


WRITINGS FROM THE RIGHT! AMERICANISM Linda Gregory

This past summer, I traveled with our Church Concert Choir to Germany and we took the trail of Martin Luther, a truly great religious man who was strong and determined in his convictions. His battle with the Pope is legendary, and it was no small miracle that he survived the anger of the Pope and successfully translated the Bible to German and began his own church.

After this wonderful trip I returned home and picked up Eric Metaxas" book "IF YOU CAN KEEP IT" and began reading about the human weather pattern known as the Reverend George Whitefield.

- Born in 1715, in humble circumstances in the Bell Inn (still standing today) in Gloucester the youngest of 7 children, George possessed great talent as an actor and had a very melodious voice. His vocal talents would play a vital role in the creation of the modern world.
- At the age of 15, George settled down to help his Mother run the Inn when he realized he could not afford a university education. A visitor to the Inn suggested that if George wished to go to Oxford, he could do it if he became a "servitor". He would be a butler, maid, to wealthy students And work his way through the university.
- George's Father had died when he was 2 and his mother remarried. Stepfather was not loving and George's life was difficult. He turned to God. By the time he reach Pembroke College in Oxford, he was not into sewing his wild oats and became a loner. Soon he met Charles & John Wesley and they formed the Holy Club.
- George was greatly influenced by a book "THE LIFE OF GOD IN THE SOUL OF MAN" BY HENRY SCOUGAL. Some people think that man's behavior is all that is necessary to be a religious person, attend church, kind to neighbors, etc. Scougal states that this is not what makes man a Christian.
- "TRUE RELIGION IS AN UNION OF THE SOUL WITH GOD" Participation of divine nature is Christ formed within us.
- These ideas influenced George greatly. His first church was in St Mary's de crypt where he had been baptized. He astounded the parishioners with his message, word spread and invitations to speak at other churches grew. London beckoned, he became a phenomenon and other ministers became envious.
- The Wesley's had traveled to The Americas and invited George to visit. In 1739 George stepped off a ship in Philadelphia and was interviewed by 33 year old Benjamin Franklin for the Pennsylvania Gazette. 4000 people came to get a glimpse of this 24 year old wonder.

• At the beginning of his ministry, the churches of England welcomed him, but in time they found his message to be shocking and objectionable, so they closed their doors to him.

• This was not the reaction in America. Whitfield traveled and preached to thousands at a time, creating new believers wherever he went..

• "WHITEFIELD'S PRINCIPAL MESSAGE CONCERNED WHAT HE CALLED THE "NEW BIRTH" "Whitefield knew that the Christian Faith was not about how one behaved, but about what one believed, and if one truly believed one could do nothing to achieve salvation but believe in Jesus, one's behavior would follow.

• Whitfield crossed to America 13 times and built a huge following. He united all kinds of people who be-

came born again in a new way, in a new country, with peoples who came from different places. He helped to create the idea that in believing we would also be "AMERICANS" united in our love for Christ and our new country.

 "He united the colonies as they had never been united, articulating what they came to believe. So that everyone who accepted these views about liberty and independence with all of their ramifications and corollaries – would have this in common with the others who did; and sharing these ideas became a vital part of what it meant to be an American.
