Doors of Mercy

At a recent meeting of Christian Associates in Pittsburgh I was talking with Bishop David Zubik of the Roman Catholic Church. We were talking about God's work taking place in each of our church bodies and he was sharing with me his hopes for his church body in 2016, the Roman Catholic Church of the Diocese of Pittsburgh.

The Bishop was telling me about their vision and focus for 2016, "The Jubilee Year of Mercy," an opportunity for people to find a renewed relationship with God. As a way to open new possibilities in the lives of people in the diocese he said there will be nine churches in Pittsburgh with designated "Holy Doors." At certain times of the year in 2016 people will be invited to walk through these "holy doors" to receive God's mercy and to become a renewed Christian through the work of the Holy Spirit.

Our conversation raised the question in my own thoughts about 2016 — what would happen in the Lutheran Church, in our congregations of the NALC and in our personal lives if we knew there was such a door we could walk through into a new chapter of life that would bring us a couple of steps closer to God? ... A door that would really make it possible to leave the past behind and experience a new beginning in life. I expect there would be lines of people miles long to pass through it!

God's Word tells us there is such a door if we have the faith and trust in God to walk through it. "I am the door; if any one enters by me, he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture." (John 10:9) The Book of Revelation also speaks about this door: "...Behold, I have set before you an open door, which no one is able to shut." (Revelation 3:8)

Walking through this door of mercy comes by restoring

one's radical commitment to the Good News of the Gospel in 2016 and knowing that God is calling us, each and every one, to "turn our lives around." ... Do not bear grudges or harbor resentments as you walk through the door of God's Grace into the New Year. Let your "yes" be "yes" and your "no" be "no." ... There is a price to be paid. Living in grace is about receiving from God and giving to others the gift of mercy. To remove the heavy weight of a troubled conscience walking through this door means knowing that Christ will pay the price so one can leave the past behind. It means recognizing there is also a price we need to pay – giving unconditional mercy to one another. God frees us from a troubled conscience but it is our choice whether to cooperate with God's plan for our life and our church in 2016. The Holy Spirit empowers each of us to build up the Body of Christ in some special manner in 2016 when we walk through the Door of Mercy.

For us Lutheran Christians the means of grace (Word and Sacrament) are the Door of Mercy. When we are absent from the means of grace faith weakens. When we receive the means of grace regularly, faith is strengthened and enlivened, so that "our light will shine before others that they will see our good works and glorify our Father in heaven." May we open and walk through many doors of Christ's Mercy in this New Year.





March for Life on Friday, January 22, 2016

National Mall, Washington, D.C.



This January, once again, our Mission District will be taking part in the March for Life in Washington, D.C. The March for Life is the largest Christian Pro-Life Rally in the world. The Nation's Capital will be filled with young people who come from all over the country. We will be joining with people of all ages and denominations, people filled with God's love - close to a million people coming together to worship, gathering at the National Mall in peace and prayer and then marching to the Supreme Court to stand up for "Life."

In The North American Lutheran Church we hold a Biblical view of life ("...Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you..." – Jeremiah 1:4; "For it was You who formed my inward parts; You knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise You for I am fearfully and wonderfully made." – Psalm 139:13-14). Therefore we believe that life begins at conception.

Therefore, we believe all unborn children are full and distinct persons in the eyes of God. ...Every person is a gift from God, the One, who forms us in our mother's womb. Every soul, every person is precious to God and their dignity and worth is to be respected.

The March for Life in January is a peaceful demonstration to up-lift the dignity of women as well as the unborn. Motherhood is a holy calling even in difficult circumstances as witnessed in the life of Mary, Jesus' mother. Unborn children are not "the property" of those who have conceived – each person's life, every soul belongs to God. The rights of the unborn and the dignity of women compels us to be a church and a society that "chooses life" and to seek the reversal of Rowe vs. Wade. We are Pro-Life and Pro-Women.

Since 1973 and the United States Supreme Court's decision to legalize abortion, more than 56 million children have been aborted in the United States, with 1.2 million abortions performed in just the last year. Statistics tell us that over 95 percent of those abortions were performed on children with no suspected fetal abnormalities.

Members of our congregations are invited to join our Bishop, Deans, and the NALC Executive Council, in this year's March. An Ecumenical Worship Service begins the day at Constitution Hall 8:30 - 10:30 am. If you arrive after 10:30 - gather under the North American Lutheran Church banner outside the Smithsonian on the National Mall. Following speeches/prayers on the mall we will march together united as one in the Body of Christ up Independence Avenue to the Supreme Court. The day's events conclude around 3:30 pm.

We need to express our faith publically. If possible all our congregations are encouraged to send a delegation or representatives. Please hold this year's March for Life in prayer at weekend services on, January 16-17, 2016 – and in personal prayer on January 22nd.

Discipleship as you know is a core value of our church body, the NALC. Accordingly much attention is given to the Great Commission. The value of holiness and generous service to ones neighbor must always be held in balance so that both the Great Commission and the Great Commandment define us as a church community.
