# SENSORY HAIR INFORMATION FOR OFFICIALS

Effective 1st of July 2022, the following addition has been included in the Equestrian Australia General Regulations (GRs):

## Chapter VI Protection of Athletes and Horses

### Article 141 - Protection of Horses

- In cases of a Horse's illness or injury during an Event the Ground Jury will decide, after consulting the Veterinary Delegate or Commission, whether the Horse may continue in that or subsequent Competitions.
- A **Horse's sensory hairs may not be clipped and/or shaven or otherwise modified in any way** under penalty of elimination from the event. Individual sensory hairs may be removed by a veterinarian to prevent pain or discomfort for the Horse. Areas of hair that must be clipped, shaven or removed to allow veterinary treatment are exempt from this rule.
- A phase in period of six months is being introduced to ensure horses are competing with sensory hairs. From 1st July 2022, horses found competing with clipped/shaven/otherwise modified sensory hairs will be issued a **recorded warning**. From 1st January 2023, horses found competing with clipped/shaven/otherwise modified sensory hairs will be **eliminated from the event**.

### Per Article 99 of the General Regulations:

- Sport Rules and Special Regulations must be read in conjunction with the GRs. In cases of conflict of interpretation between the provisions of the Sport Rules or Special Regulations, the principles of the GRs will take precedence.
- In cases of doubt about the interpretation of Articles or their application to particular circumstances, OCs should obtain a ruling from the EA National Office.





## What are Sensory Hairs?

Horses have special tactile sensory hairs, known as their whiskers. The whiskers on a horse play an important role in their sensory awareness system. These amazing sensory hairs have their own nerve and blood supply and help horses navigate their surroundings.

### Location and purpose of Sensory Hairs

Sensory Hairs are a coarse hair-like structure found around the horse's eyes and muzzle. The purpose of sensory hairs, both around the eyes and muzzle, is to provide sensory feedback on the horse's environment and surroundings. The length of the sensory hairs determines the safe distance from unfamiliar objects, compensating for the blind spots a horse has in front of its face and underneath its nose. In fact, many times the only information a horse receives about what is happening in these areas is provided through its sensory hairs. As well as this, they also enable the horse to understand unfamiliar characteristics of food or detect small inedible objects.

The sensory hairs present on both upper and lower eyelids provide an automatic blink response when they encounter something like a fly or contact with an object which helps protect the eye itself.

Equestrian Australia advises that sensory hairs located around the mouth, nose and eyes are an important sensory organ for the horse and should not be removed for cosmetic purposes. The hair inside the horses ears are not considered Sensory Hairs and may be trimmed.



# FAQS

## Who must abide by this rule?

The EA GRs, Sport Rules and Special Regulations apply to equestrian Events and/or Competitions organised by persons or bodies affiliated to EA, or otherwise under the jurisdiction of EA. By entering in a competition that is governed under EA rules, the participant is accepting to abide by these rules regardless of whether they are an EA member or not.



## What is a Recorded Warning Card and how do I issue one?

Dressage, Eventing and Show Horse have a Recorded Warning Card template annexed in the corresponding Sport Rules which outlines the offences that a Recorded Warning Card can be issued for in each discipline and the process that an Official will need to follow when issuing one.

## Who can eliminate a horse or issue a recorded warning?


Officials recognised by EA are responsible for the implementation of all GRs and Rules. Different disciplines have different Officials that hold this responsibility. Refer to the National Sport Rules for further information on which Officials are recognised by EA for the implementation of GRs and Rules which includes the elimination or issuing of a Recorded Warning Card to Athletes.

## What can a Veterinary Exemption cover?

As per the EA GRs Article 141, individual sensory hairs may be removed by a veterinarian to prevent pain or discomfort for the Horse. Areas of hair that must be clipped, shaven or removed to allow veterinary treatment are exempt from this rule. Horses that have a veterinary exemption must provide proof in the form of a Veterinary Certificate to the Organising Committee and Event Officials on request.

## Is there a certain length or number of Sensory Hairs that must remain on the horse?

No, there is no specified length or number of hairs that must remain on the horse. The spirit of the rule is that the Sensory Hairs of the horse are not purposely altered or modified in any way.



Horse ear hairs are not sensory hairs and can be trimmed.

The FEI World Equestrian Games are the major International Equestrian Championships and are administered by the FEI (Federation Equestre Internationale). The Games have been held every 4 years, halfway between sets of consecutive Summer Olympics, since 1990. Prior to that year, all of the 10 FEI individual disciplines held their own separate Championships, usually in different countries.

Up until 2022, the WEG was held as a single event and the location rotated to different parts of the world. It gradually expanded to include 8 of the 10 FEI disciplines.: Combined Driving, Dressage, Endurance, Eventing, Para Equestrian, Reining, Show Jumping and Vaulting.

The inaugural WEG was hosted in Stockholm (SWE) and since then the Games have been staged in The Hague (NED) in 1994, Rome (ITA) in 1998, Jerez (Spain) in 2002, Aachen (GER) in 2006, Kentucky (USA) in 2010, Normandy (FRA) in 2014 and Tyron (USA) in 2018.

Unfortunately, numerous organisational problems became apparent in Tyron and so, following submissions and decisions by the FEI Board, the WEG was not allocated to one particular country for 2022.

The World Championships for Dressage, Showjumping, Para Dressage and Vaulting were held in Herning (DEN) in August, 2022. Pratoni del Vivaro (ITA) has just hosted the World Championships for Eventing and 4 in Hand Driving in September 2022.

A world class Championship eventuated for Dressage and Para Dressage in Herning. In Dressage, 34 nations competed with 94 competitors and horses and 20 full teams. In the Para Dressage there were 28 nations entered with 83 horses and riders.

Wonderfully inspiring performances, brilliant riding and many very beautiful horses were enjoyed by huge, appreciative crowds and to quote FEI President Ingmar de Vos "We have experienced two weeks of incredible sport in four disciplines at the ECCO FEI World Championships 2022, where the level of Event management from the Organizing Committee was nothing short of impressive."

Marlene Hunt and Heather Kyros, who both attended the competition in differing capacities, will now share their insights into this memorable event.

In September 2020 we approached John Thompson with the aim of purchasing his Grand Prix stallion Chemistry as a future U25 mount for our then 16 year old daughter Kate. As Kate was about to begin Year 12 we made the decision for John to continue training and competing Tommy (as he is known at home) throughout 2021. At the end of that year we were approached by John seeking permission for him to keep the ride into 2022 in order to campaign for the World Dressage Championships in Herning, Denmark. Kate agreed to delay her start on the horse to enable John to finish his journey and our path to the World Games had begun.

Representing New Zealand, John rode the Australian CDI qualifiers in early 2022. He achieved over the minimum required scores (66% MER and 68% for NZ) on every occasion. New Zealand High Performance were aware that a number of their horses were located in the Southern Hemisphere. In May they declared their Team for the World Championships - the first country to do so.

As owners we were very involved in the planning from day one. There was a lot of work to be done to get Tommy, his groom Ellen Suann, John and all the necessary gear over to Germany and then on to Denmark in peak form. We worked closely with IRT, New Zealand team manager Warrick Allan and Australian Bennet Conn (who is located in Lingen, Germany) to make travel decisions, always with the

very best interests of Tommy's welfare as our highest priority. On the 13th of July Tommy left Mulawa Performance and began his long trip to Germany (via Melbourne, Hong Kong, Doha and Brussels). He arrived in top shape and spent the next two weeks acclimatising and training with John before the final road trip to Denmark.

We arrived into Herning late on Tuesday August 2nd. Tommy had travelled with Ellen overnight and bumped in first thing that morning. After a whole night travelling he had enjoyed the day off. We eagerly arrived at the venue early on Wednesday morning super excited to finally see him. Our first task was to collect our accreditation passes which gave us access to the stable area, warm up, riders lounges and stadium seating. The scale of the venue was immense and it felt very surreal to actually be there.

We have attended a number of international events as spectators in the past including Aachen, The Royal International and Olympia. However nothing compares to the experience of having 'backstage passes' to the real show. The first morning we wondered through the stable block to find Tommy and Team New Zealand. Everywhere there were famous riders, team flags with every nation we could think of, and an abundance of the most spectacular horses.

The plan was to ride Tommy early, so we assisted with tacking up and headed out to the practice arena. The FEI steward overseeing the training promptly informed us that they had just opened the main arena if we would like to go in? Ummmm YES! - around we went, through the two 'next to go' warm ups, over the road, down through the tunnel and out into the Stutteri Ask Stadium - the first horse to do so.

The next two days were an exciting unbelievable haze as we learnt about the 'ins and outs' of having a horse competing at the biggest event in the world. Each day there was a training plan with the aim of familiarising Tommy as much as possible with all three warm ups as well as the main arena. Daily, we were standing next to Charlotte Dujardin in the coffee line and sharing the hotel lift with Catherine Dufour! The feeling everywhere was one of excitement, enjoyment and support - so many languages buzzing away. We made sure we were ringside in the practice area each day to watch Carl Hester training Charlotte and interestingly, we were far from the only ones who were keen to observe their training methods.

The Organising Committee (OC) are to be commended for the smooth manner in which they ran such an enormous event. The sheer volume of volunteers assisting with every and any task was quite unbelievable. The OC were responsible for providing all meals and accommodation for grooms, riders and National Federation (NF) appointees. There were media slots, photo shoots, social media teams, vets, farriers, daily meetings for practice times, draws etc etc. Everything was easy, including being able to drive right into the grounds and park a short walk from your stable. As well as the Vaulting World Championships occurring in the stadium next door, they also ran CDI Junior, Young Rider and U25 Grand Prix classes throughout the show. One can understand why European dressage is so far ahead when you see the opportunities and experiences they provide for their emerging talent from such a young age.

The day of competition was thrilling. As the first competitor in Group Two entered the arena we moved to Warm Up 1. This was a full lettered dressage arena where the next competitor rode alone. A large "countdown" clock ran down the minutes before the FEI Warm-up Steward announced the call to move through to the holding area. We were able to walk the whole way with Tommy, across the road down the tunnel and through to the stadium where we were directed to the viewing area aptly named the "Kiss & Cry".

to the "After Ride" nightclub on the grounds. Here a packed crowd drank and danced the night away to amazing DJ's. The winning riders and their teams were present, with flowing champagne, dancing in their riding attire - medals and all! The Danish sure know how to throw a party.

We finished our World Games journey by accompanying Tommy back to Lingen, Germany. 

## *Tips for making a good first impression on Judges in a Dressage Test*

Generally there isn't a lot of time to make the best impression when the rider before you finishes their test and it is your turn, but there still are a quite few things you can do when you commence your time in the "field of play: around the arena.

Being well presented and on time; and smiling and saying 'Good morning / good afternoon' to the Chief Judge at C are good ways to start. If you know the Judge, do not use the Judge's name. The Judge probably won't know all competitors and it may make it appear like an unlevel playing field if you get "familiar or personal" and use their name. All competitors should be treated in exactly the same impartial manner, whether they know the Judge or not.

Make sure the Judge and writer (penciller) can read your ID Number. It isn't uncommon to hear Judges and writers comment that the numbers are too small and cannot be seen, so purchase numbers that can be seen. Make sure you pass the Judge at a speed which allows the numbers to be read.

If the Judge is completing the Collective Marks on the previous test, keep moving. Judges don't appreciate it if a rider "parks" their horse next to the Judge's car or hut where they may overhear comments on the previous horse.

Make sure you ride your horse past C. Most experienced Judges ring the bell as you ride past R or S, as this ensures the rider hears the bell, even on a windy day. It also helps you as a rider to know that the bell you heard was for you, not for the rider in the arena alongside yours.

If you do not hear the bell, rather than doing multiple 20 m circles at the A end of the arena, change the rein and go around the arena again, this gives the Judge a second opportunity to ring the bell as you go past R or S.

When you hear the bell, nod your head so the Judge knows you heard the bell. Judges are sometimes not sure if the rider heard the bell, particularly on windy days and nodding your head makes it clear to both parties.

When you do enter the arena, make sure you make a turn that puts you onto an imaginary continuation of the centre line at least 10 - 15 m back if there is

space to do so. This may mean making a half 10 m circle onto that continuation. It is always better to turn "inside" the continuation of the centreline, rather than to overshoot it and then turn back on to that line, as this is likely to unbalance your horse and make him lose some rhythm and energy.

Ride an active, forward approach from A to X, this makes the best impression on the Judge, as well as helping to keep your horse straight. When you salute, the correct thing to do is to salute ONLY THE CHIEF JUDGE at C.

When you salute, make sure you salute without a whip in the hand you salute with. You can salute with your right or left hand, whichever hand does not carry your whip. Alternatively, you can pass your whip to your non-saluting (left) hand if you prefer to salute with your right hand. In some other countries saluting with a whip in your hand is given a penalty, but in Australia, it simply makes a poor impression.

As the great Charles de Kunffy said many years ago, the salute in a dressage arena should be modest and understated, rather than the grand flourish an actor in a theatre might make.

Keep your halt brief, just 3 seconds, which gives you enough time to salute then move off. The longer you stay in halt, the more risk there is that your horse will lose attentiveness or become unsteady in his head and neck, if not immobile on one or more of his feet.

Make your depart from the halt active and prompt, again this will help to keep him straight on the centre line, and make a good impression on the judge in regard to his responsiveness to your aids.

All the best with your tests!

## New Judges

Congratulations to Anne Smith on being appointed as an F-level Judge! Anne is on the fast-track to D-level.

We welcome all riders to train as Judges as a valuable resource to add to the SA list. The fast-track pathway is available to riders who have scores >60% at FEI within the last 8 years.

## G-level Zoom Call

Navigating the requirements to become a G-Level Judge and the record-keeping to maintain accreditation can be daunting. To help answer any questions about how to become a Judge or the requirements for accreditation, we will be holding another Zoom session. Judges or anyone interested in become a Judge are welcome to attend. Register your interest by emailing:

## Rule Updates - Effective from 1<sup>st</sup> July 2022

- For the purpose of horse welfare, only two tests are to be ridden per day.
- Horse identification numbers must be a minimum of 4cm in height, in black text on a white background.
- Sensory Hairs: A horse's sensory hairs may not be clipped and/or shaven or otherwise modified in any way. From 1 July 2022, horses found competing with clipped/shaven/otherwise modified sensory hairs will be issued a Recorded Warning. See more information in this edition of Moving Forward.

## Rule Updates – effective from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2023

The EA Equipment Annex Version 20 has been released and will be in effect from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2023. The new version is available on the EA Dressage Rules page. Queries can be submitted to the Dressage Equipment Committee: an application form is available on the EA Dressage Rules page.

**Sensory Hairs: A horse's sensory hairs may not be clipped and/or shaven or otherwise modified in any way. Horses found competing with clipped/shaven/otherwise modified sensory hairs will be eliminated from the event.**

## South Australian Judges Subsidy Scheme - REMINDER

**The ESA Dressage Judges Committee (ESA-DJC) recognises that to maintain accreditation, upgrade qualifications or gain further experience, Judges may need to travel Interstate. As this can be costly, the ESA-DJC has allocated funds from the SA dressage Judge Levy collected by Clubs, to support Judges travelling for further education.**

The purpose of the subsidy scheme is to set out a framework for reimbursement for South Australian Judges travelling Interstate (and across the regions) to upgrade, remain accredited or further their judging experience. It will apply to any expenses incurred from 30th November 2019 to 30th June 2020 and during the financial year starting 1st July 2020. This will be continued for the financial year starting 1<sup>st</sup> July 2021.

The amounts noted in this document are intended as a guide only. Funding is subject to availability and will be reviewed as part of normal financial operations. For any financial year, a cap of \$3,000 will apply. The ESA-JSC will review all applications and approve those that meet the criteria and intention described below, and within the available budget.

***For subsidies numbered 1-3, funding is limited to five Judges per year. A Judge may only apply for one subsidy per financial year. Judges must check with the Committee to see whether funds are available before travelling.***

### ***Please note:***

Judges maintaining accreditation or upgrading are encouraged to seek Judging appointments Interstate and then 'piggyback' attending a Seminar or undertaking shadow judging or sit-ins. Organising Committees may pay for at least part of airfares and accommodation and this then stretches our budget further and allows for more Judges to benefit from the Scheme.

### ***1. Upgrading to A or B Level***

Judges upgrading to A or B Level may receive a subsidy of \$1000 (max per Judge per level) for travel expenses to complete shadow judging, sit-ins and the Practical Exam. This amount will be paid on the successful completion of the qualification. A report must be submitted to the Chair, ESA-JSC together with receipts for expenses.

### ***2. Upgrading to C or D Level***

Judges upgrading to C or D Level may receive a subsidy of \$500 (max per Judge per level) for travel expenses to complete shadow judging, sit-ins and the Practical Exam. This amount will be paid on the successful completion of the qualification. A report must be submitted to the Chair, ESA-JSC together with receipts for expenses.

### ***3. Gaining further experience in judging Interstate***

To encourage Judges to travel Interstate to see different horses and gain further experience in Judging, a subsidy of \$200 (max per Judge per level) will be paid for these Judges to write for higher level Judges, shadow judge or sit-in at an Interstate event. The event and activity must be appropriate to the applicant's current or upgrading level. A report must be submitted to the Chair, ESA-JSC together with receipts for expenses.

### ***4. Regional Judges' support***

The ESA-DJC understands that for Judges in regional areas, the cost to attend Seminars, workshops and shadow judging can be prohibitive. Judges travelling in excess of 120km (each way) from home to a venue to shadow judge at a competition or attend a Seminar for the purpose of maintaining accreditation or upgrading, may receive a subsidy of \$0.50 per kilometre up to a maximum of \$250. Shared driving is encouraged where practical. Potential Judges who are travelling to attend a G-level Seminar or a competition for the purpose of shadow judging may apply for reimbursement when they are appointed as a G-level Judge, at the completion of all the requirements. Regional Judges may submit one application per year.






