

Less informed Members may only see the benefits of Elks membership as affordable food and beverages. They are less likely to remain Members.



Section 1.115 Notice: "Except as otherwise directed by Executive Order, any notice required to be sent or mailed to all Members of the Lodge may be included in the Lodge Bulletin or sent electronically to any Member who has given written authorization to receive notices electronically. Notice which is required to be served upon a specific



Member must be served personally, by United States Mail or by United States Mail, Certified, Return

Receipt Requested as specifically provided."

The Grand Secretary's Office has seen an increase in inquiries about e-mailing the

Lodge Bulletin to save the Lodge money. Yes, a Lodge can e-mail the Lodge Bulletin to a Member "who has given written authorization to receive notices electronically" as stated, in the Statute above. Consequently, a Lodge cannot mandate all Members will receive the bulletin via e-mail without the individual Members' authorization.
