Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

23rd Sunday Ordinary Year C Luke 14:25-33

'Listen to the coach on the field!" A player has to deal with a lot of voices yelling things at them, but it is only the field coach that matters in the game! I saw a child baseball player get hit once with a baseball because they were distracted by a 'coach in the stands' (maybe a parent) yelling commands at them that were different from the coach at first base. On the field, there is ONE coach you listen to, and only that one matters while in the game. Otherwise, you are soon 'OUT' - tagged out by the opposite team's player because of your hesitation in play. Or you might be 'benched out' by the field coach that realizes you can't focus on his/her directions! That is what Jesus is talking about in today's gospel. He says, "I need your undivided attention." Complete attention. Even if it is a family member-parent calling out something else different from Jesus, we need to keep to what Jesus called. I think the word 'hate' distracts all of us from getting Jesus' point today. In the time of Jesus, I'm not sure there was all of the emotionally vindictive and retaliatory baggage that is attached to the word 'hate' for us today. It suggest that the word 'hate' coming out of Jesus's mouth just means 'to disregard', 'let go', 'leave alone' or simply to have nothing to do with what you hate. 'Hate' today implies 'actively attacking' what is hated, while I suspect that for Jesus' time 'hate' just implied not paying attention to it. Now I know that even this 'softer' interpretation doesn't sound too good, so let me add immediately that Jesus 'loves parents' and wants us to love parents! He Himself in the gospel elsewhere celebrates the command to 'Honor your mother and father' (Exodus 20:12), when He challenges the Pharisees who were looking at ways of getting out of taking care of elderly parents (seizing inheritance early-Mark 7:8-13). But, most of all, notice the continuing care of His own mother Mary, that He sets up with the Beloved Disciple at the foot of the cross right before He dies (in John 19:25-27-'Behold your mother' he is basically saying, 'John ,take care of Mom, after me!)

So, if a parent or anyone, gives you a command that doesn't sound like Jesus, I think Jesus would say, "Bring that concern to me-I will take care of it with you!" Jesus is simply asking for our undivided attention and dedication when we claim to be following Him. He uses two great examples, one of a builder taking an inventory of materials before he begins building, to ensure that he can finish the job, and another example of a military general counting his troops to ensure that he can complete a battle. So, Jesus wants to make sure that we have completely signed up with him, when we claim to, before He entrusts us with His mission. We have to trust Him. It is as if He is saying, "Your family, leave that to me-You do what I call you to, and trust me to care for those concerns close to your heart-I'll cover them." I think of James and John leaving their father's boat, (Mark 1:20) when Jesus called them to follow. I am sure that their father Zebedee was not left destitute and floating alone in the sea. In fact, I think Jesus brings Zebedee into His circle of disciples later, but maybe on a different level than the apostles. Not everyone receives the same call. There are many roles to play and help needed in Jesus' mission. I imagine Zebedee and his fish-boating connections are called upon in all of the extra 'boat-trips' Jesus takes when traveling throughout the rest of his missionary work (For example, Luke 8:22 'One day Jesus got into a boat.....'Whose boat, but Zebedee's?') There are many gifts, and many ways of serving Christ based on our own skills and abilities. So, we have to trust Jesus that when He calls, He knows of our current commitments and will see to it that all that is good will still be completed (If He calls us away, He will take care of it).

To reinforce this idea of the complete focus Jesus demands of us if we follow Him, we can all relate to asking someone for something, but because they are caught up staring at a screen or gaming away, a 'way-off' response is given or wrong item delivered. Or I imagine we all have done such ourselves when we tried to accomplish a task but were distracted by flashy images or 'baiting headlines. Or for sure, the dinging sounds, buzzes or alarms that demanded their own actions pulled us off task, at least for a minute. Jesus knows this 'distractibility' of our natures, so He is clear about the absolute dedication He calls for in disciples. When Jesus says, 'Take up your cross', He implies a physical embrace or grip (what we touch and feel, we really know). So I hear Jesus saying that He prefers that we 'grab a hold' of our mission with him and keep at it by His side (only one thing at a time can be held in our hand!) So, we do keep personally close to Jesus, even taking hold of His Hand if we have to, and we trust that He is covering our personal (and familial) concerns for us.
