





Mission Message

HOPE IN SOUTH SUDAN

South Sudan is the newest country in the world, created by the separation of Sudan into two countries. But it is also one of the most volatile countries in the world. 1.5 million South Sudanese are internally displaced and many more have fled to other countries due to poverty, food insecurity, a lack of education and health care, and extreme violence against civilians. The United Nations formally declared that several regions of South Sudan are undergoing severe famine and more than 100,000 are reported to face imminent starvation.

The ELCA is responding to the disastrous humanitarian toll across the region through <u>Lutheran Disaster Response</u>. Also, the ELCA is beginning to establish an Evangelical Lutheran Church Africa Mission in South Sudan, breaking ground in 2016 for a Lutheran center and health clinic. The center will offer English language lessons and computer training, and the clinic will give much needed health care. Learn more at ELCA.org/globalministries.

Mawien Ariik and Wal Reat are South Sudanese who originally sought asylum in the US, and while here, became ELCA pastors. They have returned to South Sudan to coordinate and serve the new church. They are from rival tribes, but together they hope to grow the Lutheran church and bring healing to their country. Ariik says, "The message the church is conveying is that all tribes are children of God and we are supposed to remain as one." Hope is the common thread motivating them amid conflict, violence, and poverty towards a peaceful future.

Healing hospitality

Repeated headlines about violence can make us "feel like locking our doors and never entering society again," writes pastor and author Max Lucado. After another mass shooting, he penned an online opinion piece that urged people to do the exact opposite by opening their doors, their hearts and their circles.

"It's no accident that hospitality and hospital come from the same Latin word," Lucado writes, "for they both lead to the same result: healing. When you open your door to someone, you are sending this message: 'You matter.'"

Because daily life is filled with rejections, extending an invitation — even to a simple meal — can be life-altering, Lucado contends. What you think is a messy house might be a sanctuary to someone else, "and to those who eat alone every night, pork and beans on paper plates tastes like filet mignon."

Our kitchen tables are "God's secret weapons in the war on fear," Lucado says. "We never know what one meal will do."

The way of prayer: Practices for unity

Jesus Prays for All Believers

"My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one: I in them and vou in me. May they be brought to complete unity to let the world know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me."

This gospel reading from John 17 deals with the themes of belief and unity in the lives of the believers in Jesus. When I think of when I've been most im-

pressed with Christians, it's been when they live out beliefs in real ways by taking action to serve others – in Jesus



name. It might sound trite, but the chorus "They will know we are Christians by our love.", comes to mind...

We will walk with each other, we will walk hand in hand; We will walk with each other, we will walk hand in hand; And together we'll spread the news that God is in our land.

And they'll know we are Christians by our love, by our love, yes, they'll know we are Christians by our love.

One thing essential thing for unity to occur in the community of church - is prayer.

Prayer – meeting together – encouraging each other; all of these are essential actions that Hebrews 10 call us to live into as a community of faith: And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another..."

Without being united in prayer,

we can tend to float along on good intentions and unattainable ideals, but remain unconnected. Prayer is the spiritual practice that keeps us together in unity. Prayer could be described as spiritual rubber cement. Or in this case...a high five for unity.

Let me explain.

Prayer is important, but it can be difficult to practice. Some people feel they don't have the right words to say or the plan of how to go about it. Years ago, someone taught me a prayer exercise that is very helpful. It does not require a seminar and is as close to you as your hand. Actually, it uses each digit on your hand to give a way to prac- 5. And lastly comes our little tice prayer...

Five Finger Prayer Practice..

- 1. Your thumb is nearest to you. So begin your prayers by praying for those closest to you. They are the easiest to remember. To pray for our loved ones is, as C.S. Lewis once said, a "sweet duty."
- 2. The next finger is the pointing finger. Pray for those who teach, instruct and heal. This includes teachers, doctors, and ministers. They need support and wisdom in pointing others

in the right direction. Keep them in your prayers.

- 3. The next finger is the tallest finger. It reminds us of our leaders. Pray for leaders in politics, business, industry, and administrators. These people shape our nation and guide public opinion. They need God's guidance.
- 4. The fourth finger is our ring finger. Surprising to many is fact that this is our weakest finger; as any piano teacher will testify. It should remind us to pray for those who are weak, in trouble or in pain. They need your prayers day and night. You cannot pray too much for them.
- finger; the smallest finger of all. Which is where we should place ourselves in relation to God and others. As the Bible says, "The least shall be the greatest among you." Your pinky should remind you to pray for yourself. You are a part of the practice of prayer – and praying for your own needs is important too!

The "Five finger Prayer" is a simple way for me to remember how praver can be to make a part of my daily life. If unity is a goal worthy of working and praying towards, the five finger prayer can bring people together

The Tree of Life Church Council met Monday, April 8th. I could not attend, so here are some thoughts I have:




*Speaking of Pastor Tara, did you know that she was honored as one of three Women of the Year by the Zonta Club? Congratulations, Pastor Tara!!

This is to inform you of a Congregational Meeting to seek approval to enter into this transaction.
