




Our Annual Easter Egg Hunt will take place on Sunday, April 16th after the 11am Mass.

The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings w/your children



Today, unlike at almost any other Mass, we hear two Gospel readings. Today is the first day of Holy Week. We remember n the moments before and up to when Jesus died. They remind Undaws of two different days in the life of Jesus, the Sunday when he entered Jerusalem and the

Friday when he died. We remember how in a matter of days, people in the city treated Jesus in two very different wavs.



In the first Gospel reading, as Jesus entered Jerusalem. the people laid palm branches and even their own cloaks on

the road in front of him. At that time the roads were not paved. Walking on them made your feet dirty or dusty. The people would have rather had their clothes dirty than Jesus' feet be dirty. They also shouted "Hosanna in the highest." Where have you heard this passage before? In Hebrew, this passage means "Save us, please." The people believed that Jesus had the power to save, the power that comes from God.

The Israelites wanted a king to come to their rescue, one who looked like other kings, only stronger and more powerful. Jesus' kingship was different from what the people hoped for. Kings wore crowns. What was Jesus' crown made of? Kings often have a scepter, a staff that is a symbol of a king's great power. What was Jesus' scepter? Was it strong like a king's? Would it make him look like he had power?

When the crowds saw what looked like Jesus' great weakness as he hung on the cross, they said. "He saved others." he cannot save himself." What they didn't know was the very act of not saving himself was how he saved others. What happens in three days from this time?

Living our Faith: This is the last week of Lent, the time to prepare our hearts for the rising of Jesus. How many kindness acts can you do this week so that your heart will shine very bright for Jesus?
