Issues reviewed and discussed were:

*Synod is making changes in the assignment process for Supply Pastors.

*Contacts for our congregation to the Synod for this process will be Virginia Lash and Renee Lenning.

- *Synod has also made changes to the way Supply Pastors will be paid for their services.
- *Question arose regarding the use of the glass vases for the Alter flowers at the present time. It was indicated that a change was made by the florist in the way they are designed for the summer. This will only occur during summer months.
- *The playing of CDs prior to the service was discussed. We will continue this practice.
- *Kathy Kauffman will be substituting for Virginia on several Sundays for the remainder of the summer and into the Fall.

Changes within the service will take place starting in October:

- *Use of Setting 4 will begin on the first Sunday in October.
- *The Hymn of Praise "This is the Feast" will be utilized starting October 1. There is also the possibility of using "Create in Me a Clean Heart, O God" with the services.
- *Choir rehearsals will start after Labor Day.

The next meeting will be October 5 after choir rehearsal.


