Who Are You?

Since late September in our Sunday sermons we have been tackling the question of Christian identity. This is for a very good reason – if you sincerely want to live as a Christian 24 / 7, you have to constantly live by the reality of who you are in Jesus.

If you turn your face away from the church, reality is not measured by who you are in Jesus. Successful reality is measured by Facebook friends, by possessions or experiences. Success is mostly measured from the outside in.

In fact, we're given many definitions of what it means to be successful in life. Lots of times it comes down to counting the size of our houses; how many acres do we own; how many cars / trucks / boats are in the garage; or how much money is in our checking account at the end of the month. Others might suggest measuring your life by the number of electronic toys you own or the destinations you've visited.

And even if someone measures you by your "good works," it's all in what you do that expresses success. How much money have you donated? How many hours have you given? To what organizations do you belong?

Christian reality also begins on the outside of us. But it begins in Jesus coming to us from outside of ourselves to heal and nurture us and to mold us into His community.

Christian reality is not about what we own, but what owns us. Therefore, if I am going to live in Jesus, it begins in everyday waking up and recognizing I belong to Him. Everything I am goes back to Jesus – His plans, priorities, and dreams. Life is about Jesus coming to me from outside of me and making me into His own.

Every morning we're offered two sets of daily objectives.

One is to follow a life that will measure me by standards of which I can never complete.

The other is live a life by which the standards complete me.

"For me to live is Christ" – Philippians 1:21. In His Spirit, I challenge you: choose life in Him!

My brothers and sisters in Christ, I hope that the Lord places someone in our paths today and we may deliver salvation's drink of living water to them. Remember we are called to share the truth; it is **God** who provides their salvation. As we are watched by others, perhaps your daily walk with God will invoke a question in their heart "what makes you so different?" Let us share our hope in Christ by actions, life and when necessary with words.


