

#### ARTICLEVII

#### Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers in the saving grace of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ who have accepted him as their personal Saviour. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one

another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows:

Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit

Creation and Formation

Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation

Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Saviour, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body. A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by speaking in other

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit

Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Washing of Feet.

Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers. Do not condone divorce and remarriage. Matthew 19:8-9. Destruction of the Wicked.

Conditional Immortality.

Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.

A Ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These basic doctrines shall be adhered to in the teaching of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.







## ALL THINGS THAT PERTAIN TO LIFE

II Peter 1:1-(3)-11

Simon Peter, a servant and an apostle of Jesus Christ, to them that have obtained like precious faith with us through the righteousness of God and our Savior Jesus Christ:

Grace and peace be multiplied unto you through the knowledge of God, and of Jesus Christ our Lord,

According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virture:

Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust.

And besides this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity.

For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins.

Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if you do these things, ye shall never fall:

For so an entrance shall be ministered unto you abundantly into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

I am considering a human life (your life and my life: any life) and our path into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

First you must enter the door or gate into the straight and narrow way. Jesus is the door. He is the entrance to the straight and narrow way. Simon Peter wrote this epistle "To them that have obtained like precious faith with us through the righteousness of God and of Jesus Christ our Lord." The last part of verse one.

Now I skip to verse four. Not that I'm leaving out verses two and three. I'll come back to them later. I want to pursue what we should do as we walk with Jesus on the straight and narrow way so we can enter into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Now let me explain. When we are convicted of sin—repent in true sorrow and God for Christ sake forgives us our sins—we become a part of the Kingdom of God and Jesus Christ. There is another step to be taken: The consecration of our life in the service of God and Jesus Christ. Upon full consecration we are freed from the Adamic nature or the old man and put on the new man which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness. Eph. 4:24. This allows us to live in the spirit while in this flesh. This is explained by Paul in Romans 8:1-15. Specifically verse 14 reads "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God." Although we can be in the kingdom of God now there will come a time when we shall enter into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ in a literal and specific manner.

Here are some of the things Jesus purchased for us to help us live an overcoming life here in this present life. "Whereby are given unto us (the Sons of God not to everyone) exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, - (have you partaken of the divine nature?), having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust." We can be more like Jesus and less like ourselves and we will be better and the world will be better because we are more like Jesus and less like ourselves. We are born again. Endowed with the divine nature. True Sons

This does not bring us to the top of the ladder. It does bring us to the end of the ladder. The lower end so we can climb toward that great pinnacle of success — Immortality or in-corruption. We are really just getting where we can live for Jesus an overcoming life.

Verse 5 "And beside this, (what else matters? what else can be gained? I've been forgiven. My name is on the Lambs Book of Life. I've been cleansed of the Adamic nature and given the divine nature). Simon Peter says, "Beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue (I must add more. Virtue is purity.) And to virtue knowledge. (I must read the Bible and learn of Jesus simple truths and ways. His ways are higher than mine). "And to knowledge temperance, and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness;" (you see after conversion and sanctification there are many rounds of the ladder yet to climb). "And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity." All these things are important to Christian living. Verse 8 "For if these things be in you, and abound they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ." This doesn't say we will advance to great heights politically, socially or financially. We will be in high esteem in the

knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ and He is to rule the world in righteousness. So we can be important in His Kingdom.

Back to verses 2 and 3. We can have grace and peace multiplied to us again through the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord. That is much better than if added by an eye dropper. Instead of one drop we get a cup full. Verse 3 is especially precious - "According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue."

You see Jesus purchased a complete plan for the human-spirit, soul and body. Hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness. Praise God. How wonderful are His doings and His ways past finding out. I can live an overcoming life here on this earth through Jesus Christ my Lord.

By adding, as verses 5, 6, and 7 admonish, I can be assured that I can abound and not be barren and unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Let us look at the other side — verse 9 "But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins." God always shows the possibility of the good and the bad. We have to choose.

The admonition again in verse 10. "Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure." I am persuaded more and more this is an individual race. You cannot run with the crowd unless there is a crowd running an individual race. Let us see in closing what is the reward to the overcomer.

"For if ye do these things, ye shall never fall: For so an entrance shall be ministered unto you abundantly into the everlasting Kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

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## THE SABBATH

The Sabbath was of divine institution and is shown to be so in scriptures where ceasing to create is called "resting." Let us read where it is first recorded of God resting. "And God blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it He rested from all His work which God created and made." Genesis 2:3. Then we can turn to the New Testament where the writer of Hebrews, in 4:4, refers to the same scripture. The Sabbath though, as such, was instituted at the time of Moses when they were to gather manna from day to day. "And it came to pass, that on the sixth day they gathered twice as much bread, two omers for one man: and all the rulers of the congregation came and told Moses. And He said unto them. This is that which the Lord hath said. Tomorrow is the rest of the holy sabbath unto the Lord: bake that which ye will bake today, and seethe that which ye will seethe; and that which remaineth over lay up for you to be kept until the morning. And they laid it up till the morning, - And Moses said, Eat that today; for today is a sabbath unto the Lord: today ye will not find it in the field." Exodus 16:22-25. This seems to be the first institution of the day, as one given to and to be kept by the children of Israel. Grotius gives the opinion that the day may have already been known and may have, in a measure, been kept as holy but that the rule to abstain from work was given then.

When God gave the ten commandments to Moses, the fourth one says, "Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy." Exodus 20:8. But to keep this commandment wholly unto God the people of Israel had to also look at other parts of the law. Exodus 31:15 says, "Six days may work be done; but in the seventh is the sabbath of rest, holy to the Lord: whosoever doeth any work in the sabbath day, shall surely be put to death." Then we read in Exodus 35:3 that no fire could be kindled. This would mean no fire for cooking on the day of rest. Acts 1:12 records the words "a sabbath day's journey." Though the distance is not called by that title in the Old Testament but it was approximately three-fifths of a mile. It is supposed to have been founded on the command, "See, for that the Lord hath given you the sabbath, therefore he giveth you on the sixth day the bread of two days; abide ye every man in his place, let no man go out of his place on the seventh day." Exodus 16:29. The measure of distance was fixed by the Jewish legislators at 2,000 cubits; supposed to have been suggested by the space between the people and the ark of God. "And they commanded the people, saying, When ye see the ark of the covenant of the Lord your God, and the priests and the Levites bearing it, then ye shall remove from your place, and go after it. Yet there shall be a space between you and it, about two thousand cubits by measure: -" Joshua 3:3-4. When we put all of this together we understand that keeping the seventh day was more than just keeping a day of rest and worship but they must also keep the restrictions that went with that commandment. In Galatians 5:3 Paul says, "For I testify again to every man that is circumcised, that he is a debtor to do the whole law." Paul has repeatedly told them that anyone taking up any part of the law (in this case it was the circumcision) is obligated to keep all the law.

Galatians 3:10 reads, "For as many as are of the works of the law are under the curse; for it is written, Cursed is everyone that continueth not in all things which are written in the book of the law to do them." Here Paul is pointing to the limitations of the law. In this verse the emphasis is not in doing or keeping the law but is in the essence of legalism. A person who keeps the law is a product of that law and his character comes out of his obedience to the law by which he lives. But no law can save a person's soul. No one is justified by law. Paul said as he continues in Galatians 3:11-14, "But that no man is justified by the law in the sight of God, it is evident: for, The just shall live by faith. And the law is not of faith: but. The man that doeth them shall live in them. Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed is every one that hangeth on a tree: That the blessing of Abraham might come on the Gentiles through Jesus Christ; that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith." The way of the law and the way of faith are direct opposites. There is no middle ground. A person lives by one or the other and cannot combine the two. We read again in Galatians 3:24-25, "Wherefore the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ, that we might be justified by faith. But after that faith is come, we are no longer under a schoolmaster." The term schoolmaster really means custodian or guide and referred to the man, usually a slave, whose duty it was to conduct a boy to and from school and to superintend his conduct in general while the boy was in his custody. He was not a teacher. Paul describes a person under the law as that of a minor child under the supervision of a slave attendant.

When Jesus came no doubt many of His hearers thought He was revolutionary in His teaching and perhaps they may have been like the Epicureans when they wanted to hear the new doctrine Paul was preaching, Acts 17:18-21. But Jesus said, "Think not that I am come to destroy the law, or the prophets: I am not come to destroy, but to fulfill." Matthew 5:17. In this very meaningful declaration Jesus indicated His relationship to the Old Testament. He was to fulfill all its commands, its promises, its prophecies and its symbols. What happened to the law? Jesus did not destroy nor violate it nor did He come to dissolve the connecting reference to the good things it promised. But He came to complete or fill it up. In itself it was only a shadow and He added to it that which was necessary to make it perfect by giving Himself, the perfect sacrifice, without which the law could neither satisfy God or sanctify man. That was the beginning of the new covenant. The writer of Hebrews refers to the prophecy in Jeremiah 31:31-33 when he writes, "For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, saith the Lord; I will put my laws in their mind, and write them in their hearts; and I will be to them a God, and they shall be to me a people." Hebrews 8:10.

In Jesus' completion of the Mosaical law and bringing into effect the grace dispensation, many things had to be amended, or changed. The Jews supposed their access to God through the temple worship was the high-water mark of possibilities. But the writer of Hebrews says, "If therefore perfection were by the Levitical priesthood, (for under it the people received the law), what further need was there that another priest should rise after the order of Melchisedec, and not be called after the order of Aaron? For the priesthood being changed, there is made of necessity a change also of the law. For He of whom these things are spoken pertainth to another tribe, of which no man gave attendance at the altar." God made the Aaronic priesthood

obsolete or out-dated the system of the law by which the Aaronic priesthood received its authority. Throughout the book of Hebrews we find comparisons between the Mosacial law and the dispensation under the law of grace. The new covenant brings that reformation of something better, a new and living way.

Now that we have seen that the keeping of the sabbath belonged to the Mosaical law also that the coming of Jesus fulfilled that law, let us look at that fulfillment. We all know the story of the first passover. It was a tremendous event which will be remembered for all time. The blood of a lamb sprinkled on the door posts of the houses of the Israelites was a sign for the death angel to see and pass over their houses. This offering of a lamb was to become an annual event as a reminder of their great deliverance, not only from the death of their first born that night but also of their deliverance from Egypt. Only in Christ could this ordinance be truly fulfilled. Leviticus 17:11 says, "For the life of the flesh is in the blood: and I have given it to you upon the altar to make an atonement for your souls: for it is the blood that maketh an atonement for the soul." Then in Hebrews 9:22 we read, "And almost all things are by the law purged with blood; and without shedding of blood is no remission." But we need also to read Hebrews 10:3-9, "But in those sacrifices there is a rememberance again made of sins every year. For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and of goats should take away sins. Wherefore when He cometh into the world, He saith, Sacrifice and offering thou wouldst not, but a body hast thou prepared me: In burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin thou hast had no pleasure. Then said I, Lo, I come (in the volume of the book it is written of me), to do thy will, O God. Above when He said, Sacrifice and offering and burnt offerings and offering for sin thou wouldst not, neither hadst pleasure therein; which are offered by the law; Then said He, Lo I come to do thy will, O God. He taketh away the first, that He may establish the second."

Since God first made the promise of a Saviour to Adam and Eve He had been preparing the way for that Saviour to come. Then He sent John the Baptist "preaching the baptism of repentance for the remission of sins" Luke 3:3. One day as He was preaching he saw Jesus and said, "Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world." John 1:29b. After Jesus preached for three and one-half years, He was nearing the time when He must be crucified to complete that plan made so many years ago for a Saviour for mankind.

It was time for the preparation of the passover and, "The first day of the feast of unleavened bread the disciples came to Jesus, saying, unto Him, Where wilt thou that we prepare for thee to eat the passover? And He said, Go into the city to such a man, and say unto him, The Master saith, My time is at hand; I will keep the passover at thy house with my disciples. And the disciples did as Jesus had appointed them; and they made ready the passover. Now when the even was come, He sat down with the twelve. -And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed it. and brake it, and gave it to the disciples, and said, take, eat; this is my body. And He took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of it; for this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins." Matthew 26:17-20, 26-28. At this time Jesus instituted the ordinance which we call the Communion. It takes the place of the passover. After Jesus had this first Communion service with His disciples, and after that night of trial first before the sanhedrin and

priests, then before Pilate, they led Him away to be crucified. The only Lamb of God hung on the cross during the time the priests were killing the sacrifical lambs. When His suffering for the redemption of man was completed Jesus said, "It is finished." John 19:30. God's plan for the salvation of man was completed. Man had not only been created by God but he has now been purchased by the blood of the Lamb of God. When Jesus said, "It is finished," He was not only meaning the completion of His suffering but He also completed the dispensation of the Mosaical law and the law of grace had come.

Then came the resurrection and the hope of life beyond the grave. Jesus had said to Martha, "I am the resurrection and the life: he that believeth in Me, though he were dead, yet shall he live." John 11:25. Then later when talking to his disciples He said, "—because I live, ye shall live also." John 14:19c. But through all the sorrow and disappointment at the time of Jesus' death and burial, His followers failed to remember these promises. "Now upon the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they came unto the sepulchre, bringing the spices which they had prepared, and certain others with them. And they found the stone rolled away from the sepulchre. And they entered in, and found not the body of the Lord Jesus. And it came to pass, as they were much perplexed thereabout, behold, two men stood by them in shining garments; and as they were afraid and bowed down their faces to the earth, they said unto them, Why seek ye the living among the dead? He is not here, but is risen." Luke 24:1-6a. All four of the Gospels give this same account and all say it was the morning of the first day of the week. Imagine the joy among His followers as "He lives" was quickly told among them. It was a day never to be forgotten. The natural thing to do was to declare it "The Lord's Day" and make it a holy day. The early church fathers did just that. This day of grace marks the beginning of the week with a day of privilege, whereas the Sabbath came at the end of the week of labor, an order expected under the law.

Because of the privilege we have to serve a resurrected Christ, we give Him first place in our thoughts, our worship, our lives and our time by not holding to the last day of the week but giving Him the first day. The sabbath under the law has been replaced by the first day of the week by our Lord's resurrection.





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
