• Following flag salute and welcoming 3 guests, we thanked those wearing club hats, shirts and badge sashes. Announcements included the Sept 16th picnic at the Union Street Library park and an invitation to assist Mrs. Trumbo at the Fair on Wed afternoon-evening Aug 22 representing the Jr. Club.

• Kevin volunteered to fill a display case at the fair.

• Thank you cards were signed by students addressed to Steve Shoemaker and Mickee Madden for recent donations.

• 4 or 5 door prizes were given followed by Show-N-Tell by Ezra Joy, Sawyer and Arthur. Mineral of the Month reports were written and read by: Ezra, Sage, Sawyer and Lorelei.

# **Junior Mineral Reports**

#### Heulandite by Ezra, age 8

Heulandite is from the zedlite group. It is found in Ahned-Nagar and crystalizes in the form of the tabular, trapezoid, as well in forms of granular. It is found in India mostly, and some forms come in red, yellow, black, and peach.

#### Chalcedony by Sage, age 7

Chalcedony is a catch all term that includes many well-known varieties of cryptocrystalline form of silica quartz. They are found in all 50 states, in many colors and color combinations, and in sedimentary, igneous, and metamorphic rock.

There are many varieties of chalcedony and depending on who is classifying it can include agate, carnelian, aventur-ine, chrysoprase and others. Because it is common and decorative, it has historically been widely used to make jewelry, weapons, adornments for clothing, tools and other useful items. #### Tiger's Eye by Sawyer, age 9

Tiger's eye (also called tiger eye) is a chatoyant gemstone and is usually a metamorphic rock. It has a golden to red brown color. And it also has a silky luster.


Tiger iron, which is another name for this mineral, is mined primarily in South Africa and Western Australia. The specific gravity ranges from 2.64 and 2.71.

The trade name of pietersite is used for a fractured or brecciated chalcedony containing amphibole fibers and premoted tigers eye. It is mostly found in Namibia & China. Sources: Wikipedia and <u>mindat.org</u>


#### Apophylite by Lorelei, age 11

Apophylite can be very pretty it is shiny and clear and can get very big. Its name comes from the greek words "apo" -to be off, and "phyllos" -leaf because it flakes off like a leaf. It can be found around the world in volcanic places.

Apophylite is very common and easily mined so very cheap to get. It was originally thought to be one mineral but it's really a mix beween flourine and hydroxl. Info. found at <u>minerals.net</u>



#### **Rockhounds "Rock" with "Libraries Rock"**

On June 21 Andy Johnson and Judi Allison spent time with a group of children and their parents at the Burbank Library. The presentation went along with the library's summer theme of "Libraries Rock." Children learned about the three types of rocks with hands-on experiences. First, they "created" an igneous rock by adding quartz, feldspar, hornblende and biotite to a bowl, "stirring it all together" to create granite. They then layered playdough to give an understanding of sedimentation and the formation of sedimentary rocks. Their final task was to "morph" the layers of playdough using heat and pressure from their hands to create a metamorphic rock.

Thanks to the generosity of Steve Shoemaker, each participant received a sample of each of the three rock types. They also took home agates and obsidian needles donated by Andy. It appeared a good learning session was had by all, including the library staff, as they kept sneaking away from their posts to watch the presentation.

#### Wire Jewelry Classes

Kathy Meuchel of Kitty Kat, Handmade Wire Jewelry, will be presenting classes September 21st, 22nd and 23<sup>rd</sup>. Three different jewelry projects will be offered over the 3 day period with one project being taught each day and 2 classes available per day. Classes start at 9 am and 1 pm each day. The cost of the class is \$35 for each pendant and \$40 for the bracelet. All jewelry projects will be made with silver. Openings are still available. Friday, we will learn to make the star pendant. Saturday, the heart pendant will be taught and Sunday the bracelet. The price will include all the wire and other materials, we bring our tools.

The bracelet introduces us to chasing. For it you will need a bench block and chasing hammer. Bench block can be any small flat metal block but the surface must be smooth so as not to mar the wire we are working. These items can be purchased on Amazon.


Round nose pliers, flat nose pliers, chain nose pliers and a good pair of cutters will also be needed. The club has some tools available but not enough for everyone.
