In the 2nd biggest upset of the college football season so far (Kansas St +28 vs Oklahoma), Michigan St beat rival Michigan 27-24 as 21.5-point underdogs. MSU HC Mel Tucker became just the second coach to beat Michigan in his first attempt with the Spartans, joining Alabama coach Nick Saban, who did it in 1995.

Misleading Finals

Fresno St (+2.5) upset Colorado St 38-17. However, Fresno only had a 432-372 yard edge as Colorado St was stopped on downs 3 times inside Fresno's 35-yard line in the second half.

Tulsa (-17) beat East Carolina 34-30. However, ECU had 27-25 first down and 456-428 yard edges. Tulsa scored a go-ahead touchdown came with 29 seconds left. Their 11-play, 75-yard final drive was aided by two questionable replays — a fumble that was overturned and a fourth-down catch that appeared to hit the ground.

Virginia Tech (-5) beat Louisville 42-35. However, Louisville had 23-21 first down and 548-466 yard edges but were -3 in TO's.

SMU (-13) beat Navy 51-37. SMU had a 555-430 yard edge and actually out-rushed Navy 255-191. SMU led 51-17 in the 4Q as Navy scored the game's final 20 points getting 214 yards on their last 3 possessions.

Texas (+3.5) upset No. 6 Oklahoma St 41-34 in OT. However, in the **biggest misleading final of the week** Oklahoma St had dominant 32-17 first down and 530-287 yard edges. Oklahoma St was -4 in TO's and Texas scored 13 points off 3 TO's in the first half on just 17 total yards of offense. Texas also got a 100-yard kickoff return TD and scored a TD late in the 4Q on 4th&7.

Louisiana Tech (+13) upset UAB. However, UAB had a 485-381 yard edge including 338-49 on the ground but were -2 in TO's. UAB led 31-17 late 3Q.

Appalachian St (-28.5) failed to cover vs UL-Monroe. However, App St had a 480-222 yard edge including 328-68 on the ground. ULM scored a 15-yard TD on the final play of the game!

The worst beat of all time...that got over-turned!

We had a best bet on these pages last week on **Indiana (-10) over Rutgers**. The Hoosiers were bet up during the week to as high as 13-point favorites. Indiana led 37-15 late 4Q but Rutgers scored a TD and then recovered the onside kick. Then on 4th&32, in one of the wildest plays in CFB history (8 laterals), the Scarlet Knights scored a TD to get the back-door. However, the TD was called back after a close review that showed one of the laterals was an illegal forward pass.

Wednesday, November 4th

Ball St 28 MIAMI, OH 27. MACtion finally gets started here. If you're surprised the defending MAC champs are only laying 2 at home here...don't be! Remember last year, Miami was a very fortunate team that actually got out-gained by 73 ypg, out-scored by 4 ppg and were -0.3 ypp. Meanwhile, Ball St was a hard luck 5-7 team that out-gained their opponents by 38 ypg, outscored them by 3 ppg and were also +0.3 ypp. Also noteworthy is Miami is going to be missing several starters who opted out and are hurt.

KENT ST 33 Eastern Michigan 30. On paper, Kent St looks to be in good shape this season thanks to the return of QB Dustin Crum who completed 69% of his passes with a 20-to-2 TD-to-INT ratio while also leading the Golden Flashes in rushing with 707 yards. On the other side, the Eagles have to replace QB Mike Glass who set the EMU single-season record for total offense (3,597 yards). Preston Hutchinson will likely be the replacement as he got a start vs Western Michigan last year and was impressive (31 of 36 for 357 yards and 3 TD's). Remember when the Eagles play away from home in the underdog role, they are on a current 18-2-1 ATS run.

Western Michigan 35 AKRON 18. Akron enters 2020 on a nation-long 17-game losing streak. Year one under head coach Tom Arth set records for all the wrong reasons as the Zips became the first team ever to start a season 0-10 ATS (finished 1-11). Akron had the worst offense in college football. However, they should be improved this year with 15 starters. Meanwhile, WMU has a lot of question marks. First, they lose QB Jon Wassink who was a multiple-year starter. Kaleb Eleby, who redshirted last season, is the likely replacement. The Broncos also lose 1st-team All-MAC RB LeVante Bellamy. We don't feel like laying 18 on the road here but note Akron is just 3-21-1 ATS as home dog!

TOLEDO 40 Bowling Green 20. BG's outright win over Toledo last season was the biggest upset in BG history! The Falcons were 26.5-point underdogs! However, no program has fallen more in the last 5 years than Bowling Green. Coming off 3 straight MAC East titles (2013-15), they are just 12-36 straight up and a nation-worst 14-33-1 ATS. They will field one of the youngest rosters in CFB this year. Meanwhile, the Rockets have not had a losing season in 10 years. However, after the shocking loss to BG last year, Toledo went 0-6-1 ATS in their last 7 games failing to cover the spread by a combined 123 points or 17.6 ppg! They also failed to get invited to a bowl game at 6-6! This year head coach Jason Candle shook up his coaching staff, the Rockets return 14 starters and should be improved. However, we think this is too many points to lay in a rivalry game.

Buffalo 32 NORTHERN ILLINOIS 20. Last year, the Bulls closed the season strong winning six of their last seven games all by 19 points or more with a huge blow lead at Kent St being the only setback. This year's team could be just as good thanks to the return of 15 starters. RB's Jaret Patterson and Kevin Marks return after combining for 2,834 rushing yards and 27 TD's last year. On the other side, after a rare losing season in 2019, it doesn't look like the Huskies will be much improved in 2020. NIU does bring back QB Ross Bowers (Cal transfer) who threw for 2,130 yards here last year but had a 7-to-8 TD-to-INT ratio. Quite troublesome was several starters opting to transfer this off-season. We think Buffalo easily wins but note Northern Illinois is 11-0 SU (+23.6 ppg) and 8-3 ATS (+7.8 ppg) in the series. Also Northern Illinois is in their largest home underdog role since 1998 and the Huskies are on a 12-2-1 ATS (+8.8 ppg) run as a home dog since 2001.

Ohio 30 CENTRAL MICHIGAN 28. Ohio hasn't had a losing season since 2008. With 113 wins at Ohio, head coach Frank Solich is the MAC's winningest football coach in history. Yet, the Bobcats remarkably haven't won a MAC title since 1968. Gone is 3-year starting QB Nathan Rourke who in his career threw for 7,454 yards, 60 TD's and added 2,639 rushing yards and 49 rushing TD's (school records for total yards and total TD's). On the other side, the Chippewas were one of the most improved teams in the country last year winning eight games and earning a MAC West championship. This year's team could be just as good thanks to the return of 14 starters. However, there is a major question mark at QB. Quinten Dormady departs after throwing for 2,312 yards (64.9%). Also David Moore tested positive for a banned substance in the middle of last season and his appeal was denied in March. He will miss the first five games of this season. Early money has seen Ohio flipped to favorite. We agree but don't see much value at the current number.

Thursday, November 5th
Wyoming 27 COLORADO ST 24. Last week, we won with a Wyoming UNDER on these pages as they crushed Hawaii 31-7. Wyoming had 24-12 first down and 393-233 yard edges including 281-123 on the ground. Now they face a Colorado St team that lost by 21 to Fresno St in their opener. It wasn't as bad as the final with Fresno only having a 432-372 yard edge. Colorado St was stopped on downs 3 times inside Fresno's 35-yard line in the second half. It was a surprise that QB Todd Centeio started (O'Brien missed practice time). This is a big rivalry and Wyoming has won and covered 4 straight in the Border War. They win again here, but not sure we want to lay "the hook".

NEVADA 35 Utah St 21. Nevada has been impressive this year. Last week they beat arch rival UNLV 37-19 as they had a 497-348 yard edge. QB Carson Strong threw for 350 yards and has a 6-0 ratio on the year. The same can't be said for Utah St as they have been crushed in both games so far (albeit vs MWC powers Boise St and San Diego St). Last week QB's Jason Shelley and Andrew Peasley combined for only 3.6 pass yards per attempt in a 38-7 loss. Not sure anyone will want to bet Utah St here but we think this point-spread is inflated.

Friday, November 6th
Miami, FL 35 NC STATE 24. Both teams come in off a bye. The Hurricanes are 5-1 and have outscored opponents by 11 ppg but are only +22 ypg thanks to the Clemson destruction (-340 yards). Still, we upgraded them 5 points in our power ratings. Meanwhile, NC State is 4-2 but has been outscored and outgained on the season. They're playing without QB Devin Leary who was by far their best option at the position. Line looks about right.

SAN DIEGO ST 29 San Jose St 18. We'll admit we weren't big fans of the Brady Hoke hire but the Aztecs have certainly looked the part so far at 2-0 SU/ATS. After dismantling UNLV, they crushed Utah St last week as they had 30-11 first down and 570-215 yard edges including 407-103 on the ground. They are taking on a surprising San Jose St team that is 2-0 for the first time since 1987. Last week QB Nick Starkel was 34 of 47 for 467 yards and a 5-0 ratio! San Diego St is on a 7-0 SU (+22 ppg) and 6-1 ATS (+9.8 ppg) run in the series.

Byu 30 BOISE ST 28. Arguably the toughest game on BYU's schedule. The Cougars have been very impressive this season at 7-0 SU and 5-1-1 ATS. They're outscoring their opponents by 31 ppg and are +246 ypg. They're taking on a Boise St team that is 2-0 SU/ATS this year. Last week QB Jack Sears, filling in for Hank Bachmeier was 17 of 20 for 280 yards and 3 TD's in the 49-30 win over Air Force. However, Air Force had 28-23 first down and 484-459 yard edges including 415-179 on the ground. Please note that BYU is very limited in practice this week. They're already on a short week and traveling. They don't practice on Sundays for religious reasons and no teams practiced on Tuesday this week due to the election. We'll sit this one out for now but would be interested in taking Boise St at +3.5.

Saturday, November 7th
Smu 38 TEMPLE 21. If you're wondering why this line is so steep...it's not just because of Temple getting crushed by Tulane last week...it's also not because QB Anthony Russo will again be out for this game...it's basically what Temple head coach Rod Carey Temple said about his COVID-depleted roster as the Owls had a linebacker and a kicker practicing Monday as scout-team cornerbacks. "Everybody with a helmet and pads is fair game." Our numbers say Temple is the play but we have no idea how many of their players will be out. Pass.

ARMY 22 Air Force 17. Let's start with the obvious...36-9-1! That's the UNDER record for games between service academy teams since 2005. This week's total between Air Force and Army is 40.5. You have to wonder about Air Force as the season progresses as they are depth-shy. Last week, they did have 28-23 first down and 484-459 yard edges including 415-179 on the ground vs Boise. Meanwhile, Army is off a bye and 6-1 on the season outscoring opponents by 22 ppg. The problem...they haven't played anyone besides Cincinnati. Three FCS teams and two really bad FBS teams in ULM and Middle Tennessee have dotted their schedule. Air Force is easily the 2nd best team they've played.

Tulane 33 EAST CAROLINA 28. Last week Tulane dominated Temple with 28-11 first down and 504-222 yard edges including 284-77 on the ground. Tulane easily won and covered despite a -2 TO deficit. On the other side, ECU was robbed against Tulsa in a 34-30 last second loss. Tulsa's final drive was aided by two questionable replays — a fumble that was overturned and a fourth-down catch that appeared to hit the ground. ECU QB Holton Ahlers, who missed the Navy game because of COVID-19 protocols, completed 38 of 50 passes for 330 yards and 3 TD's. Both teams could be "play-on" teams down the stretch but we don't much value here.

FLORIDA ST 28 Pitt 26. Both teams come in off a bye. Prior to the bye, Pitt was crushed by ND as we had our worst pick of the season on these pages backing them. Pitt saw their safety Paris Ford opt out of the season and QB Kenny Pickett probably won't play here for the Panthers who come in on a 4-game losing streak. After a big win over North Carolina, the Noles came back to Earth in a blowout loss to Louisville. Again, this game is right on our power rating but we do lean OVER.

COASTAL CAROLINA 35 South Alabama 21. Coastal comes in unbeaten and the Chanticleers got a statement win beating Georgia St 51-0 last week. Coastal dominated with 30-5 first down and 530-106 yard edges and QB Grayson McCall returned from injury and was 18 of 24 for 254 yards and 4 TD's! They're taking on a solid South Alabama team that lost in the final minute at Georgia Southern. Coastal is 5-1 ATS this year covering by an average of 19 ppg (No. 1 in the country) but now we think you're paying a premium if you want to back them. We lean USA.

VIRGINIA TECH 41 Liberty 24. Liberty comes in unbeaten and ranked for the first time in school history. This is also probably their biggest game in school history. Their outstanding QB Malik Willis leads the way as he has thrown for 1,122 yards (67%) with a 9-1 ratio while also rushing for 495 yards (7.0) and 6 TD's. He's taking on a leaky VT defense allowing 464 ypg and 31 ppg. Last week the Hokies benefitted from +3 in TO's vs Louisville. The problem in backing Liberty here is the Flames haven't a single team in the Top 105 of our power ratings this season. Safe to say they are taking a major step up in class here.

GEORGIA SOUTHERN 27 Troy 26. Surprised to see all the money come in on Troy here but it is the 2nd week in a row money has come in against Georgia Southern. That money was wrong last week as GS did win and cover vs South Alabama. However, one of the more impressive performances of last week was Troy crushing Arkansas St with a backup QB. Jacob Free in his first start was 33 of 45 for 419 yards and a 2-0 ratio for the Trojans and it looks like Free could go again here. Troy has won 3 straight in the series but we'll stick by our ratings and back GS.

CINCINNATI 34 Houston 23. At the Group of 5 level, it doesn't get much better than what Cincinnati has done in the last two weeks. After crushing a good SMU team, we backed the Bearcats on these pages last week and they crushed Memphis 49-10. Cincy had a 242-5 rushing yard edge. On the other side, Houston proved no match for UCF in a 44-21 loss. Now they could be without one of their top players in WR Marquez Stevenson. We think Cincy wins by double-digits but how many times can you deliver "A+" performances in a row?

GEORGIA ST 37 UL-Monroe 21. There's no question ULM is one of the worst teams in the country. While they got a cover last week, App St had a 480-222 yard edge including 328-68 on the ground. ULM scored a 15-yard TD on the final play of the game! Meanwhile, Georgia St didn't score a TD at all in their embarrassing 51-0 loss to Coastal Carolina. Georgia St coach Shawn Elliott said, "It's going to take some soul searching. From the opening play, it was a disappointing day for our coaching staff, our players and everyone involved, and it's unacceptable. I don't think we can take anything away from it. We were consistently bad in all three phases of the game and it showed." We think they get a big bounce back effort here **VIRGINIA 32 Louisville 31.** Classic "inside-out" handicap. Virginia upset North Carolina last week but NC had a 536-418 yard edge and averaged 15.8 yards per pass! Kudos for Mendenhall going for it late, they had no shot of stopping the NC offense. Meanwhile, the TO bug got Louisville again as the Cards had 23-21 first down and 548-466 yard edges but were -3 in TO's in a 7-point loss to Virginia Tech. About three hours before kickoff last week, Louisville announced nine players would be unavailable (COVID). That included leading solo tackler Monty Montgomery, starting free safety Isaiah Hayes and three of the Cardinals top four defensive ends - Yaya Diaby, Tabarius Peterson and Dayna Kinnaird. That prevents us from picking the outright upset here.

Boston College 35 SYRACUSE 19. BC continues to show they are one of the most improved teams in the country this year. Last week they blew a 18-point lead at Clemson but still easily covered as 26.5-point underdogs. Despite the loss, first-year Eagles coach Jeff Hafley was proud of his players belief and confidence they could compete with anyone. "We took it to the No. 1 team in the country," Hafley said. We think they will take it to a depth-shy Syracuse team that was crushed by Wake Forest last week. However, we can't make it a play though as we question BC's focus off Clemson and with ND on deck.

North Carolina 37 DUKE 26. North Carolina looks the part talent wise on offense but the Tar Heels remain inconsistent in year two under Mack Brown. Last week they lost outright as a TD-plus favorite for the 2nd time this season. Still, they had a 536-418 yard edge and averaged 15.8 yards per pass in the 44-41 loss at Virginia. On the other side, Duke had their best performance of the season in a blowout win over Charlotte. Duke ran for 274 yards and 6 TD's and they had a 7.9-4.0 yards per play edge. Our power ratings are right near the line here.

Tulsa 34 NAVY 24. Both teams were worse than their final scores indicated last week. First, Tulsa benefitted from several questionable calls in their come-from-behind last second win over East Carolina. Meanwhile, Navy trailed SMU 51-17 in the 4Q but scored 20 straight points. Three different Navy QB's combined for 30 pass attempts and 239 yards and it was just the second time in 19 years the Midshipmen have reached 30 passes in a game. Navy has thrown for at least 200 yards in consecutive games for the first time in at least 20 years. We don't consider that to be a positive development for them.

Michigan 28 INDIANA 24. Obviously, you have a Michigan team off an historic upset loss as 21.5-point favorites to Michigan St last week. It was arguably the worst loss of the Harbaugh era and we expect a bounce back. Meanwhile, you have Indiana riding high at 2-0 in Big Ten play for the first time since 1991. We won with the Hoosiers last week on these pages (see page 1 for details) but we're not going to back them again here. Michigan has beat Indiana 24 straight times (13-10-1 ATS) dating back to 1988. The Wolverines have been favored in all 24 of those meetings. However, this week the Wolverines are only 3-point road favorites. That's their shortest spread EVER vs the Hoosiers (dating back to 1980)!

OHIO ST 54 Rutgers 12. It's only been two games but the Buckeyes are living up to our preseason No. 1 rating. Last week in their likely toughest game of the regular season Ohio St had a 526-325 yard edge including 208-44 on the ground vs Penn St. QB Justin Fields was 28 of 34 for 318 yards and 4 TD's. They're taking on a Rutgers team that nearly got a miracle cover vs us last week. Obviously, Greg Schiano was on the staff at Ohio St so there will be some familiarity. Yes, Rutgers is much improved but we think the market continues to give too much respect.

PENN ST 45 Maryland 20. The question here is what is Penn St's mindset after starting the season 0-2. There will be no Big Ten champ, no playoffs and likely no major bowl. They're taking on a Maryland team that had a 675-451 yard edge in a thrilling OT win over Minnesota last week. Never in school history had Maryland won after trailing by 17 points in the fourth quarter but got the win due to a missed extra point in OT for the Gophers. QB Tagovailoa went 26 for 35 for 394 yards and three touchdowns in his second college start. With motivation a question mark, we can't back the Nittany Lions as a big favorite.

IOWA ST 32 Baylor 20. Baylor trailed TCU 30-0 at one point last week before rallying to make the final more respectable. We just think it's going to be a rebuilding season for them with a new coach, an inexperienced defense and now issues at RB. Meanwhile, Iowa St got the cover vs Kansas late. Iowa St RB Breece Hall ran for 185 yards and 2 TD's and is having a great season. Iowa St is just not a team we want to consistently lay big numbers with.

Minnesota 35 ILLINOIS 26. The Gophers are 0-2 and in desperate need of a win. Last week they blew a 38-21 lead in a shocking OT loss to Maryland as their defense is really struggling. Meanwhile, Illinois is also 0-2 but could be down to a 4th string QB here. Last week, Illini starting QB Brandon Peters was announced as a scratch shortly before kickoff after testing positive for COVID-19. Peters' backup, Isaiah Washington, also missed the game due to contact-tracing protocols. 3rd string QB Matt Robinson got hurt early in the game and 4th string QB Coran Taylor was 17 of 29 for 273 yards and a 2-2 ratio. In all, 12 Illinois players were scratched and they likely won't be back here. We lean Minny.

2★ IOWA 30 Michigan St 17. We think Iowa is underrated. They're 0-2 on the season but have lost the two games by a combined 5 points despite the fact they are +47 ypg. They've held late leads but just haven't been able to hold on. Last week QB Spencer Petras threw 3 INT's but two were deflected. Meanwhile, we don't mind fading Michigan St off a big outright upset win over their arch rival Michigan. Let's talk line value by comparing recent spreads. Michigan St was getting 3 TD's at Michigan last week and now only 1 TD here. On a neutral field, wouldn't you have a really big bet on Iowa +14 vs Michigan? We would!

The Purdue/Wisconsin game has been cancelled due to COVID issues at Wisky. UCLA 31 COLORADO 27. Welcome to the 2020 season Pac-12 conference! This is a matchup of two teams that we are going to take a "wait and see" approach. Obviously, the Chip Kelly era at UCLA has been a big disappointment but this is Year 3 and the Bruins return QB Dorian Thompson-Robinson. On the other side, Colorado has a new coach in Karl Dorrell who coached at UCLA from 2003-2007. The Buffs lost a 3-year starter at QB in Steven Montez. They're going to go with Senior Sam Noyer at QB. Our power ratings are very strong on Colorado here but we're a little hesitant backing a first-year coach this season..

UTAH 36 Arizona 20. Another game in the Pac-12 with more questions than answers. Utah after an historic regular season where they went 11-1 and were a legit threat at making the CFB playoff, got whipped in each of their last two games and now have one of the least experienced teams with only 9 starters back. Cameron Rising or South Carolina transfer Jake Bentley will battle to replace QB Brett Tyler Huntley. Arizona has had back-to-back losing seasons under head coach Kevin Sumlin. The Wildcats had three starters opt out and this doesn't look like it will be any better. Our power ratings are strong on Utah here but again we don't want to lay 2 TD's in an opener with an inexperienced team.

USC 33 Arizona St 23. USC is the favorite in the Pac-12 South thanks to the return of 16 starters led by QB Kedon Slovis who is now healthy. The Trojans only had a couple of opt outs unlike some of the other teams in the conference who were hit harder (Oregon, Washington, Stanford). USC has won and covered 4 of the last 5 meetings but it is very tough to get margin on Arizona St under head coach Herm Edwards. Only once have the Sun Devils lost by more than 11 points under him (21-3 at Utah last year). They return QB Jaylon Daniels who had a solid 17-to-2 TD-to-INT ratio. A 9:00am PT local start time in an empty Coliseum. We'd prefer to take the dog in those circumstances.

OREGON 33 Stanford 20. Primetime ABC game. The defending Rose Bowl champs Ducks were going to be the overwhelming favorite to win the Pac-12 this year even after losing QB Justin Herbert. However, All-American LT Penei Sewell, CB Thomas Graham and SS Brady Breeze were among a few who chose to opt out. Tyler Shough will be Herbert's replacement but the Ducks have ZERO returning starters on the offensive line. After the worst Stanford season in more than a decade, the Cardinal were expected to much improved this year. However, they've seen LT Walker Little and CB Paulson Adebayo opt out. Davis Mills is back at QB. Since 1980 the two teams are dead even at 18-18 SU and 18-18 ATS. Lean Ducks.

1★ OREGON ST 34 Washington St 30. Oregon St HC Jonathan Smith is quietly building the Beavers back to respectability and last year they just missed out on bowl with a 54-53 loss to Wazzu being the difference. They do lose QB Jake Luton and their top rusher and top receiver but pretty much everyone else returns for them. QB Tristan Gebbia did start the Oregon game last year and should be a capable replacement. On the other side, Washington St has a new head coach in Nick Rolovich and new schemes in a COVID year which isn't ideal. They will be starting a true freshman at QB in Jayden De Laura and have seen a few players opt out.

Fresno St 33 UNLV 21. Fresno St QB Jake Haener had 311 yards passing and three TD's in the Bulldogs first win under head coach Kalen DeBoer last week. They beat Colorado St 38-17. Meanwhile, the Rebels are still looking for that first win under Marcus Arroyo as they are 0-2 SU/ATS and lost to rival Nevada 37-19 last week. Despite the non-cover, UNLV looked improved. QB Max Gilliam threw for 207 yards and 2 TD's and RB Charles Williams ran for 99. It does look like they will go to the future and TCU transfer Justin Rogers here at QB. Slight lean on Fresno here.

Washington 23 CALIFORNIA 22. Cal has gotten the better of Washington each of the last two years as the Bears won 12-10 as 12-point underdogs in 2018 and won 20-19 as 13.5-point underdogs last year. Maybe that is the reason they've flipped to favorite here as a lot of respected insiders feel Cal could be a sleeper. They return 17 starters and should be better at QB as long as Chase Garbers stays healthy (7-0 with him last year when played the full game). Meanwhile, Washington has a new head coach in Jimmy Lake who has been the D.C. here the last couple of years. He has big shoes to fill in Chris Petersen and the Huskies only have 10 returning starters after a couple of opt outs. We look for a low scoring game to go down to the wire like each of the last two seasons.

Appalachian St 37 TEXAS ST 19. Appalachian St is starting to look like the best team in the Sun Belt the last couple of weeks. Even though they didn't cover last week vs ULM, they had a 480-222 yard edge including 328-68 on the ground. On the other side, Texas St is playing their 9th game of the season already and after they looked much improved at the start including close losses to SMU and Boston College, it looks like they are running out of gas.

MEMPHIS 41 South Florida 21. Memphis has to pick itself off the mat here after getting crushed by Cincinnati last week much to our delight on these pages. Coach Ryan Silverfield said "It is embarrassing the way we ran the ball. We have to keep working and it starts with me. I was out coached. They pushed us around up front. I have to find a way to get better in the run game. In 22 years, I've never had a run game as ineffective as it was today." They should have much better success vs a USF team that has lost 5 straight.

OKLAHOMA 52 Kansas 10. Oklahoma RB Rhamondre Stevenson and DE Ronnie Perkins made their season debuts last week in a romp over Texas Tech. Stevenson ran for three first-half touchdowns. Perkins had two TFL's. Head coach Lincoln Riley said, "Our team keeps getting better and better. We've still got a long ways to go, a lot of room to climb. But we're really improving right now." The same can't be said for Kansas as the Jayhawks who are 0-6 SU/0-5-1 ATS. Last week they were missing numerous players to injuries, COVID-19 protocols and opt-outs. It's a huge spread but we could only look towards OU here.

TCU 36 Texas Tech 26. For whatever reason, TCU is really struggling at home as the Horned Frogs are 7-19-2 ATS (-6.4 ppg) since 2016 and have lost 5 straight. They did get a nice win at Baylor last week but they were inconsistent like most of the season as they led by 30 and only managed to win by 10. Meanwhile, Texas Tech was crushed by Oklahoma at home. The defense remains a big issue as they are allowing 41 ppg and 499 ypg. TCU snaps their home losing streak but we don't see much value as far as ATS.

Oklahoma St 29 KANSAS ST 20. The biggest misleading final of last week was Oklahoma St's upset loss to Texas. Oklahoma St had dominant 32-17 first down and 530-287 yard edges. Oklahoma St was -4 in TO's and Texas scored 13 points off 3 TO's in the first half on just 17 total yards of offense. Texas also got a 100-yard kickoff return TD and scored a TD late in the 4Q on 4th&7. As long as Oklahoma St isn't feeling too sorry for themselves, they should be able to bounce back here vs a Kansas St team that was exposed vs West Virginia. The problem is this price seems too expensive. Kansas St is 18-7 ATS as a home dog since 2009 and they've only been a double-digit home dog 4 times since 2012. They are 4-0 ATS in those games.

Texas 32 WEST VIRGINIA 26. Like we mentioned in the previous game's write-up Texas was probably the most fortunate team in the country last week in their upset over Oklahoma St as they were dominated statistically but were +4 TO's. Meanwhile, WV had 23-13 first down and 485-225 yard edges including 184-41 on the ground in a blowout win over Kansas St. Coach Neal Brown said, "Without a doubt, that's the most complete game we've played in our two years here." A lot of respected bettors are really high on this WVU team and the early money has come in on them. We would back West Virginia if you can find a +7.

NORTHWESTERN 30 Nebraska 25. We expected Northwestern to be much improved this year but we underestimated how well the Wildcats have looked as they are 2-0 after winning at Iowa last week. Their destruction of Maryland in Week 1 also aged well after the Terps beat Minnesota. Meanwhile, Nebraska had last week off due to COVID issues at Wisconsin. Normally some hidden value here with Nebraska having a crowd edge many times in the games played in Evanston, so no crowd for the Wildcats might not be that bad. We lean with them.

1★ Florida (plus the points) † GEORGIA 27 Florida 26. Jacksonville, FL. Great offense beats great defense in today's CFB. Don't believe us? Nick Saban of Alabama even said so after his team beat Georgia earlier this season. We think Florida has an elite offense led by QB Kyle Trask, TE Kyle Pitts and WR Kadarius Toney. Once they shook the rust off vs Missouri last week, they cruised to victory and are now averaging 42 ppg. On the other side, Georgia QB Stetson Bennett is showing you why he was 4th on the depth chart earlier this season as he has thrown 5 interceptions in the last two games. Plus, Georgia will be without 4 starters on defense this week led by the QB of their back end safety Richard LeCounte.

1★ RICE 28 Utsa 20. We think this UTSA team is running out of gas. They are playing their 9th straight game and are banged up. Note that in their previous 8 games several of them were close, but playing physical teams like UAB, BYU and Army looked like they took their toll last week when FAU thumped them 24-3. That's a FAU team that has been ravaged by COVID, is inexperienced and has a first year coach. Rice is none of those things as the Owls are experienced, have a 3rd-year coach and should be fresh after they crushed Southern Miss on these pages last week. Remember, Rice should be 2-0 this year if not for the quadruple doink vs Middle Tennessee.

CHARLOTTE 33 Middle Tennessee 30. Charlotte was crushed by Duke last week. Charlotte had a 42:27-17:33 TOP edge but had a 7.9-4.0 yards per play deficit. Meanwhile, Middle comes in off a bye after they got a fortunate win over Rice in OT. After a horrific start, they have covered 4 of their last 5 games and we think Charlotte is a bit expensive here.

MISSISSIPPI ST 34 Vanderbilt 16. Last week we cashed on these pages fading Vanderbilt in their blowout loss to Ole Miss. They hadn't played in 3 week. "We looked a step slow and a little bit behind," Vanderbilt coach Derek Mason said. A lot of our kids came back this week. Maybe it just wasn't enough time. Maybe I overestimated how they would be coming back." On the other side, Mississippi St needs a feel-good win after 4 straight losses have seen their offense average just 7.5 ppg. Last week the Crimson Tide handed new Bulldogs coach Mike Leach the first shutout of his college career! Too many points to lay with a struggling offense.

UL-LAFAYETTE 38 Arkansas St 24. Arkansas St looks tired. Getting crushed by Appalachian St on the road is one thing. Losing by 28 at home to Troy and a backup QB is another. Meanwhile, ULL is off a closer than expected game vs Texas St. ULL had a 614-382 yard edge including a 9.8-5.4 yards per pass advantage. However, we don't see much value here.

The FIU/UTEP game was cancelled due to COVID issues at FIU.

2★ HAWAII 41 New Mexico 23. Hawaii took a lot of money in the market place last week and it couldn't have been more wrong as they were thumped at Wyoming 31-7 (we easily cashed with the UNDER). Now they face a displaced New Mexico team on their 2nd straight road game after their defense was lit up for 579 yards last week in a 17-point loss to San Jose St. The Lobos have partnered with UNLV to allow New Mexico players and coaches use of student housing and Sam Boyd Stadium. It's the latest move UNM has made in trying to escape New Mexico's strict COVID-19 guidelines. Hawaii look disjointed last week as they spent a week practicing away from home in Denver. We think the same happens to the Lobos here.

FLORIDA ATLANTIC 25 Western Kentucky 17. WKU is a pathetic 0-6-1 ATS this year failing to cover by an average of 9 ppg. Last week they did get the push vs BYU but trailed 35-3 at halftime. Meanwhile, it's only been 3 games, but FAU isn't as bad as expected under first-year head coach Willie Taggart. Considering their inexperience and the COVID issues, they are 2-1 SU/ATS and just handled UTSA easily 24-3. We could only look their way here.

Louisiana Tech 36 NORTH TEXAS 35. North Texas had COVID issues last week as their game vs UTEP was cancelled. They haven't played in 3 weeks but in case you need a reminder, they have a great offense (averaging 594 ypg) but a really bad defense (allowing 549 ypg) Meanwhile, Louisiana Tech got a big upset win over UAB in double overtime. It should be noted that UAB had a 485-381 yard edge including 338-49 on the ground but were -2 in TO's. We lean with the road dog here.

Texas A&M 33 SOUTH CAROLINA 25. The Aggies are certainly a team to keep an eye on down the stretch as they could be favored in all of their remaining games. Texas A&M's offensive line hasn't allowed a sack in the last four games and QB Mond is playing his best football of his career. However, this line looks steep considering South Carolina is fresh off a bye. Yes, the Gamecocks were blown out at LSU in their last game but they already upset Auburn at home and have competed well vs Tennessee and Florida this year.

Clemson 28 NOTRE DAME 21. Yes, Clemson almost lost to BC last week but we liked what we saw from QB DJ Uiagalelei who threw for 342 yards in his first start with Trevor Lawrence out with COVID. He makes his first road start here but didn't panic last week when down 18. The Tigers still have the best RB in the country in Travis Etienne who had 224 total yards last week. We think Clemson D.C. Brent Venables has a huge edge vs new Notre Dame O.C. Tommy Rees and the Irish never show up vs elite competition. Since 1994, Notre Dame is 4-40 straight up (-16 ppg) and 11-32-1 ATS (-8 ppg) vs teams that finish in the AP Top 10.

Tennessee 28 ARKANSAS 26. Big game here for both programs. Tennessee comes in off a much needed bye after losing 3 straight games. The program seems to be at a cross-roads in Year 3 under head coach Jeremy Pruitt. Meanwhile, Arkansas is 5-0 ATS and a win here should start putting head coach Sam Pittman in the running for SEC coach of the year. Down to the wire.

MARSHALL 48 Massachusetts 7. UMass plays their second game of the season as they were crushed by Georgia Southern 41-0 a few weeks ago. Meanwhile, Marshall had their game vs FIU cancelled last week due to COVID issues at FIU. The Herd are 5-0 SU this year outscoring their opponents by 25 ppg and are only allowing 72 rush ypg and 9 ppg on defense. Tough seeing UMass having much success here. Marshall has a proud football history but this is their biggest favorite role ever!

SOUTHERN MISS 35 North Alabama 20. Southern Miss has a ton of QB issues in this game as their top 2 QB's could be out. North Alabama is 0-2 this season and lost at Liberty by 21, the same amount Southern Miss lost by. At 17 or more and depending on the Southern Miss QB news, North Alabama is the play.

Week 10 Computer Projected Lines for Every CFB Game

For the past four seasons we have posted computer projected lines for every game. **Games where there was of difference of more than 3 points saw our computer lines actually beat the Vegas line at a 302-252-12 (55%) clip the last three years.** That's pretty solid and actually better than our own handicapping in some seasons. **Last week's plays went 4-2 and now the record for this year is 29-19.** Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

Of the 18 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be **Iowa -7.**

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.

Week 10 CFB ATS Trends

1. When Eastern Michigan plays away from home in the underdog role, they are on a current 18-2-1 ATS run! This week the Eagles are 4.5-point underdogs at Kent St on Wednesday.
2. Akron is just 3-21-1 ATS (-9.4 ppg) as a home underdog since late 2011. This week the Zips are 18-point home underdogs to Western Michigan.
3. Last year the Zips became the first team ever to start a season 0-10 ATS (finished 1-11).
4. Bowling Green is a nation-worst 14-33-1 ATS the last 4 years. The Falcons kick off their season this Wednesday at arch rival Toledo. The Falcons are 23-point underdogs.
5. Northern Illinois is 11-0 SU (+23.6 ppg) and 8-3 ATS (+7.8 ppg) vs Buffalo but find themselves a 13.5-point home underdog this week.
6. Northern Illinois is in their largest home underdog role since 1998 and the Huskies are on a 12-2-1 ATS (+8.8 ppg) run as a home dog since 2001.
7. San Diego St is on a 7-0 SU (+22 ppg) and 6-1 ATS (+9.8 ppg) run vs San Jose St. This week the Aztecs are 9.5-point home favorites.
8. Since 2005, Boise State has been a home underdog just one time. They were 2-point home dogs to Fresno St in 2018 and the Broncos won 24-17. This week Boise St is a 3-point home underdog to BYU.
9. 36-9-1! That's the under record for games between service academy teams since 2005. This week's total between Air Force and Army is 40.5.
10. Michigan has beat Indiana 24 straight times (13-10-1 ATS) dating back to 1988. Michigan has been favored in all 24 of those meetings. However, this week the Wolverines are only 3-point road favorites. That's their shortest spread EVER vs the Hoosiers (dating back to 1980).
11. It is very tough to get margin on Arizona St under head coach Herm Edwards. Only once have the Sun Devils lost by more than 11 points under him. This week's spread at USC sees the Sun Devils listed as 10.5-point underdogs.
12. For whatever reason, TCU is really struggling at home as the Horned Frogs are 7-19-2 ATS (-6.4 ppg) since 2016 and have lost 5 straight. This week TCU is a 9-point favorite vs Texas Tech.
13. Kansas St is 18-7 ATS as a home dog since 2009 and they've only been a double-digit home dog 4 times since 2012. They are 4-0 ATS in those games and this week are 12.5-point home underdogs to Oklahoma St.
14. Since 1994, Notre Dame is 4-40 straight up (-16 ppg) and 11-32-1 ATS (-8 ppg) vs teams that finish in the AP Top 10. The Irish are 5.5-point home underdogs to No. 1 Clemson this week.
15. Marshall has a proud football history but the 44.5-point spread at home to UMass this week is their biggest favorite role ever!

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

Thursday, November 5th

Green Bay 27 SAN FRANCISCO 23. Tough getting a bet down on this one as the 49ers just shut their practice facility down on Wednesday due to COVID. San Francisco is also extremely banged up with Nick Mullens projected to get the start here at QB and TE George Kittle is now out for the season. The Packers aren't a beacon of health themselves but do have double-revenge for a pair of blowout losses here last year. We're sitting this one out for now until the injury/COVID situations clear.

Sunday, November 8th

Seattle 27 BUFFALO 26. No surprise Seattle won a game where they were outgained (albeit by 1 yard last week to San Francisco). Although the Seahawks were in control for most of it. What we were shocked by was the market betting the Seahawks all the way down to -1. On the other side, the Bills escaped with a win over New England. We had the UNDER and it looked good when it was 7-6 at halftime but it ended up another close loser on these pages in the pros. Not a great spot for Seattle making their 3rd trip to the East Coast and in between division games. Slight lean Bills.

ATLANTA 27 Denver 23. The Falcons come in off extra rest after an impressive win at Carolina last Thursday. If not for the final play vs Detroit, they'd be 3-0 under interim coach Morris. Meanwhile, the Broncos made a big come from behind win over the Chargers last week overcoming a 24-3 3Q deficit. QB Lock threw for 3 TD's. This looks like a good spot for the Falcons but they are 0-4 SU/ATS at home this year. Note that all them were in the favorite role. That keeps us off them here.

TENNESSEE 26 Chicago 21. We think both teams are overrated. First, Chicago is 5-3 SU but is -38 ypg on the season. Last week they rallied from a 10-point deficit to force OT which cost us on these pages with our New Orleans recommendation. Again, Chicago can't run the ball failing to top 100 yards in any of their last 5 games. Meanwhile, Tennessee is off an upset loss to the Bengals as 7-point favorites. The Titans did have a 441-367 yard edge but are only +9 ypg on the season. We're moving ahead to further action on the card.

MINNESOTA 28 Detroit 24. Minnesota looked like a different team coming out of the bye last week as they upset the Packers. They scored TD's on each of their first 4 possessions and RB Dalvin Cook ran for 163 yards and 3 TD's. Remember, they could have a better record as they have a pair of 1-point losses. Meanwhile, the Lions were -2 in TO's and exposed vs the Colts last week. The good news is they have scored at least 21 points in each of the first 7 games for the first time since 1954. The bad news they are just 4-16 SU in their last 20 games. The Vikings are on a 5-0 SU/4-0-1 ATS run in this series. Don't see too much value.

1★ Baltimore 26 INDIANAPOLIS 22. What an unbelievable loss last week backing the Ravens on these pages vs the Steelers. Baltimore had a 457-221 yard edge (265 rush yards!) but lost because you guessed it...-4 in TO's. How often do teams lose with such a disparity... try this...Since 1933, a team that had at least 250 rushing yards and had at least twice as many total yards as its opponent had a combined record of 215-1-1. Now make that 215-2-1. It was the most rushing yards in a loss in Baltimore history. It was the first time Baltimore had lost when winning at halftime under Lamar Jackson (22-1). We've had incredible misfortune in the NFL this year. On the other side, the Colts hammered the Lions by 20. Note the Colts have owned the series with a 10-1 ATS mark (+7.6 ppg). However, we're taking the Ravens here after such an outlier score last week.

1★ Carolina (plus the points) KANSAS CITY 30 Carolina 21. The Chiefs easily covered an historic point spread last week vs the lowly Jets as 19.5-point favorites. QB Mahomes was magnificent with 416 pass yards and 5 TD's. He now has a 21-to-1 TD-to-INT ratio on the season. They're taking on a Carolina team with extra rest after losing at home to the Falcons. The Panthers get back RB McCaffrey for this one. How motivated will the Chiefs be here vs a non-conference opponent? Also note that Carolina QB Teddy Bridgewater is 15-2 ATS as a road underdog in his career. We like the Panthers.

Houston 29 JACKSONVILLE 20. Both teams come in off a bye. After starting the season 1-1 SU and 2-0 ATS, the Jags are 0-5 SU losing by 14 ppg and 0-5 ATS failing to cover by 10.2 ppg. That includes a 30-14 loss to the Texans a few weeks ago. "Tank for Trevor" is on. On top of that you have the Jags starting rookie QB Jake Luton here. The Texans are 1-6 SU but have played the toughest schedule by far in the NFL. The only time, they've played a sub-par team was that earlier game vs Jacksonville. We lean with the Texans.

WASHINGTON 22 N.Y. Giants 20. The Giants won the earlier meeting 20-19 as they stopped a 2-point conversion late by Washington. Speaking of 2-point conversions, the Giants gave great effort on MNF as a huge underdog to Tampa Bay only to see the refs take it away from them on the 2-point conversion. The G-Men are only 1-7 SU on the season but are 4-1 ATS in their last 5 games. Meanwhile, the Football team comes in off a bye and in the NFC East, they remain in the race even with 2 wins. This is the first time they've been favored in 14 games! The Giants are on a 14-2 ATS run as a road dog but this isn't a great spot for them. Pass.

L.A. CHARGERS 28 Las Vegas 26. Last week the Raiders overcame the blustery conditions and upset the Browns 16-6. Meanwhile, the Chargers blew a 24-3 halftime lead something they've grown accustomed to under head coach Anthony Lynn. That's now 4 blown leads in the fourth quarter this season alone and they are now 3-14 SU in one possession games under him. That's not bad luck. That's bad coaching! We think this might be a good spot to back them off the disparate results last week but Lynn is also just 3-11 ATS as a favorite losing 10 of those games straight up.

Pittsburgh 27 DALLAS 14. The Steelers shocked us last week overcoming that ridiculous box score to upset the Ravens (see the Baltimore/Indianapolis writeup for how rare it was). They're now 7-0 SU on the season but laying a lot of points on the road has never been a good thing for them under Tomlin as they are on a 5-15 ATS run laying 6 or more. It's also they're third straight road game. It doesn't get any worse than the Cowboys who are 0-8 ATS on the season and last week started Ben DiNucci at QB. They haven't decided who will start this week yet. This is an historic line for both teams as Pittsburgh has never been a bigger road favorite and the Cowboys haven't been this big of a home underdog since 1989 vs the 49ers (Jimmy Johnson's first season). No team has started a season 0-9 ATS in the last 30 years. Call us crazy, but we will lean with the Cowboys as long as we're getting 14.

3★ ARIZONA 28 Miami 20. A lot of crazy things happened in the NFL last week but none crazier than the Miami Dolphins easily winning a game that they were outgained 471-145 in. That's not a typo, the Dolphins were outgained by 326 yards vs the Rams and somehow won by 11! No team has won by double-digits gaining so few yards since 2006. It was defense and special teams that set up all four of their TD's. Tua Tagovailoa was only 12 of 22 for 93 yards in his first start but now goes on the road to face an Arizona team fresh off a bye after winning and covering 3 straight by an average of 17 ppg. While the Dolphins are -52 ypg despite their 4-3 record, the 5-2 Cardinals are +41 ypg. Cards easy!

TAMPA BAY 28 New Orleans 24. The Bucs come in on a short week after escaping the Giants with a 2-point win on MNF. Safe to say it was a controversial call on the Giants failed 2-point conversion in the final seconds. The Bucs have revenge for an earlier loss to the Saints this season all the way back in Week 1. Meanwhile, the Saints have won four straight games all by 6 points or less but really disappointed us on these pages last week as they blew a late 10-point 4Q lead and had to win in OT at Chicago. The Bucs have been way more dominant in their wins as they've by scores of 14, 18, 28 and 25 prior to Monday. Still, we think this line is a little steep.

Monday, November 9th

New England 24 N.Y. JETS 16. How the mighty have fallen as the Patriots are now just 2-5 on the season after last week's loss to the Bills. That's now 4 straight losses for New England. Meanwhile, the Jets are used to losing as they have are 0-8 SU on the season with only one cover. Last week they were historic underdogs (+19.5) and still couldn't cover at Kansas City. New England has won 8 straight games in the series by an average of 21 ppg but Tom Brady isn't walking through that day anymore and Cam has been abysmal the last couple of weeks. With that being said, this line looks cheap to us. We lean with New England but can't back them as a ★-rated play on these pages with so many losses on them this year.
