# From Rev. Haydie

“There is always a bit of light in the darkness.”

That was acolyte Sam Barker-Elston’s reminder to us, during a recent sermon. We were talking about the paralyzed man at the pool of Bethesda at the time: a man so discouraged that he couldn’t even answer “yes” when Jesus asked if he wanted to be healed.

The man’s discouragement came from feeling alone, because he had nobody to put him in the pool. It came from his unreadiness to find new ways of approaching the problems he faced. And it came, Sam’s words remind us, because he seems to have stopped looking for God’s light.

I’m grateful we had that conversation on Sunday, because it was only two days later that we got the news of the school shooting in Uvalde. Some of the victims of Buffalo’s supermarket shooting hadn’t even been buried yet. Ever since then, we’ve seen the parade of little faces: Alexandria. Amerie. Rojelio. Tess. Xavier. Words fail.

Many of us feel deeply sad and discouraged right now. We pray for the students and teachers killed in Uvalde, but we know our prayers aren’t enough. We know that, as a country, we have to find different ways of approaching the problem of gun violence. We know we owe that much to the children of Uvalde, and to our own children and grandchildren.

And for that to happen, we have to keep looking for that bit of light in the darkness—even when it’s hard to see. We need to trust in that light. And when Jesus asks us if we’re really ready to change, we need to say “yes.”
