From the Pastor's Desk

Renovation Renovation is in the air!

WHAT: A renovation is getting underway soon!

HOW: How did this come about? In 1999, a gentleman gave the church \$250,000 toward its building fund, since at the time, the church had plans to build a new worship facility. Over time, the plans were set aside and the facility was never built. Because the money was designated for a new building, it could not be used for general repairs or anything else, so it remained in an account at the United Methodist Foundation. In 2017, we began a process to locate the family of the now-deceased donor to request their permission to use the funds for renovation purposes, since the church does not need a new structure. All efforts to locate the family were fruitless, so we hired an attorney and went through a legal process to get approval to use the funds for needed renovations. A Marion County judge approved our petition last May.

WHERE: Which parts of our campus will be renovated? Plans are underway for a kitchen renovation, new flooring for the fellowship hall, a narthex expansion, and new carpeting for the main building.

WHY: Why were these areas chosen? Our kitchen is one of the busiest places in our church! With a state-approved kitchen, we will be able to receive federal grants to help with food costs for programs like JumpStart. The Narthex can become quite a bottleneck of activity on Sundays, and the narthex expansion will ease movement through the building during high traffic. The carpeting is aged and worn, and with the addition of new indoor square footage for our narthex, we need to have all the carpeting match.

WHEN: When will this all happen? Architectural drawings are being finalized now, and we expect the Narthex project to begin first. We think you'll be seeing DUST soon!





The Dearest Friend!


I have a Friend in Jesus, He's ever walking near To share my every burden And take away my fear.
