#### What is Safe at Home?

Safe at Home is an address confidentiality program intended to help survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking or rape by keeping their abusers from finding them.

#### How Safe at Home Works:

*Safe at Home* provides a substitute address so that survivors can keep their location confidential on new records created by state and local agencies and the courts, such as:

- Department of Revenue (driver's license, non-driver's license, vehicle registration)
- Voter registration
- School records
- Department of Social Services
- Library cards
- Courts
- City or county records

## **Enrolling in the Program:**

To enroll in the program you will need to contact a victim services professional who has been trained to assist individuals with the *Safe at Home* application process. To receive a referral to an agency in your area, you may call toll free at **1-866-509-1409** or visit <u>www.MoSafeAtHome.com</u> for a list of agencies.

## Safe at Home may be right for you if:

- You are a survivor of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking or rape.
- You recently relocated to an address unknown to your abuser.
