What is *Safe at Home*?

Safe at Home is an address confidentiality program intended to help survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking or rape by keeping their abusers from finding them.

How *Safe at Home* Works:

Safe at Home provides a substitute address so that survivors can keep their location confidential on new records created by state and local agencies and the courts, such as:

- Department of Revenue (driver's license, non-driver's license, vehicle registration)
- Voter registration
- School records
- Department of Social Services
- Library cards
- Courts
- City or county records

Enrolling in the Program:

To enroll in the program you will need to contact a victim services professional who has been trained to assist individuals with the *Safe at Home* application process. To receive a referral to an agency in your area, you may call toll free at **1-866-509-1409** or visit www.MoSafeAtHome.com for a list of agencies.

Safe at Home may be right for you if:

- You are a survivor of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking or rape.
- You recently relocated to an address unknown to your abuser.
- You understand participation in the program is just one piece of a comprehensive plan for your safety.
