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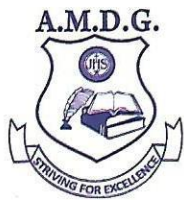
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Welcome to Chishawasha Mission Primary School Magazine...

THE PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



“Chishawasha, a citadel of Catholicism and religious excellence in Southern Africa Religion”

The School Principal - Father Mukonori SJ

Chishawasha Mission Primary School was established in 1891 by the Jesuit Priests and Brothers who had come as part of the Pioneer Column, with Fr Hartmann SJ as the Chaplain. The Jesuits established the Zambezia Mission (incorporating Zambia, Zimbabwe and Malawi) at Chishawasha. The institution was established with the Ignatian Education view that for anyone to know God there was a need to go to school. The school was initially opened for boys only in 1893 and it was started as a farm School. In 1898, Girls were enrolled under the guidance of Dominican Sisters in the Mission. Amongst the first girls to learn at Chishawasha were the daughter of Mbuya Nehanda, who was baptised as Sabina, and many other girls who became influential. Later on, the mother of His Excellency, the President of the Republic of Zimbabwe, Mbuya Bona, also came and learnt at Chishawasha. Henceforth, the Mission opened up other Catholic Centres (Mission today) which includes Kutama, Makumbi, St Pauls Musami, Driefontein, St Anthony, Mukaro, Gokomere and Mary Mount, to

name just a few.

Chishawasha is one of the Pioneers in the development of this country, both academically and structurally. It was also very instrumental in the growth of Christianity in the country and this rich history makes Chishawasha a citadel of Catholicism and religious excellence in Southern Africa Religion, a history of which we are all proud.

The School is renowned for its community development initiatives which have been chronicled over history. The first brick houses/buildings in Harare, such as those at St. Georges and the churches at the Mission, were moulded in Chishawasha Valley. Presently, Chishawasha continues to empower the community by providing employment and this is evidenced by the recruitment of labor from the Chishawasha community for the construction of the girls' dormitory and other projects. More so, schools such as St. Ignatius developed from Chishawasha, thanks to the Pioneer Priests and Brothers who were men for

others. In 1931, the famous Br Lovell started the first Printing Press which served the whole country. The Printing Press operated until 1976.

Chishawasha's agricultural activities were notable by the Salisbury Show Society exhibitions where it always came out tops. It also had a brass band, which was always first in displays from Harare (Salisbury) to Mafeking.

A school magazine has far-reaching effects as it articulates the education and related realities obtaining in the School today. We are proud of this milestone and as we continue to grow, we are certain that Chishawasha Mission Primary School will continue to groom young men and women who will contribute positively to the community, the country and beyond. At Chishawasha primary school, we have about 700 students. The answer we often get is, "we are looking for good education that is all round." Indeed at Chishawasha we try to provide holistic education that prepares future generations, men and women who would fit in any society, ready to live up to any future challenges, hence the school logo depicts "Striving for Excellence".

At Chishawasha we try to make sure that those students who have gone through it are, what we call "men and women for others". We do this by following in the footsteps of St. Ignatius, the founder of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), who are the custodians of your children while they are at Chishawasha. We try as best as we can to provide moral and religious formation, through

catechetical instructions, celebration of the sacraments like: baptism, Communion, reconciliation and confirmation. We also give our students opportunity to participate in the celebrations of the liturgy as often as possible. It is not surprising that some would end up, with the permission of their parents, asking to become Catholics.

Through the Chaplaincy's office, we also provide social-psycho support to all our students and where need be we seek professional help. So one who has gone through Chishawasha Mission

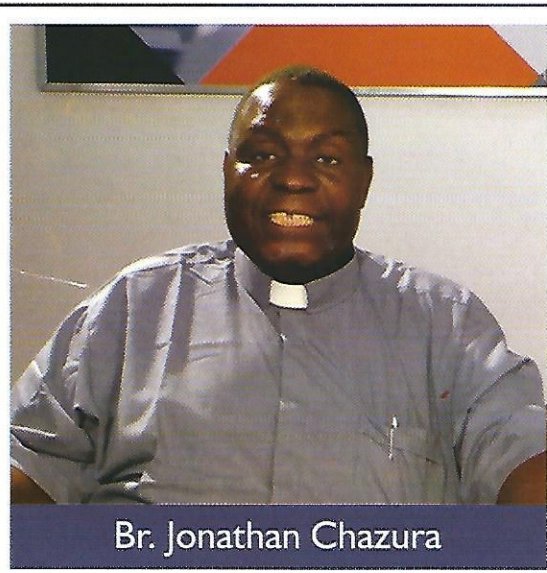
FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

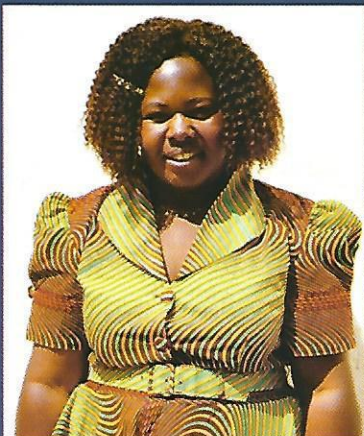
Almost everyone who attended this colourful ceremony gave a token of appreciation. The couple walked away with money, furniture and tickets just to

TEACHING MATHEMATICS AT PRIMARY LEVEL

A subject of great interest and easy to tackle in the infancy stage. Mathematics encourages experimenting until you arrive at the answer. It requires a critical analysis of data, concentration, neatness and creativity. Teaching Mathematics is easy as it is a development of concepts from low levels to higher levels. The attitude of the learner and the teacher is pivotal. Consistence in the methods used is critical to avoid confusing the learner especially where teachers change at every grade level. It is important to ensure a smooth

handover between grades so that the changeover does not negatively affect the learner. Learners must not be subjected to totally new ways of doing the same thing. It is important that the process is an on-going one rather than a new experience. This is much in all the four basic mathematical operations, subtraction, addition, division and multiplication. The use of varied media is essential in order to promote participation by learners. During teaching, we ensure that the lesson is learner- centered so that much work is done by the learner as this helps

in quicker assimilation of concepts. It is important that as teachers we conduct research when uncertain to avoid teaching the wrong thing. It is very difficult to rectify a mathematical error as learners trust and believe that the teacher is never wrong. In conclusion, I would like to say, enjoy teaching Mathematics, incite interest in the learner and develop concepts in the right order and you create lovers of the subject!
