Two experiences from the recent Easter weekend stand out as especially meaningful. Both involved relating to people who had a sense of special need and the sharing of food. The first was the practice that we often realize on holidays in coordination with Fifth Street, namely, the delivery of meals on wheels to those shut-ins, many of whom would not have a meal if someone did not bring food to them. Some folk are quiet, but grateful. Others express their gratitude with much conversation. We often get notes or calls left on the answering machine stating a sense of thankfulness for the meal that arrived per the delivery efforts of Grace folk. This past Saturday eleven individuals/families participated in the meal delivery.

The second experience was the annual Easter Sunrise Service at Fifth Street Ministries. This has developed to a point where folk from Grace, the community-at-large, and the shelter join together for a time of worship and then the sharing of a big breakfast together. This year, we had a large gathering with perhaps one of our largest representations from the shelter. It gives us the opportunity to do what the church is most strategically called to do....go where there are hungry people and feed them. That is also joined with the monthly service at the soup kitchen. The breaking of bread on Easter morning was a thing of beauty. Thanks to so many who offered a helping hand.

# **EASTER'S CONTEXT THEN AND NOW**

Easter always has a context.

The original took place in the context of Roman oppression of the known world, massive enslavement of defeated peoples, excessive wealth in the hands of a few, widespread ignorance, a corrupt emperor claiming to be God and God's corrupt people claiming to be righteous.

To that world, Jesus said hardly a word. He refused to defend himself from false accusations. He refused to curry favor with the powerful. To the wealthy he said, Give it away. To the righteous he said, Deny yourselves, and pick up your own cross. To the weak he said, Be strong. To the strong he said, Be weak. To outcasts he said, Welcome. To his accusers and tormentors he said, I forgive you.

Easter's context is much the same in 2015. Widespread oppression and enslavement, excessive wealth in the hands of a few, worsening ignorance, bigots claiming to serve God, the self-righteous claiming to revere God's truth, hatred declared holy, and what God does value -- love, mercy, justice, tolerance, peace -- declared expendable.

To our world Jesus has the same few words to say. Give it away, take up a cross, be strong, be weak, welcome, I forgive you.
