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TeamOGI Competitive Gymnastics Team News

On April 5th Victoria Wolfe competed in the Level 8 State Meet. She placed 10th on Vault, 2nd on the Uneven Parallel Bars, 8th on Balance Beam, 7th on Floor Exercise and 5th in All Around with a score of 34.875. Her All Around score qualified to compete in the Region 5 Championships in Bowling Green on April 21st. At Regionals out of 58 girls from 5 states; Victoria placed 17th on Balance Beam and 17th in the All Around with a score of 35.500. Great job Miss Wolfe - We are all so proud of you!



The Women's gymnastics compulsory program will be restructured by USA Gymnastics starting in June of 2013. All compulsory (levels 1-5) routines and music will be updated this fall. All optional (level 6-10) rules and requirements will also be updated. The biggest change this year will be the renumbering of the compulsory levels. The current levels 2-6 will be renumbered to include a new optional level 6. So each of these levels will still contain the current core skills but will be numbered lower. For example, the current level 5 will be called level 4 starting in the fall. Please remember that the fun, challenge and excitement hasn't changed, just the numbers. More

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DON'T SACRIFICE WHEN IT COMES TO PROVIDING YOUR CHILDREN WITH THE BEST

Where did the Playroom go?

You may have noticed that we have closed the playroom. We have done so to avoid problems which are certain to arise due to its use by unsupervised children. Our rules for the playroom have always required direct supervision of those using the playroom by their parents. While there have been instances of mild injuries, broken toys, damage to the walls and books and even some bullying, we have been fortunate. However, OGI must behave responsibly. Each week over 3,000 people enter the building and without very expensive changes to our systems we cannot be expected to provide supervision to children who are not in classes. Accordingly, effective immediately, any children who are not in the gymnastics areas and under the direct supervision of our coaching staff are required to remain within the line of sight of their parents at all times. This includes trips to the entrance areas, bathrooms, Pro Shop and outside the building. A few weeks ago we were very fortunate that one of our staff noticed a toddler roaming the parking lot unattended. The child apparently had followed another family out the front door and couldn't find its parents who were in the Observation Area unaware that their child was outside. Webb Road is a very busy street, as is our parking lot -both provide the perfect opportunity for an accident involving an unsupervised child. Another real risk is that one of our own could be taken by a stranger while they were not being supervised. With nearby highways the child could be in another state within minutes and no one would be the wiser.

The Ohio Gymnastics has had a playroom since the early 90's. When we moved to our current facility in 2005 there was not an area which could house a playroom within view of the gymnastics area. We plan to remodel the area behind the bleachers to include a playroom, but the extensive changes require an expense that we are not ready to make at this time. We will in the future offer a playroom again, but it will not include the option to be used without a parent directly in attendance.

OGI's Policies on Social Media and contact between our Students and Staff outside of the Gym

The Ohio Gymnastics Institute has had a long standing policy to strictly control access to our customers' and staff's personal information. Long before Social Media issues became popular OGI had in place rules defining the boundaries between our staff and our customers. When the company began in 1986 we also established rules to protect everyone by requiring that at least two staff members be in the building during any time our doors are open to the public. We also prohibit our staff members from entering into personal relationships with their students. Contact information for both our customers and our staff are considered private information and are not "given out" without prior consent.

Several years ago, as we noticed the rapid growth of Social Media, we put into place several additional policies in order to be pro-active in defining boundaries for this new world. Please take a minute to review our company's policies regarding Social Media issues.

- At no time may any OGI staff interact on a personal basis with any of our students under the age of 21 through any social media
- OGI staff are not permitted to text, Facetime, Skype, or engage in phone conversations with any of our students under the age of 21
- OGI staff may not provide their personal telephone, email or other contact information to students under the age of 21
- All business interactions with our customers must be executed through the office staff at our business office
 not customer to coach or coach to customer via a staff member's personal telephone

OGI has an active web site (www.MyTeamOGI.com) and a company Facebook page (https://www.facebook.com/MyTeamOGI). Those two forms of social media are the only means for our staff and students to interact beyond the personal interactions they enjoy safely at the gym.

Children must wait for their parents in the building!

We have the same concerns with regard to children waiting for their rides in the parking areas as we do with the playroom. We must require that all children wait in the building for their parents / rides to arrive. We cannot supervise children in the parking lot or on the front lawn. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.
