Sunday Advent

Year B Mark 1:1-8



"The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God. As it is written in Isaiah the prophet: Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way. A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan Riveras they acknowledged their sins. Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

2nd Sunday Advent Year B

Mark 1:1-8

What is in the wilderness? 'Lions and Tigers and Bears!' (John the Baptist is like a lion roaring in the desert fiery messages of repentance! - Amos 1:2 prophesied, "The LORD roars from Zion & thunders from Jerusalem...") From the earliest days in our church history the symbol representing the Gospel Writer Mark has been a LION, because his gospel begins with John Baptist 'roaring' out in the desert for everyone to straighten up and focus on God's coming! (The symbols for other gospels are John-Eagle, Luke-Ox & Matthew-Man also taken from their opening lines-scenes.) So, Mark's gospel begins by introducing John the Baptist out in the desert wilderness, calling out 'Repent & Prepare: the Lord is Coming!' Mark 1:3 actually quotes Isaiah 40:3, 'A voice of one crying in the desert'. That is John the Baptist, lonely though he may be out there, John preaches to everyone a message of preparedness and repenting of sin to get ready for the Lord's Coming. Maybe John the Baptist wasn't always preaching such 'fire and brimstone' but he surely could be fired up enough to match the volume of a ROAR, as when he prophesies about Jesus in Matthew 3:11, saying, "He will baptize you with the holy Spirit and fire." John's fierce and *fiery* talk is one connection linking him closely with another roaring prophet Elijah, as we remember that Elijah was assumed up into heaven with God back in 2 Kings 2:11 when "a fiery chariot and fiery horses came between the two of them, and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind". The gospels make several intentional comparisons between John the Baptist and Elijah. A couple more such connections include their unique but similar dress (Matt 3:4 & 2 Kgs 1:8) of 'camel's hair cloak and leather belt around his waist', in addition to their fearless attacks on corrupt Kings, when they calling out the royal immorality (1 Kings 18:18 where Elijah condemns King Ahab & in Matt 14:3-4 John Baptist condemns King Herod).

But most importantly, the strongest connection behind Elijah and John the Baptist is the fact that John was a type of New Elijah that fulfilled the Hebrew prophecy expecting first Elijah to return, right before the Messiah showed up. Elijah's preparatory return from heaven would introduce the Messiah. The Old Testament prophet Malachi had predicted in Malachi 3:23 "I am sending to you Elijah the prophet, Before the great day of the LORD comes..." (also in Malachi 3:1). So, the expectation among the Hebrews was that Elijah would show up first, and then the Messiah would arrive! Jesus confirms such a linkage between Elijah and John the Baptist when Jesus says in Matthew 17:12-13 "'I tell you that Elijah has already come, and they did not recognize him but did to him whatever they pleased. So, also will the Son of Man suffer at their hands.' Then the disciples understood that he was speaking to them of John the Baptist." And in Matthew 11:13-14 "All the prophets and law prophesied up to the time of John. And if you are willing to accept it, he is Elijah, the one who is to come." So, John's preaching is meant to motivate us to make the needed preparations for the Lord's coming. John wants to 'fire us up with zeal' to welcome Jesus the Messiah when He shows. (Is this what Jesus is talking about in Luke 12:49 "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!") We need a Messiah, a Savior, because of our sins and the sinfulness abounding in the world. John's job was to draw our attention to our need of 'repentance', acknowledging our faults and turning to God for the remedy of forgiveness and new life in Christ. Matthew 3:6 tells us that John "baptized in the Jordan River as they (people) confessed their sins." So, our humble confession of personal sin and the acknowledgement of our faults/failings is what preps us to receive Jesus. To accept a Savior, I have to realize first that I need a Savior! And being aware of my need of God's forgiveness, begins when I first inventory my life (honestly admit my guilt) and it is John/Elijah that motivates me to closely examine and call out my own sins!
