

Words could not describe the feeling of stepping out into the sunshine after completing my final paramedic test-out. It was hard to believe...almost as if the words "Congratulations, you're done! You passed!" had been spoken to someone else, and I had just been watching. I took my hair out of the uniform ponytail I'd been wearing for a year and let the wind tousle through its tendrils and blow the year-long weight off my shoulders. Finally, after studying and working and praying and crying and clinging to the hope that I could remember and perform to the high standard before me, I was done.

I was DONE!!





It's finally nearing! It's almost time to weigh anchor and set sail! The next step in the trek is Camdenton,

Missouri, the location of New Tribes Mission's Missionary Training Center (MTC). This is where I plan to complete 2 final years of training in Culture, Linguistics, Translation, Teaching, and "Roughing It," so to speak. The school's mission is to prepare and equip tribal missionaries for the unique challenges that come with

moving into a remote location, working with an unwritten language, and teaching an unorthodox people about an incredible God who gave up his life, so that they could have life in Him. (John 20:31)

The departure date for Missouri is tentatively set for August 2012. I've begun the application process and gathered my notebooks, pencils, highlighters, and hiking boots; but for the ship to launch, I first need to finance the voyage.

It will cost \$10,716 for all four semesters, including tuition, books, housing, utilities, and administrative fees. I'm also trying to save some extra to buffer for food and living expenses, which are not included. I am working to save as much as I can before August so that I am free to concentrate on the training while I'm there, and I *deeply* appreciate your prayers that God would provide financially in a way that exhibits his faithfulness and glorifies him.
