Course Description:

This <u>Non-Language Specific</u> Three (3) credit hour, <u>Non-Instructor led course</u>, will familiarize today's Interpreter with common terms and meanings associated with Criminal Investigations. "Legal Description", "Affiant", "Hero Sheet", "Steagald Warrant" and many other terms and phrases specific to criminal investigations, and their associated judicial court proceedings. Through a combination of provided video resources, self-guided terminology exploration, definition/word matching and photo/term matching, the language professional can expect to gain a better understanding of terminology and phrases commonly and not so commonly used in today's courtrooms. Explanation of terms which regularly cause confusion due to the rarity of use and/or double meanings due to occupational slang variants are showcased in this block of instruction.
