ELIGIBILITY: Participation in the Spring Show is limited to members in good standing with their 4-H Club or FFA Chapter. Exhibitors must reside or attend school within the Southwest District to enter. Exhibitors must be 5 years of age and cannot have reached their 20th birthday by the opening day of the Spring Show March 22, 2025.

ENTRIES: All entries will be \$20 per entry and made online through the website. Entries open February 19th and close March 19th.

SHOWMANSHIP: Fee to participate is \$5 cash to be paid upon entry of show ring, winner take all.

SHOW DAY: Check-In will be 8:30 to 9:30a.m, show will begin at 10:00a.m.

Commercial Heifers

1. Only commercial and crossbred females may be exhibited in this show. No registration certificate is required.
2. All heifers in these classes must be the type, quality, and finish to be creditable to the livestock show.
3. Any changes in classification or weights must be done on the scales as heifers are weighed.

Classes

- 01 – American
- 02 – English
- 03 – Exotic

Steers

1. There is no maximum weight.
2. Steers will be shown by weight.
3. Classes will be determined by show committee.

- 01 – Steer

Market Goats

1. Does shown in the Market Goat Show are not eligible to be shown in the Boer, Dairy or Wether Dam Goat Shows. **NO REFUNDS.**
2. ALL goats must have a Premise Ear ID Tag following rules of the Arkansas Livestock & Poultry Commission.
3. Market Wether & Market Does will be weighed and broken into classes by weight.
4. Any breed of goat or cross may be shown.
5. Market goats may be horned, but horns must be tipped.

01 – Market Goat

Boer Goat Show

1. Does shown in the Boer Goat Show are not eligible to be shown in the Market, Dairy or Wether Dam Goat Shows. **NO REFUNDS.**
2. Registration papers are required.
3. Percentage Boer are 50% to 87%, Full Blood are 93.7% and higher

Classes

- 01 – Percentage doe, 0-3 months
- 02 – Percentage doe, 3-6 months
- 03 – Percentage doe, 6-9 months
- 04 – Percentage doe, 9-12 months
- 05 – Percentage doe, 13-18 months
- 06 – Percentage doe, 19-24 months

- 07 – Full blood doe, 0-3 months
- 08 – Full blood doe, 3-6 months
- 09 – Full blood doe, 6-9 months
- 10 – Full blood doe, 9-12 months
- 11 – Full blood doe, 13-18 months
- 12 – Full blood doe, 19-24 months

Dairy Goats

1. Does shown in the Dairy Goat Show are not eligible to be shown in the Market, Boer or Whether Dam Goat Shows. **NO REFUNDS.**
Registration papers are required.

2. No buck goats are allowed on the fairgrounds.

Classes

Senior does - freshened

1. Under 2 years
2. 2 years and under 3 years
3. 3 years and under 5 years
4. 5 years and over

Junior does - never freshened

5. Under 6 months
6. 6 months and under 12 months
7. 13 months and under 18 months
8. 19 months and under 24 months

Wether Dam Goats

1. Does shown in the Wether Dam Show are not eligible to be shown in the Market, Boer or Dairy Goat Shows. **NO REFUNDS.**
2. Wether Dam Goats are defined as any crossbred animal, or maybe purebred provided it is not tattooed.
3. There is no minimum or maximum weight.
4. Goats may be horned, but must be tipped.

Classes

01- Slick Shorn (uniformly shorn 3/8 inch or less above the knees and hocks)

02-Haired

Market Lamb

1. Ewes shown in Market Lamb Show are not eligible to be entered in the Breeding or Wether Dam Lamb Shows. **NO REFUNDS.**
2. Market lambs must be entered by scrapie tag and have tags in one ear.
3. Market Lambs will be weighed and broken into classes to be determined by Show Chairman.
4. All market lambs will be shown slick shorn. Wool longer than 1/4 inch will not be allowed.

5. No ram lamb will be shown in this show.

Class

01 – Market Lamb

Breeding Lamb

1. Ewes shown in the Breeding Lamb Show are not eligible to be entered in the Market or Wether Dam Lamb Shows. **NO REFUNDS**.
2. Registration certificates must be available for inspection at the show and the animals must be wearing the association ear tag.
3. Individuals in lamb classes must have lamb teeth and be born after September 2024. Yearlings may have four permanent teeth.
4. No ram lamb will be shown in this show.

Classes

01 – Yearling ewe
02 – Pair of yearling ewes
03 – Senior ewe lamb, born Sept. 1 to Dec. 31, 2024
04 – Junior ewe lamb, born on or after Jan. 1, 2025
05 – Pair of ewe lambs

Wether Dam Lamb Show

1. Ewes shown in the Wether Dam Lamb Show are not eligible to be entered in the Market or Breeding Lamb Shows. **NO REFUNDS**.
2. Wether Dam Lambs are defined as any crossbred or purebred animal.
3. There is no minimum or maximum weight.
4. Lambs will be slick shorn. Shorn above the knees and hocks.
