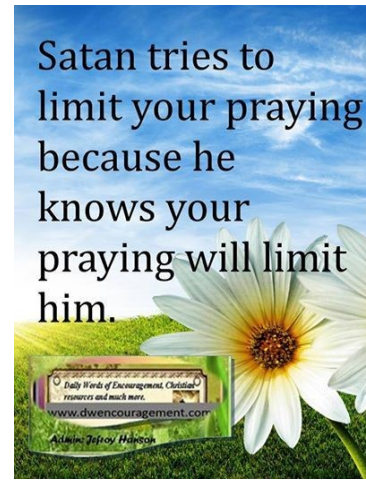

CAMP NEWS

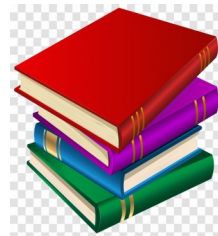
Willette had a safe and fun week at camp. However, some came home with “head colds,” which turned out to be Covid, and others are quarantined.
