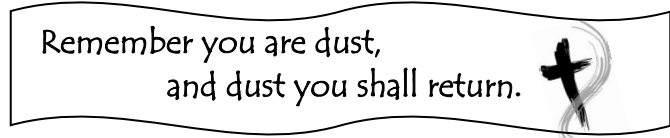

Lent begins this week and we will celebrate Mass on Ash Wednesday at 7:00 am and 5:30 pm at Saint Wenceslaus and at 7:00 pm for Saint John the Baptist parish and Mass will be in Lesterville. Mass times for other parishes in our area are listed on the back of the bulletin. Stations of the Cross will be prayed during Lent at Saint Wenceslaus every Friday at 5:30 pm and for Saint John the Baptist parish at 7:00 pm at whichever church we celebrated Mass at the weekend prior. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence which means that those who are 14 years and older are obliged to eat one normal sized meal and two smaller meals which should not surpass the amount of the normal sized meal when put together. On all Fridays of Lent, Ash Wednesday, and Good Friday we are asked to abstain from meat as well. Lent is also a time when the three practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are recommended. These three practices are oriented to sacrificing something for the benefit of another person. A simple point might be this: when we give something up we can and should put an intention behind it. What I mean by this is that we should link different prayer intentions with the sacrifices we make and we will more likely follow through with them as well.

I know that during Advent and Lent Fr. Jones celebrated Mass in the manner called *ad orientem* (Latin phrase which means to the east) and this is when the priest faces towards the east or what is called liturgical east if the church is built on a north/south axis during different parts of the Mass. This is how Mass was celebrated for centuries until the liturgical reforms after the Second Vatican Council in the mid to late 60s. The change of the priest facing the people during the Mass was not called for or even mandated by the main document (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*) that addressed liturgical reform. I am not saying that we have been doing things wrong since then but I think that there are some advantages to celebrating Mass with the priest facing towards the tabernacle. One of them is that during Mass and most especially at the consecration of the bread and wine, we will see it as the offering that Jesus made at the Last Supper. Another advantage is that when we speak to someone in person we make eye contact with them to show courtesy to them. The prayers that are prayed at the beginning and end of Mass and the Eucharistic Prayer are directed toward God but in our current arrangement the priest who is praying them on behalf of the people is facing the congregation, rather than God. When these prayers are offered with the priest turned toward the tabernacle, the priest is addressing God on the congregation's behalf. During Lent, I plan to celebrate Mass in the manner of *ad orientem* and I will offer the prayers addressed to God while facing the tabernacle. One of the biggest misconceptions about this form of celebrating Mass is that the priest is turning his back on the people. Visually this is what happens but we have to consider that the priest is leading us in prayer. A cartoon on Facebook has been floating around that shows a bus driver facing his passengers instead of facing the direction in which the bus is heading. The same, I hope, is true with how we worship. One of the principal teachings about the sacraments is that the priest acts *in persona Christi* 'in the person of Christ' when he celebrates any of the sacraments and so it is not so much about the priest, but about Jesus.

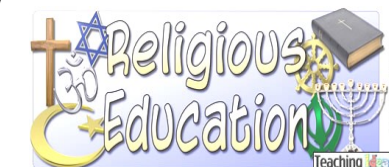
