As We Gather ~ Jesus Is Transfigured and Manifests His Glory

The Lord appeared to Moses in the light of the burning bush (Ex. 3:1–14). Later Moses' face would shine with the light of God's glory when he came down from Mount Sinai (Ex. 34:29–35). At the Transfiguration, Moses and Elijah appeared with the One who is the Light of Light Himself (Matt. 17:1–9). Jesus' glory as God shines with brilliant splendor in and through His human nature. By this epiphany, our Lord confirmed the prophetic word (2 Pet. 1:16–21), revealing that He is the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets. He manifested His majesty as the eternal Son of the Father, and He wonderfully foreshowed our adoption as sons (Collect). We who have been baptized into Christ's body are given a glimpse of the glory that we will share with Him in the resurrection on the Last Day.

Exodus 34:29-35

29When Moses came down from Mount Sinai, with the two tablets of the testimony in his hand as he came down from the mountain, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. 30Aaron and all the people of Israel saw Moses, and behold, the skin of his face shone, and they were afraid to come near him. 31But Moses called to them, and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses talked with them. 32Afterward all the people of Israel came near, and he commanded them all that the LORD had spoken with him in Mount Sinai. 33And when Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil over his face. 34Whenever Moses went in before the LORD to speak with him, he would remove the veil, until he came out. And when he came out and told the people of Israel what he was commanded, 35the people of Israel would see the face of Moses, that the skin of Moses' face was shining. And Moses would put the veil over his face again, until he went in to speak with him.

Scripture Lessons for next Sunday: Exodus 17:1–7, 1 Corinthians 9:24—10:5 and Matthew 20:1–16.

Stewardship: Matthew 17:8 – "And when they lifted up their eyes, they saw no one but Jesus only." Moses and Elijah point to Jesus, speak about Jesus and His sacrifice, and then they are happy to fade into the background. They know that what we need is Jesus. With our eyes focused on Him, and Him alone, the rest of our lives comes into focus. He is primary; all else is secondary. When that order is right in our lives, things truly fall into place. Or as Jesus Himself said, "Seek first the kingdom of God and all these things will be added unto you."

Communion Statement: As we learn from 1 Corinthians, when we commune together we make a confession of our oneness in doctrine and understanding of God's Word. Since those who show publicly that they agree with the teachings believed, taught, and confessed by the Pastor and congregation at which the Sacrament is distributed, we ask that those who are not members in good standing of a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, or one of our sister churches to please refrain from partaking of the Sacrament. Instead, if you would like to receive a blessing, you are more than welcome to come to the altar rail and please indicate you would like to receive a blessing by crossing your arms in front of your chest. A list of church bodies with whom we share Altar and Pulpit fellowship is posted on the bulletin board in the hallway. If you would like to visit about this doctrine and practice, please talk to Pastor or an Elder, For further study on this matter see Matthew 5:23ff, 18:15-35, 26:26-39; Mark 14:22-24; Luke 22:19-20 and 1 Cor. 11:17-34. Liturgical Colors Part (Part V) The Seasons of Epiphany & Pentecost: Green

The liturgical color green symbolizes growth and fulfillment. The season of Epiphany is all about the growth of the Christ child, who was just born at Christmas. Three magi visit this little God incarnate at the Epiphany, but the season goes on to unfold who Jesus is and what he has come to fulfill. At His baptism he says, "Let it be (that I am baptized) now; for it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." (Matt. 3:15) From Christ's baptism onward, we see what the Word Incarnate has come to fulfill; to accomplish for us those things which we never could do for ourselves. He lived a life of perfect obedience on our behalf, suffered unto death for the punishment that we deserve, and rose from the dead to grant us new life. Everything that Christ came to fulfill through the Visitation of the Magi, His Baptism, and His Transfiguration points to his sacrifice on the cross for us.

Having fulfilled all righteousness and having accomplished salvation for all mankind, our Lord delivers the benefits of His cross and resurrection through His Word and Sacraments. The Church, gathered around such gifts, continues to be fed and nourished by her Lord. The season after Pentecost shows that even though Jesus ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father, He is still present with us physically through His means of grace. These gifts not only give us real contact with the risen Christ, but they deliver the forgiveness, life, and salvation won for us from His cross and resurrection. This keeps the Church healthy and strong as we receive these gifts in faith. Green reminds us of the growth and fulfillment that we receive and continues to come to us through the Church. At the font, we began our growth as children of God. Through His Word and Holy Supper we feast on a nutritious banquet that fulfills the promises of Jesus Christ our Lord. Let us "taste and see that the Lord is good!" (Ps. 34:8)
