are likely to prescribe lifestyle changes and may consider adding blood pres-  
sure medications.

Hypertension Stage 2 is when blood pressure is consistently ranging at levels of  
140/90 mm Hg or higher. At this stage of high blood pressure, doctors are  
likely to prescribe a combination of blood pressure medications along with  
lifestyle changes.

Hypertension crisis is when high blood pressure requires medical attention. If  
you blood pressure readings suddenly exceed 180/120 mm Hg, wait five  
minutes and test again. If your readings are still unusually high, contact your  
doctor immediately. You could be experiencing a hypertensive crisis.

9-1-1: If your blood pressure is higher than 180/120 mm Hg and you are experi-  
encing signs of possible organ damage such as chest pain, shortness of  
breath, back pain, numbness/weakness, change in vision, difficulty speak-  
ing, do not wait to see if your pressure comes down on its own. Call 9-1-1!

Get your blood pressure checked soon... I can help with that!

## **PARISH NURSE NEWS**

### **A Message from The American Heart Association**

This month's information is taken from American Heart Association website. High blood pressure (HBP or hypertension) puts your health and quality of life in danger. Left uncontrolled or undetected, high blood pressure can lead to: heart attack, stroke, heart failure, kidney disease or failure, vision loss, sexual dysfunction, angina, and peripheral artery disease.

When your blood pressure is too high for too long, it damages your blood vessels — and LDL (the bad one) cholesterol begins to accumulate along tears in your artery walls. This increases the workload of your circulatory system while decreasing its efficiency. As a result, high blood pressure puts you at greater risk for the development of life-changing and potentially life-threatening conditions.

Your best protection is knowledge, management and prevention: Know your numbers, — the best way to know if you have high blood pressure is to have your blood pressure checked.

Understand the symptoms and risks — Learn what factors could make you more likely to develop high blood pressure and determine your risk for serious medical problems.

Make changes that matter — take steps to reduce your risk and manage blood pressure. Make heart-healthy lifestyle changes, take your medication as prescribed and work in partnership with your doctor.

The five blood pressure ranges as recognized by the American Heart Association are:

Normal blood pressure is when readings are within the normal (optimal) range of less than 120/80 mm Hg. Keep up the good work and stick with heart-healthy habits like following a balanced diet and getting regular exercise. Elevated blood pressure is when readings are consistently ranging from 120-129 systolic and less than 80 mm Hg diastolic. People with elevated blood pressure are likely to develop high blood pressure unless steps are taken to control it.

Hypertension Stage 1 is when blood pressure is consistently ranging from 130-139 systolic or 80-89 mm Hg. At this stage of high blood pressure, doctors

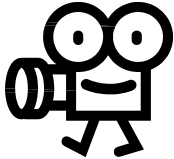

We really appreciate the many cash donations and the food we find in the cart. Special thanks, too, for keeping us in grocery sacks – we go through a lot of them!

During the month of April we helped 82 families which were composed of 168 adults and 149 children. It’s amazing that we continue to add new families daily. We currently have over 400 names in our database as the need continues to grow. Everyone we serve is thankful for the help and usually say so. We have heard “God bless you” many, many times and want you to know that you are a part of this ministry whether you donate time, food, money, or prayers. It’s always interesting at the food pantry. **Please consider** a donation or volunteering for an afternoon shift (like Colleen Jordan did!). Our open hours are Tuesdays and Fridays from 1-4 pm. Both shifts include stocking shelves, inventorying donations, etc., as well as helping our ‘clients’ pick out the food they need.

Our ongoing needs aside from monetary donations are: plastic grocery bags, toilet paper, corn bread/muffin mix, any canned **fruit** or vegetables, canned tuna/ham/chicken, boxed dinner mixes, instant mashed potatoes, **cereal** – almost anything to make a meal. (We are currently loaded with green beans but can use any other vegetable). All food items must be within their “fresh date” per Churches United regulations. We use some of the cash donations to buy fresh milk and eggs. Bread products are donated by Silvis Hy-Vee.

We are so happy to have Jim and Linda Barber back as volunteers and continue to thank Paul Glockhoff and Chuck and Mary Lou Massa for their constant support as well as Pat Wendt who picks up bread from Hy-Vee and Candy Wendt and Betsy Latko who fill in as needed, sometimes on short notice! We also have several faithful volunteers from Gaines Chapel and elsewhere.

Again, thank you all for your support and prayers and please feel free to ask any of us questions you may have.

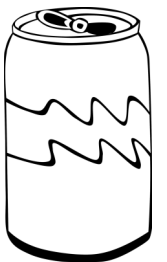
