#### WEALTH DOES'NT ENSURE HAPPINESS

Wisdom 7:7-11; Psalm 90:12-17; Heb. 4: 12-13; Mark 10: 17-30

"...What must I do to inherit eternal life?" I am a rich young man! What must I do to be truly happy? I keep all the commandments! What must I do to have peace of mind? I have never killed anyone! I have never committed adultery! I have never stolen from anyone! I have never bore false witness against anyone! I have never defrauded anyone! Indeed, I worked hard for my riches; thus, I am a wealthy man today. In addition, I also honor and respect my mother and father. I have been very faithful in keeping God's commandments all my life; and I believe that I have done enough to inherit eternal life. I deserve contentment and happiness! The bible tells us that Jesus loved the rich young man and would love him to have eternal life and be happy. Therefore, Jesus said to him, unfortunately, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow Me." In other words, if you truly want to be a follower of Jesus, you must go beyond "observing the commandments," and start practicing them. Gaining eternal life is not all about the bad you did not do, but, more so, it is about the good that you did. St. Ambrose once said, "For he who hears but does not act denies Christ; though he confesses by words he denies by deeds."

Disappointingly, the young man who was apparently searching for happiness went away sad because he could not take on the challenge of Jesus for total renunciation. The lesson here for you and me is about the choices and decisions we have to make in life. It is about the fact that as Christians, our life styles must always witness to real values that lead to true happiness. Undoubtedly, this young man was a very good man. He was a nice man by all standards, and loved God as much as he said he did. He was a respectable man - true, he may not have harmed anyone physically, but neither did he compel himself to be positively and sacrificially generous with his wealth. Unfortunately, there are many Christians, who, like the rich young man, are very faithful in keeping the commandments and regulations but are lagging behind in administering love, peace and justice to the poor and the disadvantaged in today's society.

The challenge for you and me during this "Year of Faith" is "hold fast to our confession," by preferring God's wisdom "to scepter and throne, and (to) deem riches nothing in comparison with her." so that we can be rewarded now and will possess "eternal life in the age to come." Our faith must inspire us to believe and accept that the renunciation of wealth is not an end in itself but only a precondition to following Christ. You and I ought to physically and emotionally detach ourselves from our possessions if we truly want to be followers of Christ, rather than His admirers. Admirers of Christ are those who love Christ - go to church - keep the commandments - receive the sacraments - Have caused no physical harm to anyone - would love to be buried by the church: but would not donate extra time, talents and/or treasures for the general good of the community. On the contrary, followers of Christ are those "who have given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or lands for My sake and for the sake of the gospel." Such persons will "receive a hundred times more now in this present age...and eternal life in the age to come."

During this "Year of Faith," open your heart to trusting and depending solely on God, and I guarantee you will forever have the courage to let go of things and dispositions that have no intrinsic values.

# THE JOY OF BELIEVING


"...They called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how He had opened the door of faith..."(Acts 14:27).



During this Year of Faith which began this past Thursday, October 11, 2012, the Church seeks to strengthen her faith by returning more fully to the sources of our faith. There we rediscover the treasures of the faith that have been passed down to us from the apostles. In "going back to the sources," the Church looks first to the person of Jesus Christ, source and summit of our faith, especially as He is found in the Scriptures and the Eucharist. "We must rediscover a taste for feeding ourselves on the Word of God, faithfully handed down by the Church, and on the bread of life offered as sustenance for His Disciples," our Holy Father tells us (*Porta Fidei*: 3).

We are also invited to study the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, as a major resource for increase in the knowledge of our faith. Of particular importance for this Holy Year is the Second Vatican Council, which the Pope reminds us is "the great grace bestowed on the Church in the twentieth century." The sixteen documents produced by the Council should be a particular object of study during this time, for in them the Church will find "a sure compass by which to take our bearings in the century now beginning" (*Porta Fidei*: 5). It is through contact with these sources during this year that we can hope to bear the fruit of a mature faith.





Remember to invite your family and pray the Rosary with them each and every day throughout the month of October. By praying the Rosary you are requesting the intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary for the protection of your family and for the faith and strength to accept any hardship

you may be encountering in life. Please make a special effort to say the Rosary with your fellow parishioners after the 9 a.m. Masses or with your family at home.
