April Reflection

John 19:30, "When Jesus had received the wine, he said, 'It is finished.' Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit."

Failure is such an ugly word. It carries with it such a sting, such an unbelievable ambiance that it is often hard for me to even voice such a word. I don't like to confront my failures, though like any person I have many. I have personal failures, small like forgetting to pack my kids lunch, to big ones like not being there for someone when they needed me. While I can sit back and look at these failures now through the rosecolored glasses of memory, every time I am reminded of my failure that cold wave of regret washes over me.

I have often wondered how the disciples felt in those days and hours after the crucifixion of Jesus. There is no other way to describe their time in Jerusalem outside of abject failure. These men marched down with Jesus straight into Jerusalem surrounded by the crowds of people who were joyously cheering on Jesus. They were there when the crowd spontaneously broke out in song singing Psalm 118, "Hosanna, Hosanna, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord." They laid their coats down, laid their palm branches down, it was an exciting event.

Little did the disciples know this celebration would soon end. At a supper Jesus took a loaf of bread blessed and broke it with them, and told them to eat for this was his body broken for the world. He took a cup, blessed it, and told them this was the cup of the new covenant poured out for them and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Then he ominously said, "I will not eat with you again this side of the grave." Who could imagine the swirl of emotions that the disciples felt in this moment?

It wasn't long before old Judas, pockets flush with thirty pieces of silver, and the temple guard took Jesus away. He was held before a kangaroo court, sentenced to death. With Pilate washing his hands, the bloodthirsty mob had their way. Jesus was crucified.

The disciples wouldn't know when exactly it happened, they weren't there, they were hiding, scared that if they were identified as having been with Jesus that a cross bearing their names would soon be planted in the ground. Only the women were at the foot of the cross. And as Jesus called out, "It is finished." It really was.

Hope was finished, love was finished, the mission of the disciples was finished, the purpose they felt following Jesus around was finished. You would be hard pressed to call the trip to Jerusalem anything but an abject failure. The disciples knew it too. I don't know if you have ever suffered a crushing defeat. I'd be

willing to venture a bet most of us have, you know the emptiness that resides in the pit of your stomach, the despair, and the daze that accompany failure.


Whatever failures we have suffered, and the emotions that come along with them, were but a fraction of what the disciples felt in that upper room. Jesus was supposed to be the conquering Messiah, he was supposed to throw the Romans out, but from on top of the cross he proclaimed, "It is finished."

Yet, I want us to know that failure doesn't have the last word, regret and despair is not the story of life. Easter Sunday morning three women ran breathlessly into the upper room and proclaimed the seven words that are the cornerstone of the gospel, "He is not here, he is risen." Now it did take the disciples several minutes to believe that the news could be true, but with the resurrection of Jesus, all the failure the disciples felt was quickly turned on its head. Where they were dejected, now they were elated, where they were hopeless now, they were hopeful.

It is a profound message for us as Christians to cling to. We are a people of resurrection; we do not believe that failure gets to define us. We believe that the cross is God's eternal "yes" to all the "no" of the world. That's why we celebrate the way we do on Easter, but we must not forget that while Easter is a day, resurrection is a way of life. As you move forward from the glow of Easter, may you cling fast to the hope God has so blessed you with, and may you always remember you are more than your failures, you are more than your regrets, you are a child of the resurrection, and you always have hope.
