NCRWF Campaign Precinct Operations by Waskah Whelan


Did you know...over the first six months of 2017, the Republican National Committee pulled in \$75 million, nearly twice as much money as the Democratic National Committee, which raised \$38 million? The Democrat Party is \$3.5 million in the red while the Republicans are out-raising the Dems by 2 to 1. Republicans have quietly taken a big edge over Democrats when it comes to small-dollar fundraising, In an effort to take back the House and Senate and regain their voter appeal, the Democrat leaders have latched onto a new set of ideas to attract voters: free college tuition, raising the minimum wage to \$15, and Medicare for all. 

CHAPLAIN'S REPORT November 2017

"Stay with me, do not be afraid, for he who seeks my life seeks your life; for you are safe with me.

I Samuel 22.23

For those of you at the September meeting: We are fine, nothing was taken & no one was hurt. We told the Gardaí & the hotel that we were extremely honored that we were able to have come 5,124 miles to have a special adventure!

Now, how to relate our adventure to NCRWF & a chaplain report. It relates to sight & sound; details & listening. Those two items don't always get the best attention in our lives.

We "hear" but don't always listen to the statements, sounds, or tones of the situation. We don't listen for underlying things: fear, confusion, deceit. When a friend talks to you, are you using eye contact or are you checking email? Do you override the dialogue with listening for your text ringer? On a phone call with emotions, do you hear the background noise that can bring you to your friend faster?

We "look" but don't always see. We glance at the guy in the hoodie. Did you see the sadness in the friends face & eyes or did you notice the waitress pouring coffee? Did you watch how they described their most special moment or again, did you look at your emails & texts?

My challenge to you is to be more watchful & soundful in your life. I'm not saying that I am perfect (God & most of you know I'm not even close) but I try really hard to watch, see, hear anything I can. I walk at night & I listen for noises. I look at people that I pass & try to glean all the detail I can. With that said, Rick felt pity for the uninvited guest at our home as I could describe him head to toe, the lack of smoke or alcohol smell, & his voice. God is our ultimate protector but He does need us to hone our skills to assist in our own protection.

Again, we're fine, nothing was taken & no one was hurt (except the visitor that within 24 hours had been found, arrested, charged, & arraigned & four days later in court & now in jail serving his sentence.)
