Lent/Easter Schedule

This year, 2017, Easter Sunday will be April 16. This means that the 40 day season of preparation which we call Lent will begin on Wednesday, March 1. That day, "Ash Wednesday" is traditionally observed as a fast day and received its name from the custom of marking a worshiper's forehead with ashes to signify repentance. (There are actually 46 days between April 16 and March 1, but the 6 Sundays are not counted because they are feast, not fast, days.)

As in years past, we have several special opportunities for worship and study during this time:

- March 5 7-9am, our sanctuary will be open for individual meditation and prayer.
- Wednesdays, March 8 through April 12 10 am-12pm, a study sponsored by the Women of Hebron Lutheran Church.

Maya Powell Places First with a Controversial Subject

Madison Presbyterian's own Maya Powell is an award -winning public speaker! I had the opportunity to interview her after church one Sunday about her recent First Place at the Woodberry Forest Tournament held on February 4th.

The MCHS Forensics Team is well known in our area for their excellence in public speaking. Maya is in the 8th grade, so this has been her first year on the team of about 13 students in grades 8 through 12. The team meets 2 or 3 times a week, or every day when a tournament is coming up. Exercises include "hallway" - talking to the walls to work on better projection, vocal warm-ups, and enunciation practice.



I learned that Forensics competitions encompass both *Extemporaneous* (or "Extemp") speaking, which means the delivering of a speech that is either persuasive or informative in nature on topics that may be assigned on-the-spot, and *Declamation*, which is the delivering of a speech that was previously written and delivered by another person, then interpreted in an interesting and convincing manner that fits the individual competitor.

For Maya's award-winning *Declamation* presentation she chose a speech by Ivan Coyote, a 40 year old transgender man, entitled "Why We Need Gender-Neutral Bathrooms". Maya chose a difficult topic that has been receiving a good deal of media attention recently. She told me that it's a very important issue and that she feels passionate about it. To quote Maya, "This is is something we need to do. I'm the next generation. We can make the world better for people who come after us."

Maya said "I only took 5th place in my first tournament, so I really worked hard to do better at this one". I have a feeling we will be hearing a lot more from Maya over her high school career with the MCHC Forensics Team. As she told me, "If I can touch one person's heart then I've done my job as a speaker".

Please bring in your donations and place them in the container provided in the Narthex.




