Pastor's Cause to Pause

What do Lutheran's Believe? ... "about baptism"

As I began to plan confirmation for this year's students, I wonder how much you remember from your own confirmation classes. You might like to know that I don't require confirmads to learn the books of the Bible. They should already know them. Our Sunday School teachers do a great job teaching our youngest

disciples Bible stories and also the books of the Bible. When students come to confirmation, they are taught a deeper meaning of the books of the Bible and that the Bible is "the written Word of God. Inspired by God's Spirit speaking through their authors, they record and announce God's revelation centering in Jesus Christ. Through them God's Spirit speaks to us to create and sustain Christian faith and fellowship for service in the world." It is Holy Scripture that teaches Lutherans why we baptize... because Jesus said so!

- ¹⁵And he said to them, "Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation. ¹⁶The one who believes and is baptized will be saved; but the one who does not believe will be condemned. (Mark 16:15-16)
- ¹⁹Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age. (Matthew 28:19-20)
- ¹Our baptism is connected to Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. ²By no means! How can we who died to sin go on living in it? ³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. (Romans 6:2-4)
- 35Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. 36As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?" 38He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. 39When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. (Acts 8:35-39)

Successfully completing confirmation classes means the students have an understanding of the importance of Holy Baptismalong with Holy Communion and Holy Scripture. The students will be able to articulate their faith. They will demonstrate a life of servanthood by serving during worship, as well as, in the life of the church. In other words, they know the importance of living out their faith in a lifelong discipline of being a disciple of Christ!

ADOPTION OF MINUTES: The minutes for the July council meeting were accepted.

The Property Board recommends that we schedule an outage with Dominion Energy to disconnect and remove the defective surge protector in main panel, and install I-line circuit breaker and new surge protector in main panel, not to exceed a cost of \$2,100. **Passed**

OLD BUSINESS:

Farming Church: Information from listening groups has been compiled, and sorted. The 5 initiatives have been established, and feedback given to Ministry Teams. Proposed meeting on Sunday, September 8 after Sunday school to present this information to the congregation. Tables from each ministry board will be set up as well. A meal will be provided funded by Specialty meals fund.

Motion made for Congregational forum to be held on September 8 to present findings and initiatives from Farming Church listening groups. **Passed**

Motion made to hold September Council meeting following the forum. Passed

- 2. Cemetery Upkeep- Committee is meeting with another potential provider, and quotes are being gathered.
- 3. Safety Committee- Working on developing team training, procedures, and policies.

Motion made for Mt. Hermon to contribute \$1,000 and participate in Oktoberfest. **Passed**


