To meet the needs of our Veterans and their families, we have two (2) plans to expand the cemetery. The first is a 13 acre expansion project that will yield additional preplaced crypts for casket burial; in-ground cremation inurnment and Columbarium niche for above ground placement

of cremated remains. The second major project is scheduled in 2018. When fully developed, SVNC will be a 561 acre facility with the expectation of providing burial needs of our veterans and their families until the year 2050.
