

St. Leo the Great, pope of Rome (461). St. Agapitus, Bishop of Synnada in Phrygia (4th c.). Readings: Epistle: 1 Corinthians 8:8-9:2 • Gospel: Matthew 25:31-46



On Sunday of the Last Judgment, we read in the Gospel lesson from Matthew 25:31-46, the conditions upon which Jesus Christ will judge us. We see, therefore, the conditions of the reward for our righteousness. We see what we must do in our lives on earth and are challenged to undertake a lifestyle, which will bring us to eternal life on the day of Jesus Christ's Second Coming -- the day of universal and eternal resurrection. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave Me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed Me, I was naked and you clothed Me, I was sick and you visited Me, I was in prison and you came to Me. Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these, My brethren, you did it to Me. -- Matthew 25:35-36, 40 On this we are judged. By recognizing Christ in those around us and by treating them accordingly, we attain salvation. We see Christ. We see ourselves. We return to the Father who shows us His Son in the least of our brothers and sisters. *(Fr. Thomas Hopko)*

(A few more words about sin) Sin is the absence of love, it is separation and isolation. When Christ comes to judge the world, His criterion for judgment will be love. Christian love entails seeing Christ in other people, our family, our friends, and everyone else we may encounter in our lives. We shall be judged on whether we have loved, or not loved, our neighbor. We show Christian love when we feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, visit those who are sick or in prison. If we did such things for the least of Christ's brethren, then we also did them for Christ (Mt.25:40). If we did not do such things for the least of the brethren, neither did we do them for Christ (Mt.25:45). (Father Alexander Schmemann, Great Lent (Ch. 1:4),

What we must do

(From the Lenten Triodion – Sunday of the Last Judgment) Knowing the commandments of the Lord, let us conduct our lives in this way:
let us nourish the hungry, let us give drink to the thirsty; let us clothe the naked, let us welcome the strangers; let us visit the sick, the infirm, and those in prison, so that He Who is coming to judge the whole earth, may say to us: "Come, O blessed ones of My Father, inherit the Kingdom which has been prepared for you!"


From Matins Verses from Canticle (Ode) 3




