## ORDINARY TIME (January 10 - February 21, 2023)

rdinary Time encompasses that part of the liturgical year that does not fall within the distinctive seasons of Advent. Christmas. Lent, and Easter. The Catholic Church celebrates two periods of the year as Ordinary Time: the first following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continuing until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday; the second following Pentecost Sunday until the evening before Advent. There are about 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time, depending on the year. In actuality, however, there are fewer Sundays of Ordinary Time because major feasts honouring the Trinity, Corpus Christi, Christ the King, and others replace a particular Sunday of Ordinary Time. It is important to remember that Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects".

## Sunday Theme

The first reading from the book of Sirach L today says, "If you choose, you can keep the commandments, and they will save you". In the Gospel, as Jesus continues to deliver his Sermon on the Mount, we hear the same message. God offers us life, but it is we who choose the way we live. As followers of Jesus Christ, we are to try continually to live by the law of love, forgiving those who hurt us and avoiding judging the hearts of others. Only then will we live our lives as summarized in the two fundamental commands on which all else depends: love of God and love of neighbour.



# LAST YEAR'S PALMS

W e are approaching the beginning of the Season of Lent. Ash Wednesday is February 22<sup>nd</sup>. The ashes that will be used to mark the beginning of Lent come from the branches blessed and distributed last Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. We are

inviting parishioners to bring the branches taken home last year to the Church (or the Parish Office) so that they may be burned and used in this Ash Wednesday Liturgy.

#### FEBRUARY 14 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT CYRIL, MONK, AND SAINT METHODIUS, BISHOP:

Brothers Constantine (later known as Cyril) and Methodius were born in Thessalonika, Greece, in the ninth century. They became missionaries and are sometimes called the Apostles to the Slavs. Both worked to make the Liturgy and the Scriptures available in the vernacular. Methodius was eventually consecrated a Bishop. In 1980 Pope John Paul II declared Cyril and Methodius patrons of Europe.

FEBRUARY 17 - MEMORIAL OF THE SEVEN HOLY FOUNDERS OF THE SERVITE ORDER: The Order of Servites, a religious community relying solely on charity for support, was founded in 1240. Between 1225 and 1227, seven men from the city of Florence, Italy, joined the Confraternity of the Blessed Virgin. Inspired by visions of Our Lady, they decided to dedicate themselves to lives of prayer and service. Later they withdrew to a deserted mountain where they built a Church and a hermitage, living a life of extreme austerity and becoming known as the Servants of Mary, or Servites. Of the original seven, all but one became Priests. Only the lay brother, who lived to be 110, saw the order fully recognized in 1304.
