CATECHETICAL AFFIRMATION

Honor your father and mother. What does this mean?

We are to fear and love God, so that we neither despise nor anger our parents and others in authority, but instead honor, serve, obey, love, and respect them.

You shall not murder. What does this mean?

We are to fear and love God, so that we neither endanger nor harm the lives of our neighbors, but instead help and support them in all of life's needs.

You shall not commit adultery. What does this mean?

We are to fear and love God, so that we lead purer and decent lives in word and deed, and each of us loves and honors his or her spouse.

You shall not steal. What does this mean?

We are to fear and love God, so that we neither take our neighbor's money or property nor acquire them by using shoddy merchandise or crooked deals, but instead help them to improve and protect their property and income. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. What does this mean? We are to fear and love God, so that we do not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations. Instead we are to come to their defense, speak well of them and interpret everything they do in the best possible light.





INVITATION TO COMMUNION


Christ invites you to a place of honor at this banquet. Welcome to the feast.




