You said today that this was the first class you've taught, and I would like to say congratulations. I can't imagine that being a student yourself had made teaching this any easier. I appreciate all the time and effort you put into making the slides, and being available for office hours. The cohesion between the lectures and the tutorials was great. One thing I would change though is use the chalkboard more to breakdown complex topics. It really did help more to see the process of the variables or research being shown, rather than it just being on the screen. As well, for more "difficult" topics it would have helped to have it explained a little more clearly, for example when we were learning about spurious relationships, it would have been helpful to see it using a real life example and not just A's and B's and X's. I wish you good luck with your other classes! Thanks for a great semester.

For this being your first class teaching, I was very surprised. I have had and still have profs. who have been teaching for 1-3 semesters only and you are a much better prof than they are in these ways: relating course material to practical + well-understood examples, relating material to real-world problems + relevant personal anecdotes. You explain tricky material very well. Maybe take a bit more time explaining fundamentals, relating topics to other topics in order to make connections. Powerpoints are very well set-up and easy to understand. Course material including slides, assignments, and tutorial articles are always posted/emailed on time and organized. Assignment questions are generally good + clear + concise. Often new profs I've had are very shy + have trouble being there for students, but from what I've heard that's not the case here. For a very new professor, you teach like you've had experience.

He has an authoritative knowledge on the subject. Given his age, humility and willingness to cooperate with

students, he in the future will stand in a good stead as a prominent professor in political science.

This professor is proof of how he wants to see his class excellence. He is great during office hours and engages with the class. When I first came to his class I was scared about the content, but during class and during his office hours he made me feel really comfortable with the subject and is a big reason why I am excelling in this course. Professor Gavin truly cares about his students and he is not there just for the sake of lecturing. My favorite professor at Carleton so far.

Assignment questions can sometimes be confusing and unclear.

Professor Gavin is a great teacher who presents the material in a concise format that is generally understandable. The questions presented in assignments and exams could be clearer in intention but is good overall. He does have some presentation issues though as he can adopt a overly paternalistic attitude. Although this works with some students learning, others my find it slightly degrading or be resistant to the overall message, as a result of it. A good way of overcoming this would be to change some speech mannerisms. All this being said Professor Gavin, especially for his first time teaching, is a friendly, honest professional who has extraordinary potential has a professor.

I was extremely shocked to hear this was his first year teaching. He does an excellent job in explaining concepts clearly and ensuring everyone understands, and he makes it very clear he is always available for office hours. He is an amazing proff!

Materials which were taught in class were well taught. However, the application of these materials to assignments was weak sometimes. Assignment often didn't clarify pertinent information. Questions of assignment were often vague making it difficult for students to achieve all marks. For example, TA's would sometimes expect tables for further explanation when the prompt only asked for an explanation.

Sometimes you skip through the slides too quickly.

This was the first class this professor taught and it was very obvious that this was the fact. I found that he had trouble gauging difficulty of course material throughout the entirety of the course and the course average suffered because of it. Also, after speaking with many of my fellow students, we all went into assignments and tests thinking that we knew what we were doing yet we received horrible marks. Clearly there was a gap in the information that was communicated to us and the actual material. I also found that he had very little grasp on the work of his TA's and was unaware of the issues in grading and their inability to answer questions. When I would ask my TA for feedback their response was "it's just wrong". This isn't math, you can't simply be wrong, there is a reason why it is wrong and if you can't answer that you shouldn't be taking marks away or you shouldn't be teaching the class. And I feel that it is up to the professor to be monitoring the work of the TA's to avoid these issues. There were also many conflicting answers to questions between the professor and the TA which left me and other students confused as to what was correct. Overall, my experience in this course was a horrible one.

Michael is very clear, thorough and comprehensible. He did everything in his power to making learning and understanding comprehensible and consistently strived to find the right balance between too easy and too hard. My only suggestion would be to test predominantly on course material rather than specific textbook lines, but overall this class was very enjoyable and I did not mind attending this 8:30am Friday morning class at all.
