February Reflection

Psalm 51:3 "For I know my transgressions and my sin is ever before me."

There was a book, perhaps you have come by it in your devotional life, it is called "Whatever became of sin," it is a fascinating little read, and at the end of the book the author, kind of ends where he began. He says, "I don't hear about sin much anymore, and I don't know why. We still have violence, greed, infidelity, lying, stealing, and oppression of the poor. We have inequality in so many things, so what happened? Is it just that we don't call it sin anymore or are we just used to it?"

To me that is a terrifying little question, the thought that we could get so used to sin that it could become so common place, that we could just accept it. Of course, I don't have a good answer to that question either, I don't know what became of sin, but I do know what can become of sin. Psalm 51 makes clear what the consequences of our sins are.

There is a bit of a back story to Psalm 51, it comes at a turning point in the life of King David. A war was raging in Israel, it wasn't going quite like the people planned, David who was supposed to be the conquer wasn't making the best moves and the Israelites were losing ground. In the midst of this tumultuous time, David had a meeting with a dear friend and prophet by the name of Nathan.

Nathan came to David with a problem, and since he wasn't doing very well trying to stave off Philistine aggression, perhaps if he could solve Nathan's problem, he could earn back some good will. Nathan says to David there were two men in a certain village. One man was exceedingly rich, the other exceedingly poor. Well, the rich man had sheep all over the hillside, covered it up white as snow, you couldn't count all his sheep that's how many he had. The poor man had one sheep; it was a little sheep that had been rejected by its mother. But the poor man loved this sheep, feed it with a bottle, nursed it to health. It wasn't much; that little sheep but it was his.

The rich man had some friends come over, and he wanted to treat them to a fine dinner, and he went to go get a sheep to slaughter. Only he didn't take one from his house, he took the sheep from the poor man and slaughtered it for the feast.

Well David was incensed he said, this greedy man stole a sheep and slaughtered it, stole from this poor man and slaughtered his sheep. Well David said I have never in my life heard of something so egregious, point me in the direction of that man I will set it right, I'm going to take four hundred of his sheep and give them to the poor man. That is not how we treat one another in Israel.

Old Nathan said to David, "You are that man." Of course, I think David knew, he had to know. It was on his mind night and day. Oh, he remembered the details, it was spring early on in the war. David had come back to Jerusalem for a little rest and relaxation, turned management of the troops over to his generals. It was during this break in combat he looked out of his window and saw a woman.

He brings her to the palace, she couldn't do anything about it, who is she? She is a no one the king invited her over. She becomes pregnant. David sends for her soldier husband to come home. Of course, her husband Uriah is a good solider, he refuses to play along with David's plan to cover up his misdeeds. Uriah says, "I can't go out to dinner with my wife, or sleep in my bed, or take in any comfort of home, when my fellow soldiers are out sleeping on the ground, eating the measly rations that they have, just wishing they could come home." David's plan A didn't work out.

So he opted for plan B. He sends word to Uriah's commander to have Uriah's troop moved to the front to take the city. And when Uriah is out in front, the other soldiers are to fall back leaving Uriah vulnerable and exposed. Well it isn't long before word comes back, "Uriah has been killed." The king comforts the poor widow and marries her.


Nathan says to David, "you are that man." Samuel tells us that David fell prostrate, would not be consoled and then he prayed Psalm 51. "My sin is always in front of me, I wake up with it; I go to bed with it. It is against you God that I sinned. If you withdraw from me, I will become an animal. I'll be nothing, don't turn your back on me. Clean me up. Give me a clean spirit. Forgive me."

On Wednesday, February 14 at 6:30p.m., we will have our Ash Wednesday service at the church. Ash Wednesday is a time in which we are encouraged to be honest about our sin, and we mark this journey with the sign of the cross in ashes on our foreheads. It is a time when we resist the temptation to relativize our sin and say, "Everyone does it," and instead to proclaim, "Without the forgiveness of God I would be nothing more than a wild animal." As we journey ever closer to the wilderness of Lent, I hope you will accept the challenge of this season, I pray that you will look inward, that you won't brush off your sin, and that you will faithfully turn to God and ask for forgiveness.
