In 2017 we presented \$9,250.00 to 3 High School Seniors and 8 College students continuing their education.

Since 1964, through the generosity of the residents and friends of Houghs Neck we have been able offer 500 book awards presented, to over 323 kids receiving from \$50.00 to \$1,250.00 for a grand total of \$249,325

The Quincy Police Marine Unit, in partnership with the Massachusetts Environmental Police, will be presenting a Basic Boating Safety Course at no cost to the public. These courses are designed for persons 12 years old and up, regardless of boating skill.

Courses are nationally approved, and course completion will allow persons to legally operate a boat in states requiring Basic Boating Safety Courses. Everyone who completes the course will be issued a Basic Boating Safety Certificate. All graduates in the 12 through 15 yearold age group will be legally allowed to operate a motorboat without adult supervision. The same is true for 16 and 17 year old youth who wish to operate a personal watercraft (jet ski, wave runner, etc.) In addition, some insurance companies offer policy discounts for customers that complete a Basic Boating Safety Course.

Dear Houghs Neck Residents,

As I write this, the House of Representatives is in the midst of debating the Fiscal Year 2019 state The House Committee budget. on Ways and Means state budget recommendation is \$46.361 billion. This is a 3.1% increase from Fiscal Year 2018. Of the \$46.361 billion, \$4.615 billion is by law required to fund the school building assistance fund, the MBTA and the state pension liability. The \$40.983 billion remaining funds the remainder of the budget.

State revenue can be summed up in two categories: state generated tax revenue and non-state generated revenue. The state tax revenue is projected to be \$27.847 billion, and includes the income tax, excise tax and corporate tax. Non-state tax generated revenue is projected to be \$18.415, and includes federal reimbursements, federal grants, settlements and awards from lawsuits, state fines, state fees and the state lottery. The largest federal reimbursement is MassHealth (Medicaid/Medicare), which is \$8.105 billion. The state did see a large tax revenue collection in December (\$892 million above fiscal year 2018 projections), but this was in response to large income and corporate taxpayers deferring their state taxes until the passage of the federal tax reform law. We did not include this as part of our FY 2019 revenue projection calculations and decided to use the more conservative 3.1% revenue increase.

This year the two biggest parts of the state budget are MassHealth (Medicare/Medicaid) and Local Aid for cities and towns. MassHealth makes up 41% of the budget, or \$16.210 billion. Fortunately, enrollment of MassHealth has increased only very slightly from the previous year. Local aid to cities and towns includes the combination of unrestricted financial assistance (\$1.098 billion) and Chapter 70 education funding (\$4.871 billion), which together make up 14% of the budget. The City of Quincy saw an increase of 3.5% in unrestricted financial assistance (\$19,743,316) and 2.6% in Chapter 70 education funding (\$27,326,446).

This year there is a focus on increasing funding for substance abuse treatment and mitigation, mental health and persons with disabilities. The Bureau of Substance Abuse Addiction Services is funded at \$137.1 million, which includes funding for 5 new recovery centers. Another \$5 million has been allocated specifically for jail diversion programs towards community based treatment. The Department of Mental Health budget has been increased by 12.6% to \$870 million. It will fully fund the Massachusetts Child Psychiatry Access Program and the Adult Community Clinical Services. In the disabilities community there is an \$8.5 million funding increase for community day and employment training. The Children's Autism Waiver is funded at \$5 million. Additionally, an Office of Health Equity would be established to work to eliminate racial and ethnic health care disparities across the Commonwealth. Lastly, we were able to build on our Stabilization "Rainy Day" Fund by increasing it to \$1.463 billion.

Inresponse to the State Police overtime scandal, three special provisions were added to the state budget. A special audit unit would be established to conduct an internal audit of the State Police by the Inspector General. A special legislative commission chaired by the co-chairs of the Joint Committee on Public Service would be established, with members including: the co-chairs of the Joint Committee on Public Safety and Homeland Security; a designee from the Caucus of Women Legislators, the Black and Latino Legislative Caucus, and Asian American Legislative Caucus; the state police colonel; the State Police Association; and a member from each of the four women and minority law enforcement associations.

This year exactly 1,400 amendments have been filed. I have been receiving a consistent stream of emails, phone calls, and letters from constituents, interest groups, and other Representatives requesting support or opposition to various amendments. This has been ongoing for the past two weeks and my office is working to track each individual request and comment.

I wish you all a safe Memorial Day. Thank you to all those who made the ultimate sacrifice and to all the families whose loved ones died in defense of the freedoms we enjoy today.

Norfolk County Register of Deeds William P. O'Donnell today reminded homeowners about the importance of filing for Homestead protection.

Under Massachusetts law, a Homestead recording provides for limited protection against the forced sale of an individual's primary residence to satisfy unsecured debt up to \$500,000.

"For most people, their home is the most important financial asset they have," noted Register O'Donnell. "If you own a home, and it is your primary residence, one way to protect it is to file a Homestead. The Homestead law also allows for the filing of an Elderly Homestead application, which defines an elder as a person who is 62 years of age or older. This protection can be increased if the elderly couple files jointly."

O'Donnell further stated, "The Homestead Law was significantly enhanced by an act of the Massachusetts Legislature back in 2011. Language in the new law states a valid Homestead cannot be terminated when refinancing a mortgage. Other changes include wording which states that a Homestead can provide protections for a primary home even if it is kept in trust. The definition of a primary residence has been further expanded to include a manufactured or mobile home."

While a Homestead provides important protections for consumers, it is important to note there are certain debts that are exempted from protection under the Homestead Act. These include federal, state and local tax liens, as well as mortgages contracted for the purchase of a primary home and nursing home liens. Most other mortgages, debts, and encumbrances existing prior to the filing of the Declaration of Homestead, along with probate court executions for spousal and child support, are also not covered under the Homestead protection statute.

Homestead recordings can be filed at the Registry of Deeds for a state imposed fee of \$36.00. To find out more about the Homestead law, or

Register O'Donnell concluded, "A Homestead protects consumers against the forced sale of their primary owned residence to satisfy unsecured debt up to \$500,000. While the debt is still owed, homeowners will at least have the comfort of knowing that with a Homestead filed at the Registry of Deeds, their primary residence cannot be forcibly sold to satisfy most debts."

The American Legion **Houghs Neck Post 380**

The year was 1956, the place Houghs Neck, Massachusetts. The unconditional surrender of Japan had put an end of World War II eleven years earlier and the Armistice between North and South Korea had been just three years previous. Although there were many full time "Neckers", Houghs Neck was in full swing of its metamorphosis in converting the many summer cottages into year round residences.

During the previous winter of 1955 there had been a discussion amongst the veterans of Houghs Neck to form an American Legion Post. The American Legion, National Organization, was chartered in 1919 and was but a mere 36 years old at the time. On August 13, 1956, at 8:30 p.m., an installation of officers was held at the Bay View Rollerway, 1280 Sea Street in Houghs Neck. Seventy three veterans, seventy two men and one woman, most of them residents of Houghs Neck, became chartered members of the The American Legion, Department of Massachusetts, Houghs Neck Post

A number of years ago the Post fell on financial hard times and was forced to sell its building to pay off its debt. However, we never stopped serving our community and veterans. Houghs Neck Post 380 continues to support many of The American Legion programs and events in our community. In addition to these programs, we also participate in the Quincy Memorial Day and Veterans Day Parade, as well as, the placing of wreaths on Memorial Day to honor our local fallen veterans, at the various parks and locations throughout Houghs Neck, Adams Shore and Germantown.

One of The American Legion program we support is Boys State. High school juniors are selected by local American Legion Posts to attend the program. Participants are exposed to the rights and privileges, the duties and the responsibilities of a franchised citizen. The training is objective and practical with city, county and state governments operated by the students elected to the various offices. Activities include legislative sessions, court proceedings, law enforcement presentations, assemblies, bands, chorus and recreational programs.




