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Greetings to all my fellow Sons members,

I hope this article finds you well and on good terms, but if not, please know that we Sons are here for you. If you yourself or your post home have been damaged by declared natural disasters, this program can help you with financial or personal item needs until you are back on your feet. In this article, I'll tell you what you need to do as well as the requirements to receive the assistance. Most of the information provided here comes directly from the National American Legion website at www.legion.org/emergency.

The Preamble to our Constitution sums up our theme of the National Emergency Fund "...devotion to mutual helpfulness." This is more than just simple words, it's our pledge of support to Legionnaires and their families. Since the early '20's, The American Legion has been actively involved in meeting the needs of both the community and members in the wake of disasters such as the hurricanes in Missouri, Florida, Louisiana and other Southern states; tornadoes in Iowa last summer and other upper Midwest areas; floods in Texas a few years ago in the Houston area; earthquakes in California and wildfires also in California, Nevada and the great Yellowstone fires in Wyoming, Montana and parts of Eastern Idaho.

The National Emergency Fund, created in 1989 in response to Hurricane Hugo, has provide more than \$8 million in direct financial aid to American Legion family members and post homes. By providing this monetary help, the N.E.F. has stopped affected post homes from shutting its doors for good and allowed American Legion Family members to recoup from tragedy.

The fund provides up to \$3,000 for qualified Legion Family members and up to \$10,000 for Legion post homes. The eligibility requirements are as follows:

1. The applicant must have been displaced from their primary residence due to damages caused by a declared natural disaster.
2. The applicant must submit copies of all receipts of items required to meets right away needs such as temporary housing, food, water, diapers, clothing etc. during the period immediately following the declared natural disaster.
3. The members membership must be active at the time of the disaster and also at the time of the application.

The changes made last year in when & where we decide the following year's Camp Out location and dates was moved to the Camp Out meeting instead of the following Detachment Convention. This has afforded us the opportunity to rent the entire Gila and Cottonwood Loop Camp areas for this year. The change gave us three months more time in advance to get the dates we wanted and all the comping sites needed for our Detachment's growing size. Loaded with this Blue Cap News we had a ton of printed inserts of which all seem to be important, so please take a moment and carefully review the additions to this issue.

One insert I'd like to bring to your attention is the insert for Squadron level membership processing. The feedback has been great on the opportunity for the Squadron to have more control over when and how the renewals and new members are processed. The ability to look-up and print reports that are up to the minute accurate for your own Squadron's members has been one great benefit to those Squadrons using this feature through MySAL.org. The other benefit, no rushing to get the membership in to Detachment by deadline and worrying whether it is lost or delayed in the mail, no driving across town, and perhaps equally important, is the ability to work ahead of the deadline and be done with the entire transmittal early. Then reward yourself with joining the other activities at the Post. Done, easy.

Speaking of the benefits the Squadrons receive for using the online processing feature, the Detachment receives many benefits for doing the same. Starting in March (*hopefully*) the Detachment will be switching over to the same type of function available for Detachments. This will save money and make for accurate and timely reports to the membership and Squadrons.

Long overdue, these new additions that National offers has been requested for some time and are now being delivered to the SAL side of the Legion Family. I am impressed so far with the new offering. We asked and they have delivered.

So please consider reviewing and signing up for online processing of the membership, I think you will be glad you did. Just ask those Squadrons that are online with membership now.

We have another story elsewhere in the Blue Cap News to discuss the inserts and why it is important you keep the forms and follow through with those.

So, I have announcements for you...first...**the Winning Squadrons of the Commander's 100% by December 31st Membership Challenge** are: **Squadron 132 Oro Valley in the under 100-member** category and **Squadron 6 Prescott in the over 100-member** category.

The over 100 category was close, the details had to be verified to make the determination. Ironically, the contenders for this achievement were all using Squadron online membership processing. Please congratulate those members of Squadrons 132 and 6 if you see them, that was a major achievement. The 100% Awards will be given at the Detachment Camp Out meeting to Squadrons 6 and 132. Dinners will be scheduled when and where it works for each Squadron. Thank you to all Squadrons that made the extra effort to hit 100% by December 31! And Congratulations, too!

Now for the conclusion of the ALLECA and Boys & Girls State 50/50 challenge. Who will that be? And how about Arizona receiving kudos for CWF efforts to date? Keep up the good!

Lastly, we have had changes at the Detachment HQ starting with Rose Heitzenrater's recent passing and Keith Birkemeyer's health related issues.

- ✓ **Son of the Year** - Detachment Member who best exemplifies what a Son of the American Legion should be.
- ✓ **Lorton Award** – Detachment Member with the best idea for the betterment of the Squadron, Post, or Community.
- ✓ **Ashley Award** - Detachment Member with outstanding achievements in fundraising resulting in the highest donations.

Another MySAL.org story...HmMMM....

Recently, national released the ability for adjutants to file online their membership transmittals on mysal.org. This was a long-time request that has finally been fulfilled. However, I have reviewed the usage report, and I am disappointed to report that less than 10% of squadrons Nationwide have opted to use the online transmittal process. If you are not using the new platform, here are some advantages to using the mysal.org online transmittal process.

- 1 Once you set up your account and after your first transaction, renewals and new members get posted to your roster within 5 business days.
- 2 You can download real-time reporting of your SAL roster.
- 3 The system will not let you post a payment twice and will also advise you if a member missed renewing from previous years.
- 4 No postage — everything is online. *If you did send via USPS, your transmittal could take up to 6 weeks to post members to your roster.*
- 5 No middleman — you send your transmittal straight to national for processing and national sends a check to your Detachment for their share of the per capita.

- 6 No excuses for missing target dates and reason to blame anyone for sitting on transmittals. Online Transmittals through mysal.org gives your Squadron the ability to *“own your membership process and maintain greater control and knowledge of your performance.”*

I used online transmittals when I was a post adjutant. It was a serious game-changer in processing membership at the post level. The first time you use this feature, it will take up to 15 days to post your transmittal. It takes a little longer because essential links have to be established and tested. Once completed, all your transmittals will post within 5 business days and no longer than 7 days (*holidays, weekends, etc.*).

I used to send my transmittals on Monday and it was posted by Friday. Another feature to mysal.org as an adjutant is you can complete your Consolidated Squadron Report (CSR) online and hit send. No longer do you have to send your CSR via USPS or print out and scan the report. When you hit send, it goes directly to national for processing, again taking out the middleman.

More and more reports and publications are going to be posted online only and available for print at the local level. The faster the squadrons can adapt, the easier this transition will be and will also ensure no one is left behind. I am asking everyone in this email to help everyone and make this process easier. I would like to see online transmittals increase to over 20% by the end of March and increase each quarter. By the Fall 2020 meeting, we should be over 60% of squadrons using online transmittals on mysal.org. I have included the usage report and the documents on how you can set up your mysal.org account. You will have to request access as a squadron adjutant. You will not be able to use your personal mysal.org login and the individual member at this time cannot renew online. However, that will be coming soon.

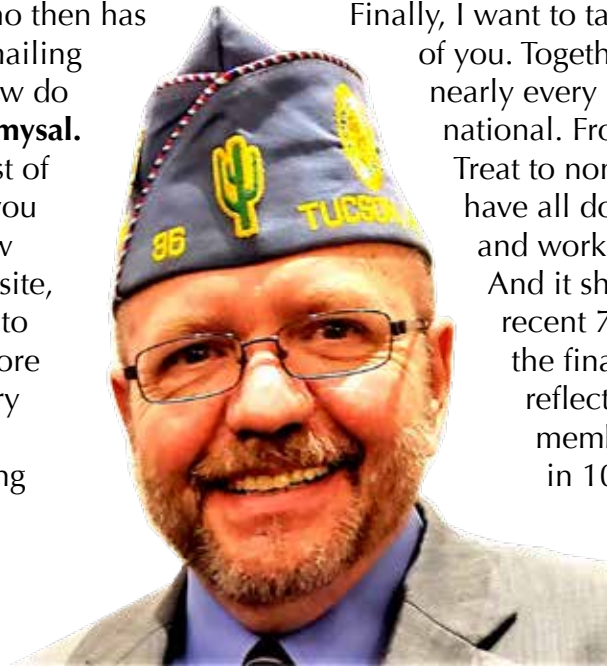
Membership report...

I am here to tell you that with regard to membership, you are doing them all proud! I know that I couldn't be more excited and energized because of the achievements you have helped us reach. But we have more to do, so let's get to it.

By now, I am sure all of you have at least begun the process of taking action with your squadron dues, to offset the increase at the national level. But not all news coming from national is negative or expensive. Did you know that you can now submit your membership electronically? Yes! Rather than getting together your cards, putting them in an envelope, and using postage mail them to Detachment (who then has to do the same thing before mailing them to national), you can now do it completely online through **mysal.org**. It is easier, faster, and best of all FREE! For new members, you do have to enter all of the new member's information on the site, but I think once you get used to it, you'll find it to be much more convenient. I would urge every squadron to give it a try and see what you think. I'm looking forward to hearing all of your success stories.

I also have some exciting news about the PMP, or Permanent Membership Plan. After a very long wait (and lots and lots of discussion), we are completely up and running! I want to thank Detachment Commander Treat and Department Adjutant Angel Juarez for thinking outside the box to find a solution to our banking issues. Now that we are moving forward, I want to take a moment to remind all of you about some of the details of the PMP. This plan is non-refundable and is ONLY for lifetime



membership in the Detachment of Arizona. If you choose to transfer to another Detachment, your PMP membership becomes null and void. If you transfer back and want to participate in PMP again, you must pay the full amount again. Also, the cost of PMP is based upon your squadron's highest dues amount. Regardless of your status as a junior member or a Dual Member, the amount paid will be based upon the highest amount paid at your squadron. You must have a membership number issued by national and checks should be made out to "S.A.L. Permanent Member Plan". If the check is payable to the Detachment of Arizona, it will be returned to you to be reissued and will slow the process of acceptance into the plan. The application is available on the Detachment of Arizona website, or by contacting the Detachment Adjutant at **AZ_SAL_Adjutant@AOL.com**.

Finally, I want to take a brief moment to thank all of you. Together, this year we have reached nearly every membership goal set out by national. From Detachment Commander Treat to non-officer squadron members, you have all done an amazing job promoting and working for our membership goals. And it shows. We achieved the most recent 75% goal, and we also just had the final membership report issued that reflects our final totals for the 2019 membership year. Arizona finished in 10th place nationwide. That is absolutely fantastic! I'm so proud to be a member of this Detachment and to be involved in membership on behalf of such an amazing team.
