2nd Sunday of Easter, Year A (Divine Mercy Sunday)

Focus: Surrender as a response of faith.

1. Review of Lent:

- a. Kerygma → Proclamation
 - i. The Goodness of Creation
 - ii. Sin and Its Consequences
 - iii. God's Response to Sin
 - iv. Our Response to God
- b. So far: first three parts
 - i. One left: Our Response \rightarrow It's part of the story!
- 2. How should we reasonably respond to the action of God in Jesus? Tough question.
 - a. Do we need to respond?
 - i. Imagine...You wake up in a cave. You can't find the way out.
 - ii. No food, no water, time passes → Panic
 - iii. "Hey, I know the way out of here. Follow me."
 - iv. Do you believe him? If yes, you're saved!
 - v. Then he turns and starts walking. If you don't move...
 - vi. A response is **necessary**. Yes.
 - vii. What is the response? Surrender. Submission.
 - 1. Surrender: submit to someone's authority; don't resist
 - 2. Submission: the action of yielding to a superior force. Come under the mission.
 - a. What's the mission? Save you.
 - b. Why do I have to surrender and submit to Jesus?
 - i. John 14:1-6 \rightarrow *I* am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father, except through me.
 - 1. If that's true, then that means there is no other way to Heaven.
 - 2. If I resist Jesus or refuse to submit to his authority, I <u>will not</u> end up in the presence of the Father. I will miss out on Heaven.
 - 3. If I don't place myself under his mission, then his mission for my life will not be fulfilled.
 - a. I don't know the way out of the cave. I don't have the torch.

3. Fake Surrender vs. Real Surrender

- a. Matthew 19:16-22 → Teacher, what good must I do to gain eternal life? ...he went away sad...
- b. 2 Kings 5:1-14 → Naaman had different expectations and was ready to walk away. His good servant: do as he said.
- c. Acts 2:14-37 \rightarrow "What are we to do, my brothers?"
 - i. Convicted by the Kerygma, they placed their lives in the hands of the Lord and his Church.
- d. Real Surrender means:
 - i. Someone else has authority over my life. Jesus is Lord.
 - ii. I will be obedient. "If you love me, keep my commands." (John 14:15-24)
 - 1. I don't know the way out of the cave. He does.
 - iii. My preferences, my feelings, my thoughts are not as important as his.
 - 1. Isaiah 55:8-9: As high as the heavens are above the earth, so are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts.
 - 2. Romans 12:1-2: I urge you to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice...
 - iv. In this particular case, I have to remember that I am surrendering to Love. He truly knows and wants what is best for me.

Reflection Questions and Homework:

- 1. Do you believe that Jesus is good? That there is no other way?
- 2. Have you surrendered your entire life to him?
