Trunk or Treat October 23: Join Us on Noah's Ark!



Leader: Holy One, we long for healing and restoration, which you alone can provide.

People: Open our hearts and spirits to the need for healing and restoration in our broken

relationships.

Silence

Leader: Holy One, make room in our hearts for the entrance of others yet unknown to us. Help us to

befriend them.

People: Open our spirits to welcome the stranger who will become beloved friends. Empower

us to be willing to risk friendship for Jesus' sake. Amen.

We will form a large circle around the worship space. Each person ties their cord to the cords of the people beside them as we sing the refrain only of Bind Us Together.
